However, despite this, the Department remains steadfast in its commitment to achieving its set equity targets, said Ms Mankwana Masemola, Acting Director: Women Empowerment.

Ms Masemola closed off by thanking everyone present and promised that her unit will ensure that next year's event becomes a much bigger and better one.
