September is South Africa's National Albinism Awareness Month. This month is dedicated to Persons with albinism, to highlight their pride, challenges and finding solutions. GROUNDWORK LAID TO FAST-TRACK IMPLEMENTATION OF BRIDGES

The Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI) has laid groundwork for the fast-tracked programme, to rollout 17 bridges in the Eastern Cape, in the current financial year. The technical team from DPWI, the National Department of Transport and the Eastern Cape recently met to discuss the fast-tracked programme that will see 9 bridges being rolled out by the end of December 2023 and a further 8 bridges being implemented before 31 March 2024. The meeting was convened following engagements between Minister Sihle Zikalala, the Eastern Cape Transport MEC Xolile Nqatha and the Eastern Cape Public Works and Infrastructure MEC Ntombovuyo Nkopane, on the rollout of the Welisizwe Rural Bridges Programme.

The DPWI team was led by Acting Deputy Director-General Programme Management Office Mr Sifiso Mdakane and the Eastern Cape Provincial Team was led by Acting Deputy Director-General: Transport and Infrastructure Zanemvula Ngovela. Present at the meeting were representatives from the National Department of Transport, Themba Mosobela (National Welisizwe Coordinator), Pat Zingeni (EC Provincial Infrastructure Steering Committee Convenor) and John Davies from the Eastern Cape Department of Public Works and Infrastructure.
