THE CIDB COLLABORATING FOR PROGRESS



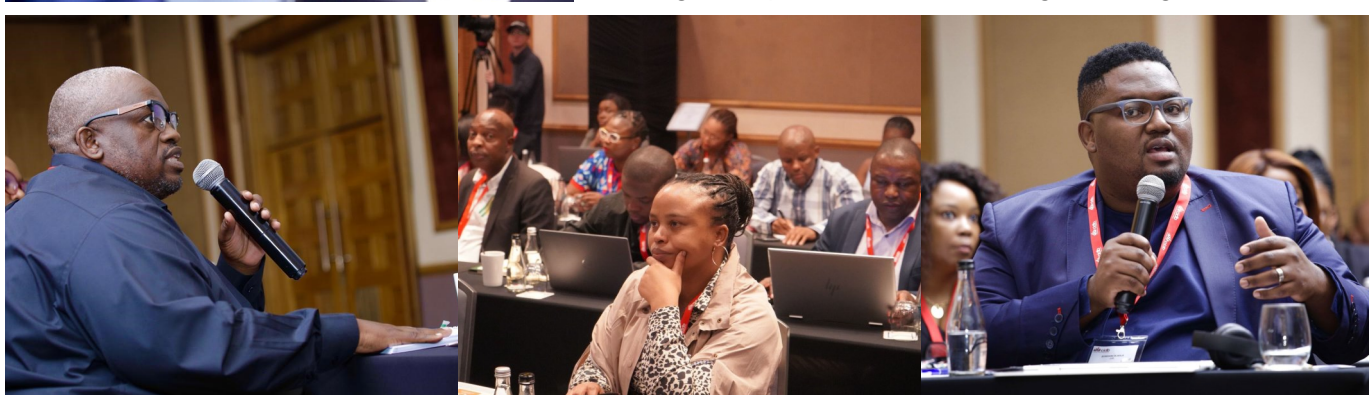

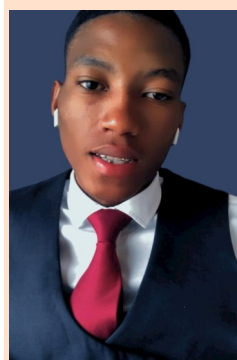
