## MINISTER ZIKALALA SAYS GOVERNMENT MUST ENSURE THAT COLLINS CHABANE'S STRUGGLE WAS NOT IN VAIN

The Collins Chabane Local Municipality was buzzing with activity on **8 March 2024** as Minister Sihle Zikalala visited Vuwani in Limpopo as part of his Operation *Siyahlola* Programme. His visit entailed the site inspection of Vuwani Police Station and Vuwani Magistrate's Court.

He was accompanied by Limpopo MEC of Transport and Community Safety, Florence Radzilani and Mayor of Collins Chabane Local Municipality, Shadrack Maluleke.

Minister's visit to Vuwani was eventful as he kicked off his day with a stakeholder engagement with community leaders to discuss service delivery issues in the

municipality. He then moved to Vuwani's Police Station and Magistrate's Court respectively before engaging with the community of Vuwani.

He acknowledged that the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI) made a mistake of appointing contractors that offered the lowest quote for the construction of the police station without examining whether they have the capacity to fulfil the job. He did, however, assure the community that an 18 months plan to complete the remaining work at Vuwani Police Station at a cost of R26 million will be implemented. "We believe that by the 25th of September 2025, this police station should be completed and handed over to the community," said Minister Sihle Zikalala.
