MILESTONE FOR INTERNAL AUDIT AS THE CHIEF DIRECTORATE CREATES EMPLOYMENT THROUGH SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI) through its Internal Audit (IA) unit hosted an induction session in partnership with SekelaXabiso (SkX) in Waverley Office Park in Bramley, Johannesburg on 6 June 2024.

Facilitated by Chief Audit Executive (CAE) Ms Rendani Mashigoane and Director Internal Audit Mr Lophumezo Gayiya, the induction session was held under the Internal Audit's 3-year professionalisation programme.

The programme is for unemployed

graduates, mostly those who were previous IA interns who are still unemployed. The seven candidates will be undergoing a 3-year on the job training and learning through the Institute of Internal Auditors South Africa (IIA SA).

The candidates will be registered as members of the IIA and enrolled in the Internal Audit Technician program, which is a 2 year program at NQF level 7, and thereafter be enrolled in the Professional Internal Auditor program, which is at NQF level 8.

Through Internal Audit, the trained candidates will be employable because they will have 5 years' experience, over and above having qualifications and being certified.

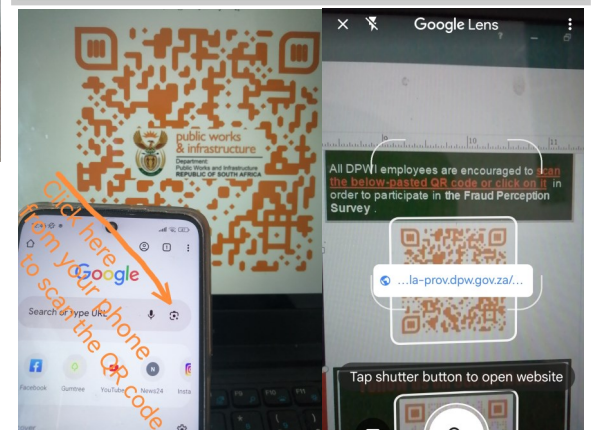
