Community members in uMkhambathini and surrounding areas, in the KwaZulu-Natal Midlands will no longer need to cross dangerous rivers in order to reach their destinations, thanks to government's *Welisizwe* bridges. President Cyril Ramaphosa led the launch of the *Welisizwe* Rural Bridges initiative in KZN on 31 January 2024 by handing over one of the completed bridges to the communities of Mkhambathini Local Municipality.

The initiative between the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI), the South African National Defence Force (SANDF) and provincial departments of Transport, aims to construct 96 bridges during the 2023/24 financial
