Madiba never deemed it necessary to spend this much money on his security. Thabo Mbeki didn't spend this much money on his security.

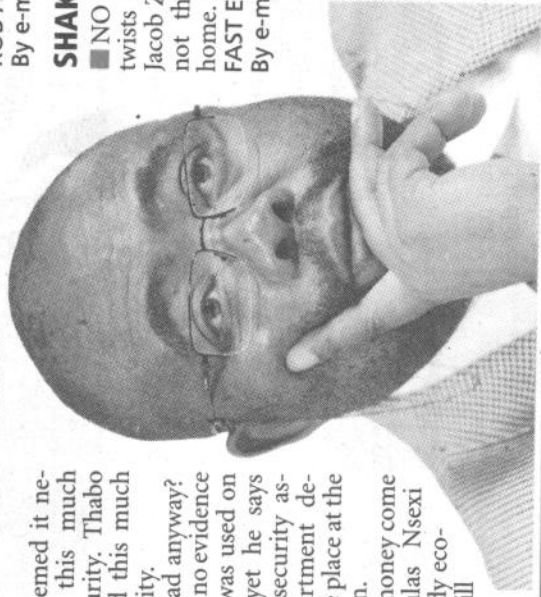
