Department has failed to fix, despite numerous requests from the navy that it do so.

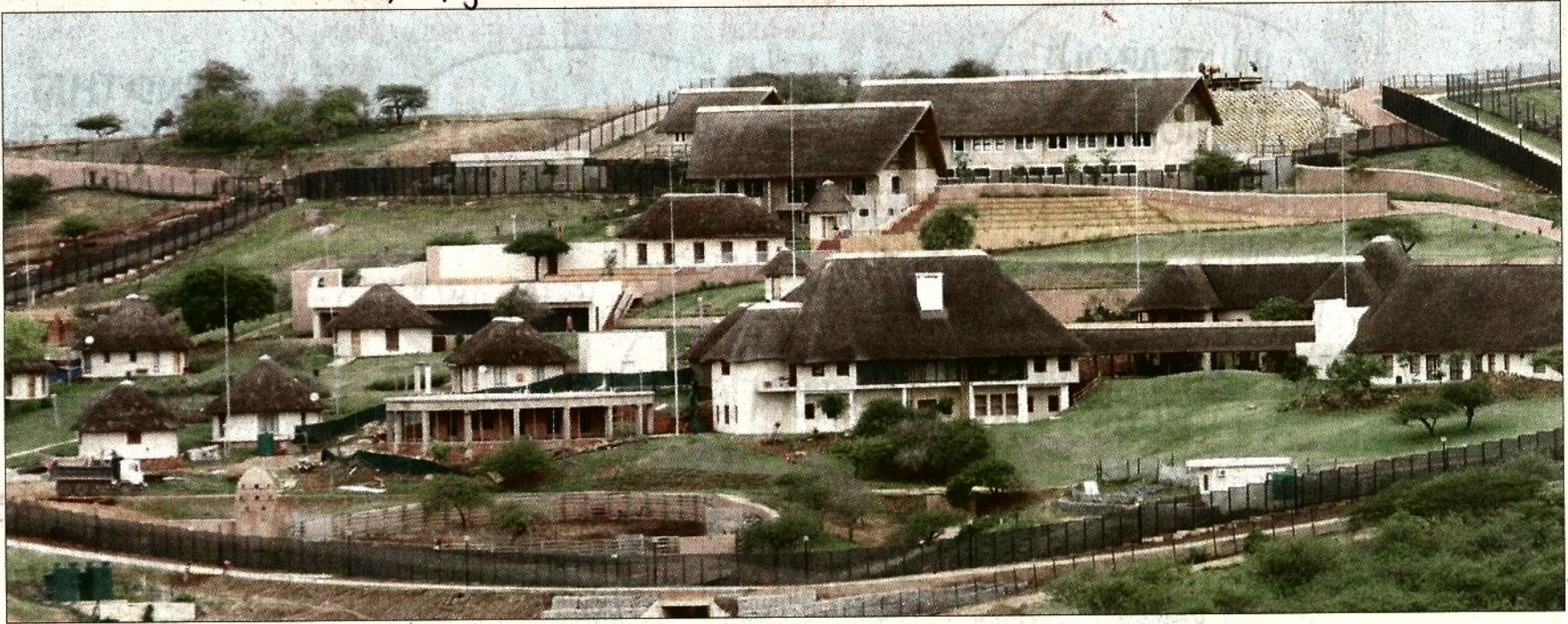
I now read in this morning's (February 13) newspapers that South Africa's bid to host the 2014 International
