

Probe on CAR media 'leak' is meant to hide the truth

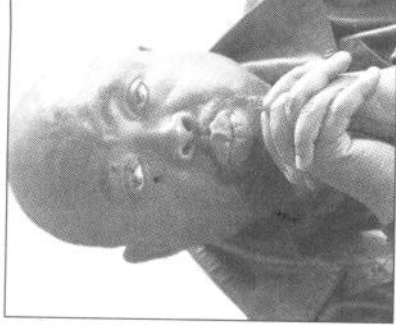
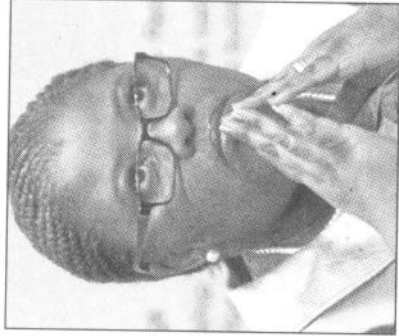
DEFENCE Minister Nosiviwe Mapisa-Nqakula's vicious attack on the media and opposition parties - accusing them of preying on the dead South African National Defence Force members killed in the Central African Republic - should be challenged by all ANC supporters.

I mourn the death of the young men because they were killed "defending undefined national interests".

The Zuma administration's stance should not surprise us as it is consistent with its response to the Marikana massacre.

Our mission to the CAR is different to that of the DR Congo where SADC and the AU are involved.
