Foul play probe after cop lift crash

Eastern Cape police are investigating a case of attempted murder after a lift at the Mount Road police station in Port Elizabeth was allegedly tampered with, it emerged yesterday.

Last month, a lift in the main building of the police station plunged from the fourth floor, injuring seven people, three of whom are still in hospital.

Officials from the local crimi-

nal record centre and the crime intelligence unit were stuck in the lift after its drop from the fourth floor.

partment ing an intelligence unit were stuck in the lift by a property of the fourth floor.

Their injuries included fractured legs and a head wound, while others received treatment for shock and whiplash.

Provincial police spokesperson Brigadier Marinda Mills confirmed that a case of attempted murder was opened by the department of public works following an inspection of the damaged lift by a private company.

Mills said it was found during the investigation that 14 counter-weights, which weigh over 70kg each, were missing.

Another lift, in the nearby police barracks, was also malfunctioning recently, preventing police officers from accessing their living quarters. – ANA
