Public Works drives job creation

The department is justifiably proud of the impact made and the empowerment of youth, says Ravi Pillay

HE job creation priority of radical socio-economic transformation is ably impanded public Works Programme (EPWP).

The department has set targets of 6000 work opportunities and 600 Full Time Equivalents to be completed by the end of 2016/7. We exceeded that target wife 286 work opportunities created, translating into 873 full-time equivalent jobs.

Public Works took over the provincial co-ordination and monitoring of EPWP in April 2015.

There are 73 public bodies — municipalities and provincial departments — reporting on the programme.

The combined achievements across all departments and municipalities is 141800 work opportunities created against a target of 157000 in KwaZulu-Natal.

The budget cuts faced by all public bodies has in one way or the other led to a slight decrease in the creation of employment opportunities.

The allocation of the EPWP Integrated and Social Grant is pro-

viding a measure of relief as more work opportunities are being creat-ed using these grants. One of the most successful ele-ments of EPWP is the R5.5 million Youth Environmental Service pro-gramme that we have implemented in Kokstad.

Eighty learners were recruited through Operation Sukuma Sakhe, which is the provincial government's anti-poverty programme managed by the Office of the Premier.

They were trained in areas such as personal budgeting, buying on credit, banking products, communication, customer care, health, and hygiene and food preparation. Additional activities included waste collection, street deaming and maintenance of cometeries.

The budget was for the beneficiaries, with the aim of ensuring sustainable livelihoods beyond the project period.
