## We're angry with premier!

RESIDENTS of Rotterdam and Se-phokhubje marched to the premier's office on Tuesday.

They said they were angry with Limpopo Premier Stan Mathabatha and the public works department for failing to honour their promise.

They claimed the premier and the department had promised to tar a 30km gravel road last month.

When residents arrived at the premier's office, they blocked the gates so no one could enter.

A resident told *Daily Sun*: "We want our road. Our leaders are busy buying expensive cars with our money instead of giving us the services we need."

Another resident, Isaac Motau (30), said: "The premier and the de-

partment promised to tar the road, but nothing happened."

The residents said they had been fighting for a tar road for 14 years.

Another resident, Thomas Mosiya (33), said: "The gravel road is in a terrible condition and becomes worse when it's raining."

Phuti Seloba, a spokesman for the provincial government, said the matter was being handled by

the premier and the relevant department.

Joshua Kwapa, a spokesman for public works department, denied a promise being made to start tarring the road last month.

"We are waiting for budget approval from the treasury for the road and other projects. As soon as approval is granted, we will start the procurement process," he said.
