SIU head, Advocate Andy Mothibi, said their investigations looked at irregularities of expenditure, corruption and collusion around leases. He said investigations found that a number of public officials had been guilty of conflict of interest when it came to resign, they have just terminated their relationship with the employer but they cannot escape criminality.
