Speaking after signing the official papers, the blushing bride spoke fondly of how her beloved arranged the wedding plans.

"I was so surprised because he actually just went and talked here (at the Culemborg Safe Space) without me knowing, and then they called

me in and told me that 'there's a big surprise for you."

The couple, who have a 12-year-old son, are staying at the Safe Space, which officially opened its doors about a month ago. Though they expect to stay in the shelter for the time being, both want to take up opportunities which arise through Cape Town's successful Expanded Public Works Programme, providing hope for the couple to access permanent accommodation in future.
