"When the president visited us with the premier's team, we told him our story and he quickly realised I needed urgent medical attention.

asked Premier Sisi Ntombela to call an ambulance to take me to hospital.

"The ambulance arrived and paramedics checked me and realised I needed medical assistance.

"I was admitted to Pelonomi Academic Hospital the same day. But today I am healed and happy!

"I would like thank the president and his team and the Free State government for changing my life.
