

Stutterheim protests continue

The town of Stutterheim continues to resemble a war zone with motorists passing through on the N6 greeted by the sight of a gutted municipal building, litter strewn all over, broken refuse bins and damaged traffic lights.

The town has been plagued by protests against the embattled Amahlati Municipality with co-operative governance and traditional affairs MEC Fikile Xasa last week announcing a forensic investigation into the local authority.

Youths in the town

have claimed nepotism in appointments by the municipality, taking bribes and sexual favours in exchange for jobs.

Xasa's announcement

to investigate the municipality has apparently done little to appease protesters, however, with two trucks since set alight just

outside the town and reports of rocks being thrown at vehicles travelling through the town on the busy N6. Efforts by residents to clean up the streets last week were nullified as the refuse was simply thrown out in the streets again. Shops have been forced to close, allegedly following intimidation.

The police indicated on Monday that two suspects - aged 30 and 39 - had been arrested on charges on public violence.

This followed the arrests of six suspects last week.

Police spokesperson Captain Siphokazi Mawisa said on Tuesday that the town was quiet, with police monitoring the situation.

WHITTLESEA – The government, working with community members in the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) and the police will continue to intensify the fight against the abuse of women and children in the country, the public works minister Thulas Nxesi said at the weekend.

Nxesi, speaking to community members in Whittlesea in the Eastern Cape, acknowledged the work done by all South Africans in the fight against the abuse of women and children, but said more needed to be done by all to fight "against this cancer of abuse of children and women".

He handed over a vehicle to the Nomaxabiso non-profit organisation. The vehicle will assist the NPO to do its work of supporting women and children who are survivors of abuse.

The vehicle handover ceremony was part of a report-back session on the implementation of commitments made by President Cyril Ramaphosa when he visited the area last year.

"President Ramaphosa sent us to give this vehicle to you, the people of Whittlesea, which you can use as you work with the police and community in the fight against the abuse of women and children in the area."

He lashed out at men who were abusing women and children.

"Real men don't abuse women and children. Real men respect women and children. Real men love and protect women and children. Real men love and protect their community."

The event was attended by government leadership from national, provincial and local spheres, including public works MEC Pemmy Majodina, mayors and chiefs.

The event took place on the eve of the annual 16 days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence.
