'Tar our roads or we won't vote'

THE community of Rammbuda, and the traditional council of Rammbuda, are adamant that they are not going to register for the 2019 General Election.

The decision came after a meeting that was held last Wednesday at Ha-Rammbuda Musanda with the MEC for Public works, Roads and Infrastructure, Nandi Ndalane.

She was accompanied by delegates from Road Agency Limpopo.

The traditional leader of the

Rammbuda community, Thoyhele Rammbuda Ratshibvumo II told CV that the decision was taken by the community and the traditional council after they have been promised several times, and were tired of hearing the same promises from the last two Roads MEC's. The community of Rammbuda want the roads from Tshandama to Ha-khakhu, and from Muswodi to Folovhodwe, tarred as a matter of urgency.

Rammbuda said that in 2016, the then MEC Jerry

Ndou, also visited the area.

He said Ndou assured the community that his department was working on the issue to appoint a contractor. He claimed nothing has been done since. He mentioned that the recent visit by Ndalane was equally disappointing.

"She promised us the same thing and now it is three years later," he said.
