## Bricks and mortar the way, pupils told

MPUMALANGA pupils from various schools were encouraged to consider choosing careers in the building industry.

Public works deputy directorgeneral Nyeleti Makhubele said this at a career expo at Embalanhle in Secunda, Mpumalanga, on Tuesday.

She said it was important to participate in the construction industry in order to transform it.

She encouraged young black people, especially from the rural areas, to consider the industry as a career.

"Industries like construction were reserved for white people in the past. Only white

people became engineers and architects but nowadays anyone can choose these careers.

"And careers in the public works department are not only reserved for boys. Girls too can become engineers."

Emmanuel Maloka (17), a grade 12 pupil at Thomas Nhlabathi Secondary School, said the expo exposed him to many career choices in the industry and he hoped to take advantage of all the

opportunities available.
