

Ward 21 hands in a memo to COJ

On Friday, June 28, Tladi and Moletsane Ward 21 community residents marched from the Tladi Blue Lagoon open space to Sophie Masite UBC at Koma Road.

The march was based on issues that challenge residents. Those issues were, an exclusion of EPWP (Expanded Public Works Programme) job opportunities for Ward 21, poor service delivery at Tladi Camp that include the alleged poor supply of water, electricity outages and toilets that do not flush, which is a health hazard community residents.

"We cannot tolerate people wasting our time and not listening to our demands because we informed the office of the speaker that we are coming.

Our senior citizens are part of this march, therefore it is a hassle for them to wait for people who delay this whole procedure, it is just pure disrespect,," said the Tladi and Moletsane Ward 21 councillor Mpho Sesedinyane.

Sesedinyane also said that the community of Ward 21 delivered a memorandum of demand to the City of Johannesburg (COJ) in Sophie Masite UBC.

"Just like in other areas of Soweto, Tladi Camp is an underprivileged area hence there has to be job creations for residents of that area. There is also poor general service delivery and there is failure to give residents RDP houses," said Sesedinyane.
