



MANDELA DAY HONOURING HERO

A HOST of Mandela Day events and activities have been planned across the city today as South Africans have been asked to give 67 minutes of their time to goodwill.

- ◆ In Green Point between 9am and 3pm chef Jenny Morris will be preparing soup and bread to feed the hungry at The Service Dining Room. She will be joined by members of the provincial Economic Opportunities Department, and Magic828. The public has been invited to join in at the Cape Quarter.
- ◆ NPO Ladles of Love has planned one of the largest soup kitchen events in Cape Town at Pier Place Square along the Foreshore at 7.45am-6pm. Together with volunteers, who booked slots for R100, with proceeds going to Ladles of Love's feeding scheme, they will make and serve more than 2 000 litres of soup to thousands of homeless and hungry people.
- ◆ In New Crossroads, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development Mcebisi Skwatsha will participate in a community clean-up from 12pm to 1.30pm .
- ◆ Christel House SA pupils will plant 300 trees on their campus, as it had invited individuals and corporates to take "Action Against Poverty"; the official theme of Mandela Day.
- ◆ Members of Popcru will be renovating the Kleinvelei police station in Khayelitsha between 9am and 4pm.
- ◆ 67 designers will come together in Johannesburg and Cape Town to design 67 logos for 67 small businesses at no extra cost. The event takes place at the Workshop 17 The Harrington: 50 Harrington Street, Cape Town.
- ◆ Public Works and Infrastructure Minister Patricia de Lille and her deputy Noxolo Kiviet will hand over computers and furniture to the Saartjie Baartman Centre for Women and Children in Athlone.
- ◆ The U.S. Consulate Cape Town is collaborating with the 67Squared Initiative and Central Library to upskill and assist emerging entrepreneurs with the tools required to succeed in today's digital world.
