Last Monday night, thugs pounced on them and stole air-conditioners and other items.

Now the cops from KwaThema Police Station in Ekurhuleni are working in fear.

They fear one of them would one day lose their lives as the cop shop is not safe.

The police station's fence has collapsed, making it easy for thugs to get in and out as they please.

Even hobos have been seen living in some parts of the dilapidated building.

The community said nothing changed much after *Daily Sun* ran the story in 2017.

They said the government only brought containers after the story was published, but not all of the cops could be accommodated.

"Some are still using the old police station, which they share with the hobos," said resident Refilwe Moshe.

The community said they didn't understand what was taking the government so long to fix the old police station.

"It has become a home for hobos and our cops are now soft targets," said another resident, Mlungisi Dyantyi.

"We once handed over a memorandum to then minister of police Fikile Mbalula after he visited the police station in 2017."

Station Commander Colonel Elsie Thobejane said they were not asking for a five-star hotel, but a decent and safe building.

"We are sitting on a time bomb and nobody seems to take us seriously," she said.
