Teams in the Lowveld region, namely Dullstroom, Nelspruit, Barberton, Lydenburg, Lefpa, Nkomazi, Wilgeboom, Salique, Injaka, Graskop, Mlambongwane and Waterval Boven finished their assessment at the Kishugu Training Academy in Mbomela on Sunday, 25 April.

In Secunda, the Sasol team concluded their training at their base, the Sasol Fuel plant, on Thursday, 29 April. The assessments ensure that firefighters are physically fit and theoretically and mentally prepared for the upcoming Winter Fire Season between May and October. The training consisted of a fitness assessment, which included the 2.4 kilometre run, sit-ups, push-ups and pull-ups. Firefighters were also theoretically assessed with tests and practically assessed on various firefighting techniques, which included a firebreak, which helps prevent a runaway fire from spreading. Teams also conducted a firewall exercise, an activity in which firefighters run through flames with their protective gear, to get rid of the fear of fire and acclimatize themselves to the heat if and when they were to get trapped during a fire. The assessment ended with a route march, in which teams participate in a 10 kilometre march, to test their endurance and strength as they can be expected to go for long hours
