BUSISWE Mhwebane, the suspended public protector, reportedly faces imminent removal from the ministerial estate property – Pretoria's Brylinton government estate – that she has been occupying, City Press reported that Mhwebane had moved into the estate, near the Union Buildings, in 2017 after citing threats to her life. She moved into a flat at a cost of R11 000 monthly rental to the office of the public protector. Last month, Thandi Sibanyoni, the institution's CEO, and advocate Kholeka Gcaleka, the acting public protector, reportedly wrote to Mhwebane, notifying her of the office of the Public Protector's decision to terminate the lease between it and the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure, which oversees the use of state-owned property. | PHILL MAGAKOE



ACTRESS Terry Pheto posted a statement on various social media platforms denying having had any fraudulent involvement with the National Lotteries Commission. The North Gauteng High Court granted the National Prosecuting Authority's Asset Forfeiture Unit a preservation order to seize items valued at more than R50 million amid a probe into financial mismanagement and corruption at the commission. "...I deny any involvement in the alleged scheme that has been reported on. I also had no prior knowledge of an application to obtain a preservation order against me, and have no sight of this order," said Pheto.

AN EARTHQUAKE with an estimated magnitude of 4.6 was recorded near Dundee at 2.30pm on Saturday. And a second earthquake was recorded on Sunday about 40km north of Kokstad. The second earthquake registered a preliminary magnitude of 3.9 on the local magnitude scale as recorded by the South African National Seismograph Network, with a preliminary epicentre located in the Mankwago region of KwaZulu-Natal, the Council for Geoscience (CGS) said. The CGS confirmed both earthquakes saying they did not occur along the same geological structure (fault), but might be inter-related on a more regional scale. | Maxxip

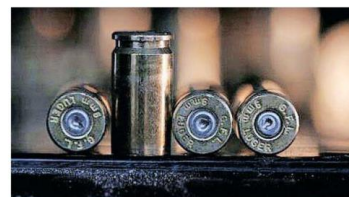
