# RAL finally visits Malamulele to assess roads

On Tuesday, 28 November, a dele-

gation from Road Agency Limpopo (RAL) visited Malamulele to assess the condition of the D3647, D3660,

and D3668 road. This after residents of 30 villages in Malamulele marched to the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure's satellite office in Malamulele last year to protest against the poor condition of the roads.

Residents from these villages claimed that, since the establishment of the Collins Chabane Municipality in 2016, none of the roads in their respective villages had been tarred. They had made clear that they were not happy at all with the municipality, to whom they had raised the issue on several occasions, just to be ignored.

"It seems it takes time to get RAL to assess roads, but we are happy that they finally came out to look at the state of our roads," said community activist Mr Simon Sithole.

Responding to *Limpopo Mirror's* enquiry for comment, RAL explained that, after their assessment, they planned to motivate for the upgrading of the roads.
