Officials demolish nine-room house near affluent Mthatha suburb ILLEGAL STRUCTURE: An police keep watch as the Southridge Park house is demolished on Wednesd King Sabata Dalindyebo or Sahata D pairty.

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SIKHO NTSHOBANE Any dwelling built illegally on municipal land will be demol-ished, as one Mthatha resident has learn to his bitter cost. This was the clear warning given to land grabbers by King sabata Dalindyebo (KSD) mu-nicipal bosses on Wednesday af-ter they sent a backhoe to tear down a posh, nine-room house built near the affluent suburb of southridge in Mthatha. The aimost-completed house is one of many that have sprang up on vacant land alongside Nel-son Mandela Drive on the busy V2.

sor Mandela Drive on the busy N2. The house was demolished after the sheriff of the Mithatha high court. Nusso Majokweni, backed by armed police and KSD municipal law enforcement of ficers, gave the go-ahead on Wednesday morning. KSD acting mayor Nkosi Mkhanyisel Dudumayo, who oversaw the demolition, said the local municipality had recently been granted a court order to forge ahead with the demolition. The owner had been given 10 days after the court order to comply and demolish the house, but had failed to do so. "We had to follow proper pro-cesses," Dudumayo said. "The land in question is part of our assets as the municipality. "Any land in KSD must be protected for the benefit of the people of this area." According to a statement sent to the Dispatch by the munic-ipality, the owner of the house, whose name is known to the Dispatch, was served with a con-travention notice on July 13 2021.

He then visited the municipal He then visited the municipal building control inspectorate, where the process was outlined and proof of ownership was requested. However, he failed to provide this, as well as municipality ap-proved building plans. The matter was then referred to the municipality's legal ser-vices for action, and a court order for the demolition of the house was sought.

for the demolition of the house was sought. The Dispatch has been unable to reach the homeowner. Dudumayo said the land in question formed part of 450 va-cant sites donated by the public works department to KSD in 2017 for the construction of the Southridge Park extension 10

township. The land was officially reg-istered under the municipal-ity's ownership in 2019. As per the conditions of the donation, the municipality was required to transfer the sites to people who had bought sites from the SBK Trust. About 220 sites will be trans-ferred to individuals. Over the years, the municp-ality has battled land grabs in and around Mthatha. In 2014, it was reported that at least 100ha of vacant mu-nicipal land in different parts of the city — some earmarked for housing development — had been invaded by the so-called land-grabbers. Dudumayo said most of the lilegally occupied land was along the R61. The municipality was now in the process of reclaiming all lilegally invaded land through the courts. "We can't allow lawlesness." Mthatha Ratepayers & Res-idents Association spokesper-son Madybi Ngzekana gave the municipality the thumbs-up for its action, saying most land-grabbers did not pay for mu-nicipal services after building houses, even if they were next to a rate-paying area. He said it was not the first time land-grabbers had tried to build houses on prime land next to Southridge Part. Eastern Cage Chamber of Bushats said many people In Mthatha had been scammed outoftheir savings by what was believed to be a well-orches-trated syndicate selling vacant people wanting their own houses.

land it did not own to desperate people wanting their own houses. There were numours that some well-educated people, in-cluding lawyers, were part of the syndicate.
