Hundreds of EC businesswomen attend Brics event

About 250 businesswomen from across the province attended the Brics Women Business Alliance (WBA) in partnership with Nafcoc Eastern Cape

partnersing with Narcoc Eastern Cape meeting on Tuesday. The meeting, held at the East Lon-don ICC, was in preparation for the upcoming Brics Africa WBA Trade conference, scheduled for August 20-21 in Durban, followed by the Brics Summit on August 24 at the Sandton Convention Centre in Johanneshurg Convention Centre in Johannesburg,

During the summit a formal col-laboration agreement between the Brics Women's Business Alliance and the Nafcoc Eastern Cape Women's Chamber will be signed. Tuesday's event was attended by

Nafcoc members from Buffalo City Metro, Nelson Mandela Bay and the Joe Gqabi, OR Tambo, Chris Hani and Sarah Baartman municipalities.

Rural development and agrarian re-form MEC Nonkqubela Pieters encouraged women to make their presence felt in business.

Referring to the theme of the day —
"A call to action in shaping the future of
Brics and African women-owned business" — she said it was spot on and inspired women.

"I have no doubt that all stake holders who have been invited here will contribute immensely to the quality of the agreement.

"It is important that we come up with build-up programmes such as this one so that as women we prepare ourselves for those economic oppor-

She said SA faced another oppor tunity in 2025 to host the G20, which

tunity in 2025 to nost the 0.20, which prings together the 20 leading eco-nomic powers.

"The Eastern Cape attracted a total of \$1.12bn (R19.66bn) and created about 2,184 job opportunities in the province between January and April 2023," the MEC said.

"Our province is a hub of indigenous cannabis growers in the country.

"Given our endowment compared to other provinces, the Eastern Cape is lobbying the national government to remove legislative barriers of entry for indigenous cannabis growers so they can fully participate in the cannabis industry.

Pieters said in the past financial year, Pieters said in the past financial year, 275 cannabis farmers were supported with hemp cultivation permit appli-cations and 91 permits had been is-sued by the department. A total of 44 farmers and 70 de-partment officials were trained in
