# Rehabilitation on roads continues

Nkakareng Rakgoale, the Limpopo MEC for Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure, embarked on a service delivery monitoring programme in Elias Mntsoaledi Local Municipality on April 3.

The MEC was joined by Mayor David Tladi, Council Speaker Dieketseng Mashego and Sekhukhune District Municipality MMC Mabatane Mathale, who represented the mayor as they inspected the rehabilitation of the D856 and D2913 roads outside Groblersdal.

The team also checked the pothole patching initiative on the R25 leading to Gauteng and Mpumalanga.

Executive Mayor Bahula extended her welcome to MEC Rakgoale as she oversaw the road projects from Dennilton to Moteti Villages. Recognising the pivotal role of infrastructure development in community upliftment and socio-economic improvement, "Infrastructure development not only enhances connectivity and accessibility but also catalyses economic growth, thereby improving the overall quality of life for residents and generating economic opportunities," she said.

Speaking during the programme, "Today we are here in Elias Mntsoaledi to monitor two roads where the contractors are still

available. We experienced some little problems and wanted to see what we could do to fix those problems. The R25 links two provinces, and we need to make sure we look after it. We are happy that we came here with councillors and were able to see the potholes. The contractor will be back, and due to lesser rain, we will be able to do the work."
