Donations to school, orphanage bring hope

MASHIYAMAHLE High School in Ndwedwe and Lungisisa Indlela Village (LIV), a home for orphaned and vul-nerable children in Verulam, received much-needed donations yesterday.

Public Works and Infrastructure Deputy Minister Sihle Zikalala and Msinsi Holdings senior officials donated school uniforms, rugby jer-

seys, cutlery and crockery, and more than 400 chairs and 50 tables. LIV has about 150 children. The Mashiyamahle High School in Ndwedwe is the most populated with 1608 learners, with the matric class alone having 206 learners. Zikalala said they donated uni-

forms and sports equipment and the contributions will also help boost the school's nutrition programme as it is situated in the poorest area.

School principal Bhekekhaya Lawrence Ngwane asked for more classrooms to be built to eliminate overcrowding.

He also asked for assistance in

documenting more than 200 pupils who do not have birth certificates for

various reasons.

Officials also handed over equipment to the Sonkombo Community

Hall to help them use the premises effectively. Zikalala said that this programme is a continuation of the development programmes in these communities that they support.

Zikalala also said that other areas
