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## Job creation plans on track: N Premier Tham

Despite the subdued economy, Kwa-Zulu-Natal Premier Thami Ntuli has assured the province's citizens that

assured the province's citizens that the government of provincial unity (GPU)'s plans to create thousands of jobs are on track. Delivering his State of the Prov-ince Address (Sopa) at Pietermar-itzburg's Woodburn Stadium yes-terday, Ntuli, among other things, cited major developments in the province's two industrial hubs of Dube Trade Port and Richards Bay Industrial Zone (RBIDZ) as proof that the GPU's job creation and eco-nomic development initiatives were

that the GPU's job creation and eco-nomic development initiatives were beginning to bear some fruit. "Last year, we reported R1,4 bil-lion earmarked for construction pro-jects in Trade Zone 2 at Dube Trade Port, the Ogihara SA manufacturing facility at Trade Zone 2 is 85% com-plete, with a 5 000m<sup>2</sup> warehouse 67% completed. "It [Dube Trade Port] has suc-cessfully secured R4,6 billion in pri-vate-sector investments and created

vate-sector investments and created over 5 000 permanent jobs and 51

000 indirect jobs. "In the coming year, the Dube Trade Port's focus will be on in-creased investments of R500 mil-lion private sector funding and job creation with potential of 1 250 new permanent jobs and 250 temporary

jobs," he said. On developments at RBIDZ, Ntu-

On developments at KBIUZ, NUL li said the process of expanding the area's industrial sites so that more investors could move in was at an advanced stage. "The Nyanza Light Metals project

in the RBIDZ has commenced with site preparation towards the con-struction of the commercial plant. Funding secured is to the value of R116 million and site clearance is 81% complete as of January 2025.

81% complete as of January 2025. "The construction will commence in July 2025, creating more than 3000 construction jobs," he said. While most of the jobs being cur-rently created were driven by pri-vate sector investment, Ntuli said the provincial government would directly be involved in job creation through the Expanded Public Works Programme.

through the Expanded Public Works Programme. "KwaZulu-Natal is actively partici-pating in the Extended Public Works Programme. Under this programme Ezemvelo is to create 9 400 employ-ment opportunities through envi-ronment sector public employment programmes (EPWP). "The KZN Township and Ru-ral Economies Revitalisation Pro-gramme will benefit more than 1 000 community members adjoining Ezemvelo protected areas. "We will create 7 725 work op-portunities in environmental public

employment and waste economy programmes with a focus on youth

employment and waste economy programmes with a focus on youth, women, and people with disabili-ties," he said. Apart from the problem of high unemployment, the province has a housing problem which has been exacerbated by the displacement of several families due to floods. While acknowledging that the pace at which the government was delivering houses was slow, Ntuli said a lot was being done to fast-track delivery. "In addressing the housing back-log in general, we have provided 5540 breaking-new-ground houses, 406 sites, 261 first-home finance housing opportunities and 400 houses to vulnerable groups. "In 2025/26 financial year we will deliver a total of 6 622 houses and distribute 2467 title deeds," he said. While GPU political parties such as the IFP, ANC and DA welcome Ntuli's Sopa, the MK Party and the EFF rejected the premier's speech, with the EFF saying it was out of sync with residents' expectations. • clive.ndou@witness.co.za

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
