# Ward 120 Cllr responds to service delivery queries

**W**ARD 120 Councillor Puseletso Nzimande has responded to concerns from the Lenasia South community regarding the adjustment budget, repairs to potholes and streetlights, grass cutting, enforcement of by-laws, removal of illegal advertising, cleaning up of illegal dumping, and the fining of perpetrators, providing the following update:

With regards to illegal dumping, the Department of Economic Development has employed 10 Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) workers that are cleaning every day. A ward committee member



for Department of Environment & Infrastructure Services (EISD), has

given me the list and the team is attending to those streets.

City Parks is currently busy with grass cutting along the K43. Grass is growing because it's a rainy season.

The Johannesburg Development Agency (JDA) will not take action about illegal advertising if the community doesn't report illegal advertisements.

Potholes on other streets have been attended to; however, the community must report and log incidents and

provide reference as proof of reporting.

Street lights were repaired; however, residents vandalised them, and they don't take care of their infrastructure. Also, a contractor is allocated to start repairing those street lights again. Last week, they were busy with assessing the streets that were allocated by my office.
