## STATEMENT National minimum wage set to rise to R28.79 per hour

THE Department of Employment and Labour has announced the new National Minimum Wage (NMW) in South Africa is R28.79 per hour. In a statement yesterday, Employ-ment and Labour Minister Nomakho-sazana Meth said the National Mini-mum Wage (NMW) rates for 2025 would rise from R27.58 to R28.79 per hour worked worked

worked. The NMW was introduced in the country in 2019 and the policy obligates employers to pay workers a minimum amount per hour. The NMW is subject to annual review

The NMW is subject to annual review and increases annually from March 1. According to the Department, the NMW amendment is enforced by law and binding from March 1. Those who violate the Act are subject to fines. Determinations of the NMW includes: vulnerable sectors such as farm workers and domestic workers, whom since 2022, were aligned with the NMW rates. The 4.26% increase to the NMW shall apply to all workers and cannot be var-ied by contract, collective agreement or law.

In terms of the new minimum wage

In terms of the new minimum wage, the lowest paid domestic workers, who work 200 hours per month, will earn R5 758. Last year, the same worker would have earned R5 316, representing an increase of R242 in their pay. For the lowest paid workers who work less hours, at around 160 hours per month, their earnings will now reach R4 606 monthly. Last year, they would have earned R4 412, representing an increase of about R194. Excentions to the amplications

nave earned 14 412, representing an increase of about R194. **Exceptions to the application of the National Minimum Wage** Use to the special dispensation under which they are hired workers employed on expanded public works programme are entitled to a mini-mum wage increase of R15 83 from R15 16 per hour, according to the Department. People who have concluded learn-ership agreements as contemplated in section 17 of the Skills Development Act, 1998, are entitled to the allowances as determined in the latest government lished on the department website www. labour.gov.za.

The NMW is not applicable to a volunteer, a person who performs work for another person and who does not receive or is not entilled, any remuner-ation for their service. The amount does not include pay-ment of allowances like transport, tools, food or accommodation; payments in kind such as board or lodge; tips; bonuses; and gifts among others.
