Community service by MLM takes centre stage in town

ERMELO - The Msukaligwa Local Municipality (MLM) joined the Mpumalanga Department of Public Works, Roads and Transport, together with government departments and community stakeholders, to celebrate Nelson Mandela Day through a series of community service initiatives on July 17.
