DPWI IN MMABATHO REGIONAL OFFICE VISITS EPWP/ARGISETA ARTISAN LEARNERS

The Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI) in Mmabatho Regional Office-North West last month visited EPWP participants who are being trained as artisans at the Royal Bafokeng Institute. The visit was led by the Deputy Director for EPWP Training in the region, Mr. Jimmy Mbhokota.

The 10 learners who were visited were recruited to be trained as artisans through the EPWP/Agriseta Artisan Development Programme and they have been placed at the Maile campus (Royal Bafokeng Institute school of construction). The learners have been exposed to both theoretical and practical training.

The learners are being trained as bricklayers and plumbers. Upon completion of the theory and practical training they will be placed at different workplaces and construction sites to gain more technical skills. Once they finish the workplace learning they will be prepared for trade testing for a period of 3 months and upon the completion of the training, the learners will receive the Red Seal certificates at NQF 5 and trade test. This apprenticeship started in February 2022 and will end in February 2025.

The EPWP Artisan Development Programme is an initiative of DPWI, Department of Higher Education and Training as well as the Agriculture Sector Education and Training Authority (AgriSeta).

The EPWP-AgriSeta Artisan Development Programme is one of the key programmes that was designed to address the technical skills shortage in the country. These learners are part of 400 participants who are being trained as artisans through this Programme in the country.
