



1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Department of Public Works (DPW) invites bids for the provision of cleaning services at specified premises.
- 1.2 The required norms and standards of the service to be rendered, and the precise scope thereof, are set out in Schedules A and B hereto.
- 1.3 The site information is provided as per Schedule D hereto.

2. DEFINITIONS & INTERPRETATION

"Bid": includes "tender, and vice versa.

"Contractor": means the successful bidder in terms of this

Bid, and Supplier as referred to in the

General Conditions of Contract

• "Premises" and "site": means the physical location where the

services are to be rendered.

• "The Contract": means the contract arising from the formal

acceptance of a bid, governed by the General Conditions Contract, and as supplemented and/or varied by the terms

of this document.

"The Department": means the National Department of Public

Works.

• "The General Conditions of Contract": means the General Conditions of Contract

(GCC) issued in accordance with Chapter 16A of the Treasury Regulations published in terms of the Public Finance Management

Act, 1999 (Act 1 of 1999).

• "User Department": means the Department of Justice and

Constitutional Development (DOJCD).

- Any reference to the singular shall include the plural, and vice versa, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.
- Any reference to one gender shall include the other, as well as gender-neutral persons and/or entities.

3. THE PANEL

- 3.1 The panel will consist of bidders who meet all the requirements and criteria as stipulated in this terms of reference as well as the PA-04 (GS) Notice & Invitation to Bid form.
- 3.2 Bidders on the panel will be ranked from the lowest (overheads, mark-up percentage and VAT) to the highest and work will be allocated accordingly until all bidders are utilized.
- 3.3 The allocation of work will be as and when required.
- 3.4 For the purpose of job creation for local communities, bidders are encouraged and advised to employ general workers from within the local communities.
- 3.5 If all bidders are utilized or allocated sites to clean from the panel, the Department will begin again with the lowest offer to allocate sites, if there is a need for services.
- 3.6 The number of allocation of sites may not necessary be the same.
- 3.7 The department envisage to allocate work to all bidders, however, at the end of the contract, it does not guarantee the same number of sites and deployment distribution.
- 3.8 Compliance with specification is non-negotiable.
- 3.9 Deviations and non-compliance is prohibited.
- 3.10 The department will conduct performance assessments as and when deemed necessary without informing the successful bidder.

4 SECURITY CLEARANCE

- 4.1 Only successful bidders shall be subjected to security clearance.
- 4.2 Under no circumstances will a tender be awarded unless the bidder concerned has obtained security clearance.

5 AWARD OF TENDER

- 5.1 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, no contract shall come into being until such time as the Department issues a formal notice of acceptance of a bid offer.
- 5.2 The Department reserves the right to reject any bid if it is of the opinion that the bid does not comply with the applicable wage determination.
- 5.3 Bidders must have an office in the Western Cape or establish such office in the Western Cape within 21 days upon receipt of an appointment letter.

6 STATUTORY COMPLIANCE

- 6.1 Bidders must comply with all applicable statutory and other regulatory stipulations, particularly the Basic Conditions of Employment Act, 75 of 1997 as amended and the applicable Sectorial Wage Determination promulgated from time to time.
- 6.2 Bidders are requested to provide proof that the salaries / wages paid to the employees adhere to the provisions of the Act at the end of each month.
- 6.3 The above-mentioned requirement forms part of the Bid conditions.

7 RESPONSIVNESS CRITERIA

7.1 Substantive responsiveness criteria

- 7.1.1 Only those tenderers who satisfy the eligibility criteria stated in the Tender Data may submit tenders.
- 7.1.2 Tender offer must be properly received on the tender closing date and time specified on the invitation, fully completed either electronically (if issued in electronic format), or by writing legibly in non-erasable ink. (All as per standard conditions of Tender).
- 7.1.3 The use of correction fluid is prohibited.
- 7.1.4 Submission of a PA32: Invitation to bid.
- 7.1.5 Submission of record of attending compulsory briefing session. The bidder must sign the attendance register at the meeting as proof of attendance and the register will be closed at the venue after the meeting. Failure to sign the attendance register will render your bid non-responsive.
- 7.1.6 The bidder must submit 3 completed projects in the Cleaning Services industry with a minimum accumulated value of R100 000.00 only.

The following documents must be submitted in relation to the above:

1. Appointment letter(s) with clear contract description, contract value, contract duration and contact details.

OR

2. Service Level Agreement with clear contract description, contract value, contract duration and contact details.

OR

3. Purchase order with clear contract description, contract value, contract duration and contract details.

The above documents must be accompanied by the reference letters, must be aligned to the submitted completed projects.

Failure to submit any of the above required documents will render the bid non-responsive and duly disqualified

The bidder must submit a fully completed Pricing Schedule and transfer to PA-32 (Invitation to Bid form) as provided in the tender document.

Failure to transfer the total price from the pricing schedule will result to the bid being disqualified.

7.1.7 Any correction to be initialled by the person authorised to sign the tender documentation as per PA 15.1 or PA 15.2 resolution of boards/s of directors / or PA 15.3 Special Resolution of Consortia or JV's.

7.2 Administrative requirements

- 7.2.1 Submission of applicable (PA15.1, PA15.2, PA15.3): Resolution by the legal entity, or consortium/joint venture, authorising a dedicated person (s) to sign documents on behalf of the firm /consortium/joint venture.
- 7.2.2 Submission of (PA 11): Bidder disclosure.
- 7.2.3 Submission of (PA40): Declaration of Designated Groups for Preferential Procurement.
- 7.2.4 Submission of proof of Registration on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) or insert the supplier Registration number on the form of offer. (including proposed sub-contractor).
- 7.2.5 Upon request, submission of fully completed security clearance application form with supporting documentation and information as required. The Security Clearance form will be provided by the Employer for projects requiring a security clearance.

8 DURATION OF TENDER

- 8.1 The tender shall endure for a period of 36 months, calculated from formal acceptance of the successful bidder's offer.
- 8.2 The Department reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to extend the panel for a further period, not exceeding 12 months, upon the same terms and conditions.

9 FORM AND COMPOSITION OF CONTRACT

- 9.1 The contract will be subject to the General Conditions of Contract, as supplemented by the terms set out in this document, including all the schedules attached hereto.
- 9.2 Where, however, the General Conditions of Contract are in conflict with any of the terms contained in this document, the latter shall prevail.
- 9.3 The bid document, together with the attached schedules and other specifications contained in this document, shall constitute part of the Contract.

10 COMMENCEMENT OF WORK

- 10.1 The Contractor shall not perform any work or render any services in terms of the Contract unless in receipt of a written instruction to this effect from the Department.
- 10.2 The Contractor shall commence duties on site on the date the letter of acceptance and official order are issued.

- 10.3 The Contractor must advise the Regional Manager: Department of Public Works immediately when unforeseeable circumstances will adversely affect the execution of the contract. Full particulars of such circumstances as well as the period of delay must be furnished.
- 10.4 The department will arrange for a site handover with the successful service provider where services will be rendered.
- 10.5 The successful bidder will be required to produce monthly progress reports per site.

11 WORK SCHEDULE

- 11.2 The services required in terms of this bid will be for week days only. No services may be rendered on week-ends or public holidays. All sites must be adequately staffed to ensure unbroken service delivery.
- 11.3 As regards Periodic Courts, subject to prior agreement between NDPWI, the User Department and the Contractor, <u>only days worked at such courts will be compensated for.</u>
- 11.4 The Contractor shall ensure that all personnel engaged shall be cleared by the South African Police Services before they commence any duties on site, and shall provide proof of such clearance to the Department upon request.(this should form part of the security clearance)

12 MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- 12.1 Bidders must take cognisance of the cleaning standards and norms as per **Schedule A** the Specifications which must be adhered to during the performance of the services.
- 12.2 Bidders must indicate compliance or non-compliance in Schedule A on a paragraph basis. Indicate compliance with the relevant paragraph by marking the **YES** box and non-compliance by marking the **NO** box.
- 12.3 Bidders must clearly state if any deviation from these requirements is proposed and the reason therefore. If an explanatory note is provided, the paragraph reference must be attached as an appendix to this part of the bid submission.

13 PRICING

- 13.1 Bidders must submit details regarding the bid price for the services on the Pricing **Schedule G** of the Specifications which must be submitted together with the bid documents.
- 13.2 The prices quoted must be firm and reasonable for the duration of the contract. It is expected that bidders will cover the risk of price increases for consumables, uniforms and cleaning material.
- 13.3 It is an express requirement of this invitation to bid that the bidders provide some transparency in respect to their pricing approach. In this regard, bidders must indicate the basis on which they have calculated their pricing by completing all aspects of the Pricing Schedule form.

- 13.4 The successful bidder shall make available Schedule/ Client Form signed by the relevant authority (User Department) from the relevant site and attached it along with the tax invoice as part of the proof that work was carried out. Failure to comply with regard will delay payment being processed.
- 13.5 Bidders' attention is drawn to **Schedule F** to assist them in compiling their bid price. The items listed in the schedule are not exhaustive and bidders must allow for any contingencies in order to effect the necessary cleaning services.
- 13.6 Unit rates shall be inclusive of labour, transport, overheads, consumables and everything necessary for proper performance of the work. All overhead costs must be inclusive of VAT (15%).
- 13.7 The Department will only consider price adjustments based on annual labour sectorial legislation increases and VAT increases or decreases.

14 PRODUCT SPECIFICATIONS

- 14.1 All cleaning products to be used by contractors must be environmental friendly, green products as stipulated by South African National Environments Management Act (NEMA). Unless otherwise specified, the products to be utilised in terms of the Contract must also comply with the relevant standards of the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) and/or ISO9001.
- 14.2 The Department may request samples of the products, which must be provided within seven (7) days upon request.

15 PAYMENTS

- 15.1 Payment will be made monthly on submission of an **Original Invoice** for the services rendered.
- 15.2 The successful bidder will be expected to issue an invoice per magistrate court/site where services were rendered.
- 15.3 Invoices and delivery notes must be placed in a sealed envelope addressed to **The Department of Public Works and Infrastructure.** The envelope must be deposited in the invoice boxes provided on the 11th floor (Registry Office) of Customs House Building. Alternatively, the invoices may be posted to the following address: NDPWI, Private Bag X9027, Cape Town, 8000
- 15.4 The original invoice must indicate / include the unique number for which month's payment is claimed, and must reflect the Order Number, contractor's banking details, full company name, SARS Income Tax Number, VAT Number (where vendor is registered) and signature of the contractor.
- 15.5 Payment shall be made by bank transfer into the Contractor's bank account within 30 days after receipt of an acceptable, original and valid tax invoice.
- 15.6 The Contractor shall be responsible for accounting to the appropriate authorities for its income tax, VAT, or other moneys required to be paid in terms of any applicable fiscal provision.

16 DISCLAIMER

16.1 Bidders must conduct their own checks and investigations and satisfy themselves as to the correctness of any and all aspects of this bid. The Department will not be liable for any incorrect or

potentially misleading information in relation to any part of this document and any accompanying bid documents.

16.2 No legal or other obligation shall arise between bidders and the Department unless and until the formal appointment letter or purchase order has been issued to the successful bidder. The Department is not obliged to proceed with any proposals of any bidder. The Department also reserves the right to request changes to any proposed consortia.

17 BREACH AND TERMINATION

- 17.1 The Department reserves the right to terminate the Contract under any one of the following circumstances:-
- 17.2 The Contractor has failed to comply with a statutory/or other regulatory obligation, and has not remedied such breach within 14 days of written notice by the Department to remedy such breach;
- 17.3 The Contractor has received at least three (3) written notifications from the Department during the currency of the Contract in respect of any breach.
- 17.4 The User Department has made persistent and unresolved complaints in regard to the standard, quality or level of service rendered by the Contractor.
- 17.5 The Contractor shall be liable for all damages and/or loss which may be incurred by the Department as a result of his failure to perform any portion of the contract and or his failure to perform the services at an acceptable level, quality or standard.

18 NOTIFICATION

- Any formal notification required in terms of the Contract may be transmitted by email or written official letter and shall be deemed to have been received on the day following transmission: Provided that the following days is not a Sunday or public holiday.
- 18.2 No contractor should vacate premises without notifying the Department a week before such vacation takes place.
- 18.3 Should any of the premises served by this contract be vacated or should the service for any other reason become wholly unnecessary, the Bidder agrees to claim no payment in respect of such centre and the contract shall be considered as cancelled in respect of such centre.
- 18.4 Empty premises will not be cleaned except only on written instruction from the Department.
- 18.5 The Department will cancel the contract with immediate effect if, the Contractor does not have all the resources or proof of resources to complete the contract. This is stipulated as:
 - (a) Public Liability Insurance
 - (b) All risk insurance

- (c) A full staff compliment with signed contracts and identification cards, dressed in full personal protective equipment
- (d) Equipment dedicated to this contract
- (e) Compliance of OHS Act of 1983
- (f) National Water Act (Act 32 of 2000)
- (g) National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998)

19 TERRAIN / SITE INSPECTION

- 19.1 Prospective tenderers are required to attend a compulsory site meeting as advertised.
- 19.2 Prospective bidders are advised to download the bid document from the website; www.publicworks.gov.za, under Procurement and click on Tenders. Bidders should familiarise themselves with the content of the bid document prior to the site meeting and to visit the physical terrain/site prior to this meeting in order to establish /assess the current conditions of the terrain/site.

20 NDPW Reports

- 20.1 On completion of every month's work, the contractor must submit a comprehensive monthly report based on the following items: Integrated Reporting System (IRS) Data Collection Form will be emailed to the successful bidder for full completion of the form.
- 20.2 The Court / Office / authorised representative will complete **schedule C** at the end of each month to prove service delivery which must be submitted together with the invoice. Failure to do so will/may result in the delay of payment.
- 20.3 Daily Register must be kept on-site and signed off by the DPW Project Manager at least once a month.
- 20.4 A summary of all daily registers must be provided to the DPW Project Manager no later than the 5th of each month.
