6. ELIGIBILITY IN RESPECT OF RISK TO THE EMPLOYER:

6.1. <u>Standard</u> risk management assessment criteria in respect of tenders received for routine projects in the engineering and construction works environments:

Tender offers will be evaluated by an Evaluation Committee based on the technical and commercial risk criteria listed hereunder. Each criterion carries the same weight / importance and will be evaluated individually based on reports presented to the Bid Evaluation Committee by the Professional Team appointed on the project. A tender offer will be declared non-responsive and removed from any further evaluation if any one criterion is found to present an unacceptable risk to the Employer.

In order for the evaluation reports to be prepared by the Professional Team, the Tenderer is obliged to provide comprehensive information on form DPW-09 (EC). Failure to complete the said form will cause the tender to be declared non-responsive and removed from any further consideration. The Employer reserves the right to request additional information over and above that which is provided by the Tenderer on said form. The information must be provided by the Tenderer within the stipulated time as determined by the Bid Evaluation Committee, failing which the tender offer will *mutatis mutandis* be declared non-responsive.

6.2. Technical risks:

Criterion 1: Experience on comparable projects during the past 5 years.

The tendering Service Provider's experience on comparable projects during the past 5 years. The number of current and previous comparable projects performed by the Tenderer as per the evaluation report prepared by the Consultant Team, based on its research and inspection of a representative sample of the Tenderer's current and previous work as reflected on form DPW-09 (EC), as well as, if necessary, of any additional work executed by the Tenderer, not reflected on form DPW-09 (EC) or any alternative accepted format. Failing to provide contactable references will result in the tender offer will be *mutatis mutandis* declared non-responsive. A bidder will not be afforded to provide alternative references, if the bidder's initial reference is contactable, or don't respond to the Department. Aspects to be regarded as "comparable" includes (but may be extended according to circumstances): size of projects (measured against monetary value or other project quantifying parameters), nature of projects (building, engineering, high/low rise, etc.), locality/area of execution (site-specific influences, knowledge of local conditions, etc.), complexity of project, projects for similar client department irrespective of end purpose of buildings/facilities created or in progress of being created and time scales of projects (normal, fast track, etc.) and stage of its/their development.

Criterion 2: Contractual commitment and quality of performance on comparable projects during the past 5 years.

Adherence to contractual commitments and quality of performance of comparable current and previous projects performed by the Tenderer during the past 5 years as per the evaluation report prepared by the Consultant Team, based on its research and inspection of a representative sample of the Tenderer's current and previous work as reflected on form DPW-09 (EC) or any alternative accepted format, as well as, if necessary, of any additional work executed by the Tenderer, not reflected on form DPW-09 (EC). - 3.7. Bidders must ensure that bids submitted via courier services are deposited by the courier service in the Departmental Bid box, prior to the closing date and time. The Department will not accept responsibility for any bids, which are not timeously deposited in the Bid Box.
- 3.8. A Bid will be treated as a late bid, if it is not received in the bid box. The Department will not accept responsibility for any late depositing of bids or for the non-depositing of bids in the bid box, which are as a result from an act committed or omitted by an official. This is not limited to the following cases:
 - 3.8.1. A Bidder handed over its bid to a departmental official or to the security services personnel timeously, but they omits to deposit the bid in the bid box on or before the closing date and time.
 - 3.8.2. If a courier service delivers the bid to a departmental official or to the security services personnel timeously and it is not deposited in the bid box timeously.
 - 3.8.3. The bid documents were send through mail / Post Office and it is not timely collected and or timely deposited in the Departmental Bid Box.
- 3.9. Bids received after the closing date and time will not be accepted for consideration and where practical, be returned unopened to the Bidder(s).
- 3.10. Bidders who are not registered on the CSD, must register on the CSD within 7 working days, if requested to do so. No award letters or purchase orders or contracts will be signed, with a bidder not registered on the CSD.
- 3.11. The Department will download the following documents, to verify the information submitted by bidders:
 - 3.11.1. CSD registration certificate (if the bidder is registered in the CSD)
 - 3.11.2. CIPC registration
 - 3.11.3. CIDB registration
- 3.12. Bidders are not allowed to recruit or shall not attempt to recruit an employee of the Department for purposes of preparation of the bid or for the duration of the execution of this contract or any part thereof.



AMBIGUITIES/ CONTRADICTIONS / OMISSIONS

- 4.1. If a bidder becomes aware of any ambiguities or contradictions or omissions in the bid document or the specifications, drawings or descriptions or functionality or quality, or any part of the bid document, this should be clarified with the Department, at least five (5) working days before the closing time stated in the tender data.
- 4.2. If the Department found, after the closing date of the bid, that there is an ambiguity/ contradiction or omission in the bid document, the Department reserves the right to:
 - 4.2.1. If the ambiguity or contradiction or omission in the bid document is of an administrative nature, request bidders to correct any non-compliances caused by the ambiguity or contradiction or omission or
 - 4.2.2. If the ambiguity or contradiction or omission is immaterial, proceed to finalise the procurement process and notify the delegated authority in the submission of the ambiguity or contradiction or omission for the consideration of the approving authority or
 - 4.2.3. Cancel the bid and process

5 PERIOD OF VALIDITY FOR BIDS AFTER CLOSING DATE

- 5.1 All Bids must remain valid from the closing date for a period as stipulated in the bid document.
- 5.2 The Department reserves the right to request for the validity extensions of bids, should it deemed necessary. The following conditions will apply when the Department request for a validity extension of a bid:
 - 5.2.1 The request for a validity extension will be done while the validity period of the bids are still valid.
 - 5.2.2 Bidders have the right to refuse the extension of the validity period of their bids.
 - 5.2.3 If a request for validity extensions are send to bidders while the validity period of the bids are still valid, non-replying to the request for validity extension before the expiry date will be deemed a tacit agreement to the extension of the validity period. The Department will communicate with the affected bidders to confirm such tacit agreement.
 - 5.2.4 Should the bidder not agree with the tacit agreement, the bidder shall be deemed to be non-responsive and not considered for further evaluation.
 - 5.2.5 If a bidder(s) refused a validity extension, it will be deemed that the bidder(s) had withdrawn their bids from the bidding process. The Department reserves the right to continue with its bid evaluation and adjudication of the remaining bids and finalise the process.

6 BRAND NAMES

6.1 Wherever a brand name is specified in this bid document (i.e. in the specifications, pricing schedule or bill of quantities or anywhere in this document), the department's requirement is not limited to the specified brand name, but requires an item similar/equivalent or better than specified.

7 CONTRACTUAL PRICE ADJUSTMENTS

7.1 The Bid will not be subjected to any price escalation, unless specified otherwise in the bid documents.

8 AUTHORITY TO SIGN BID DOCUMENTS

- 8.1 No authority to sign (PA 15.1: Resolution of Board of Directors) is required from an enterprise which has only one director or is a sole ownership.
- 8.2 In the case of a bid being submitted on behalf of a company, close corporation or partnership, evidence should be submitted with the bid at the closing time, that the Bid has been signed by a person properly authorised by resolution of the directors or under the articles of the entity. For that purpose, forms PA-15.1-15.3 (Resolution of Board of Directors) are included in the bid document for completion by the relevant Board(s) of Directors
- 8.3 The department further accepts that, in the absence of a PA 15.1: Resolution of Board of Directors, any director or any member of the enterprise may have the authority to bind the enterprise. Therefore the following will apply when only one director or one member of the enterprise signed the bid documents:
 - 8.3.1 The signature of any one of the directors or any one of the members of the enterprise will bind the enterprise and all the directors/ members of the enterprise. This condition will therefore render the bid valid; and
 - 8.3.2 The Department will verify the authority to sign (if deemed necessary) and where possible, may request proof of such authority of the relevant director or relevant member to act on behalf of the enterprise in the form of a "Resolution of the Board of Directors", if such ", (PA 15.1:



Resolution of Board of Directors)," was not submitted with the bid or was not completed or was incorrectly completed,

- 8.4 In the case of a sub-contractor agreement, a joint venture or consortia, the signing of the sub-contractor agreement, or Joint Venture or Consortia agreement by any director or member of each of the parties to the agreement, will render the sub-contractor agreement or Joint Venture or Consortia agreement valid. Therefore:
 - 8.4.1 The Department reserves the right to request from each party to the sub-contractor agreement or Joint Venture or Consortia" agreement, proof of such authority of the relevant director or relevant member to act on behalf of the enterprise(s), in the form of a "Resolution of the Board of Directors", if it was not submitted with the bid or was not completed or was incorrectly completed,
- 8.5 In the event that a non-member or non-director to the enterprise(s) sign the bid documents and or sign a joint venture or consortia agreement, an "Authority to sign" issued by a director of the enterprise(s) or by the Board of Directors of the enterprise(s) must be submitted with the bid at the closing date. Failure to comply with this requirement at the closing date of the bid, will invalidate the bid submitted.

9 CONTRACT PERIOD

- 9.1 The contract period is stipulated in the Contract Data or the specifications.
- 9.2 The construction period for Infrastructure works, will commence from the date of site handover.

10 NEGOTIATION WITH THE IDENTIFIED PREFERRED BIDDER

- 10.1 The Bid will be awarded to the bidder who scores the highest PPPFA number of points:
 - 10.1.1 However, should an offer not be market related, the Department reserves the right to negotiate with bidders a reasonable market price /offer?

11 AWARD OF CONTRACTS TO TENDERERS NOT SCORING HIGHEST POINTS

11.1 The Department reserves the right to award the bid to a tenderer not scoring the highest points, after having applied an objective criteria or a risk assessment criteria, if such (i.e. the objective criteria/risk assessment) is specified in the bid document.

12 TAX COMPLIANCE

- 12.1 No tender shall be awarded to a bidder who is non tax -compliant.
- 12.2 All bidders' tax matters must be in order prior to award.
- 12.3 Bidders' tax matters will be verified through CSD.
- 12.4 If the recommended bidder's tax status is non-compliant, the recommended bidder must submit written proof from SARS of their tax compliant status or submit written proof that they have made an arrangement with SARS to meet their outstanding tax obligations.
- 12.5 The recommended bidder will be given a maximum of seven (7) working days to correct their tax compliance status.
- 12.6 Failure to comply within seven (7) working days, from the date of the request, the Department will reject the bid submitted by the bidder.

13 REGISTRATION AS A VAT-VENDOR

- 13.1 Non-VAT vendors do not have to include VAT in their bid prices.
- 13.2 Non-VAT vendors who submit bids for contracts that would, if successful, take their annual turnover above the threshold of R1 million, must include VAT in the prices quoted and must therefore immediately upon award of the contract, register with the South African Revenue Service (SARS) as VAT vendors.
- 13.3 The award of contract would be conditional (for Non-VAT vendors who included VAT in their prices) conditional pending the successful bidder submitting proof of registration as VAT vendor with SARS within 21 days of award.
- 13.4 Failure to comply within 21 days after being notified to do so will lead to the automatic withdrawal of the "provisional letter of award" and elimination of the bidder's offer.
- 13.5 VAT vendors must include VAT in their bid prices and failure to comply will lead to an automatic elimination of the bidder's offer.
- 13.6 In all other instances, where bidders have excluded VAT from the prices quoted, if the bidder is successful, the letter of award will clearly state that the price at which the contract is awarded is exclusive of VAT and that VAT will not be added on at any stage after the contract has been signed.
- 13.7 If a Non-VAT vendor/ bidder is contracted with the Department with a price which is Excluded Vat, and it becomes a VAT vendor after award or alternatively becomes a VAT vendor due to a cumulative number of awards, the bidder will have to absorb the adverse financial implications of not including



VAT in their price quoted. VAT cannot be claimed from the Department for any payments already made or from any future payments.

14 CERTIFICATION OF DOCUMENTS

- 14.1 Where so required in the bid documents, bidders are required to submit copies, which are certified as a "true copy of the original".
- 14.2 If a bidder submitted an uncertified copy of an original document, or an original copy which is not correctly certified, the bidder will be afforded an opportunity to correct such non-compliance within a minimum period of 48 hour.
- 14.3 All bidders' whose copies complies with the minimum requirements above, will be "deemed in order" and will be subjected for consideration in further evaluation processes, even if the Department did not request any corrections.
- 14.4 No submissions of new or alternative documents or certified copies of new or alternative documents will be allowed after the bid closing date.
- 14.5 The Department will not accept a copy of a previously certified document and will not provide any bidder an opportunity to correct such a non-compliance.

15 REQUIREMENTS FOR A VALID BBBEE CERTIFICATES AND SWORN AFFIDAVITS

- 15.1 A valid B-BBEE Certificate is a B-BBEE Certificate which has not expired at the closing date of the bid.
- 15.2 A "Sworn Affidavit" must comply with the following minimum requirements at the closing date, to be considered valid. If the submitted "Sworn Affidavit" does not comply with the minimum requirements below, the bidder will not be given an opportunity to correct it:
 - 15.2.1 The "Sworn Affidavit" must not be expired at the closing date.
 - 15.2.2 The BBBEE Level Contributor must be indicated (ticked)
 - 15.2.3 The "Sworn Affidavit" must be signed and dated by the bidder (Deponent).
 - 15.2.4 The "Sworn Affidavit" submitted must be signed and stamped by the "Commissioner of Oath".
 - 15.2.5 The "latest financial year-end" field must not be left blank.
 - 15.2.5.1 The latest "financial year-end date" cannot be a future date.
 - 15.2.5.2 If only the year is indicated (it is not in the format: day/month/year), the Department will validate the financial year-end (day/month) from CIPC or deal with any clarity seeking matter/ confirmation as an administrative matter.
- 15.3 In respect of "Sworn Affidavits" of the Construction sector, Property Sector, the field (block) where the bidder must confirm its financial information (i.e. Net Assets or Annual Turnover) must be completed (ticked) and must not be left blank or not ticked.
- 15.4 The Commissioner of Oath cannot be an employee or ex officio of the enterprise because, a person cannot by law, commission a sworn affidavit in which they have an interest.
- 15.5 The Department will seek the following clarity matters in respect of the Sworn Affidavits (should it be deemed necessary) and upon request, the bidder will be given a minimum of five (5) working days to respond to the Department:
 - 15.5.1 If the bidder did not select/circle/ticked "Member/ Director/ Owner" where so required. The Department will communicate with such affected the bidder in writing.
 - 15.5.2 If a bidder did not select/ circle/ ticked the required field "Financial Statements/ Management Accounts/ Audited Financial Statements" where so required. The Department will communicate with such affected the bidder in writing.
 - 15.5.3 If only the year is indicated (it is not in the format: day/month/year), the Department will validate the financial year-end (day/month) on CIPC or against any other submitted document or will seek clarity / confirmation from the bidder and deal with it as an administrative matter.
 - 15.5.4 If the financial year-end indicated in the sworn affidavit is not at the end of the month or it is not the correct month when validated on CIPC or against any other submitted documents, the Department will enquire from the affected bidder to indicate its correct latest financial year end in the format (day/month/year) and:
 - 15.5.4.1 If the "day" indicated on the submitted affidavit is wrong, but the month and year is correct, the bidder's affidavit will be "deemed valid" and it will be evaluated.



- 15.5.4.2 If the "month" indicated on the submitted affidavit is wrong, the bidder's affidavit will be will be considered invalid.
- 15.6 The Department will deal with all other matters, which is not listed under the minimum requirements as reflected above, as administrative matters, should it be deemed necessary.
- 15.7 For all sectors (example the construction sector, the property Sector and or any sector), a "Sworn Affidavit" issued in terms of the relevant sector must be used. All the minimum requirements applicable to "valid sworn affidavits" as per this "Special Conditions of Bid" will apply.

16 AWARDING OF POINTS FOR SPECIFIC GOALS (PA-16)

- 16.1 In accordance with the PPPFA regulations 2022, bidders will not be eliminated if they do not submit a BBBEE certificate or a "valid sworn affidavits". The bidder will not be scored for points, but will be evaluated further.
- 16.2 For a bidder to be awarded points for specific goals as per the bid, the bidder must submit proof as specified in the bid document with the bid at the closing date and time.
- 16.3 The requirements of a valid BBBEE-Certificate and or "Sworn Affidavit" as specified in the Special Conditions of Tender applies.
- 16.4 Parties in an unincorporated joint venture must submit its own consolidated B-BBEE certificate, which has not expired at the closing date of the bid.
- 16.5 If a bidder submit with the bid at the closing date the required proof for specific goals, as specified in the bid document, but the proof is not certified or is certified incorrectly, the bidder will be given a minimum of 48 hours to submit a copy which is correctly certified. The copy maybe certified after the closing date of the bid. The copies maybe certified after the closing date of the bid.
- 16.6 Non-submission of the PA-16 form or non-completion the PA-16 form or an incomplete PA-16 form, is not an elimination criteria.
- 16.7 If a bidder submit at the closing date of the bid a valid proof as specified in the bid document, but the bidder's PA 16 is not signed or dated or witnessed or it is not properly completed, or its not completed or submitted or did not claim points, the bidder will be given a minimum of 48 hours to submit or correctly complete its PA 16.
- 16.8 All bidders' whose submitted proof as specified in the bid document and it complies with the minimum requirements above, will be "deemed in order" and will be subjected for consideration in further evaluation, even if the Department did not request any corrections/ certifications.
- 16.9 No submissions of alternative proof for specific goals as specified in the bid document will be allowed after the bid closing date.
- 16.10 Bidders who failed to submit the required proof for points for specific goals, will not be scored for the relevant specific goal(s), but there offers will still be evaluated further.

17 BIDDER'S DISCLOSURE/ BIDDER'S DECLARATION (PA - 11)

- 17.1 The Department will afford a bidder an opportunity to correct its PA-11 form, if the bidder omitted to sign or to complete or to properly complete this form.
- 17.2 A bidder's offer maybe eliminated if the bidder's declaration is proven false during the bid evaluation process.

18 CORRECTION OF ERRORS

- 18.1 Only the authorised signatory to the tender should initial corrections in the tender document.
- 18.2 All corrections must be in non-erasable ink and the use of correcting fluid (tippex) is prohibited.
- In the event that a correction is not initialled or the correction is initialled by a person not having the prescribed authority, the Department will:
- 18.3.1 Seek the necessary clarification from the tenderer and;
- 18.3.2 If accepting the response from the tenderer, evaluate the bid further and or;
- 18.3.3 Allow the tenderer to correct/ ratify any noncompliance, where necessary.

19 CONDITIONS WITHDRAWN FROM THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

19.1 N/A

20 INCOMPLETE SECTIONS OR SCHEDULES IN BID DOCUMENTS

20.1 Bidders' who omitted or incorrectly completed a section(s) or a schedule(s) in the bid document, but have submitted with the bid the required/ specified proof or supportive documents for that particular sections of the document, maybe allowed to correct such non-compliance.



21 POINTS FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- To qualify for points for Specific goals, as specified in the "Invitation to Bid" and the "PA-16", bidders must comply with the requirements at the closing date of the bid.
- It is the bidder's responsibility to ensure that it submit the correct evidence at the closing date of the bid, for the validation of the points the bidder is claiming.
- 21.3 Bidder's will not be given an opportunity to submit evidence after closing date, if the evidence is not submitted or if incorrect evidence was submitted.

PA-10 (FM): CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1. The following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them except where the context otherwise requires:
- **1.1.1.** "Additional Services" are increases in the quantity of the routine Services detailed in the Scope of Works.
- **1.1.2.** "Bill of Quantities" means the document so designated in the Pricing Data that describes the Services and indicates the quantities and rates associated with each item which the Employer agrees to pay the Service Provider for the Services completed;
- **1.1.3.** "Certificate of Completion" means the certificate issued by the Service Manager signifying that the Contract has expired;
- **1.1.4.** "Commencement Date" means the date on when the Service Provider is notified of the Employer's acceptance of its offer;
- **1.1.5.** "Contract" means the Contract signed by the Parties and of which these Conditions of Contract form part of, and such amendments and additions to the Contract as may be agreed in writing between the Parties:
- **1.1.6.** "Contract Data" means the specific data, which together with these Conditions of Contract, Scope of Works and Pricing Data collectively describe the risks, liabilities and obligations of the contracting Parties and the procedures for the administration of the Contract;
- 1.1.7. "Contract Period" is from Commencement Date for the period stated in the Contract Data;
- 1.1.8. "Contract Price" means the price to be paid for the Services in accordance with the Pricing Data, subject to such additions thereto or deductions there from as may be made from time to time under the provisions of the Contract;
- **1.1.9.** "Contract Sum" refers to the amount stated by the Service Provider in the Form of Offer and Acceptance;
- **1.1.10.** "CPAP" means contract price adjustment provisions used for the adjustment of fluctuations in the cost of labour, plant and materials and goods as stated in the Contract Data;
- 1.1.11. "Day" means a calendar day:
- **1.1.12.** "Drawings" means all drawings, calculations and technical information which are made available to the Service Provider for inspection at a venue and time to be announced by the Service Manager and any modifications thereof or additions thereto from time to time approved in writing by the Employer or delivered to the Service Provider by the Employer;
- **1.1.13.** "Employer" means the contracting Party named in the Contract Data who appoints the Service Provider;
- **1.1.14.** "Equipment" includes all appliances, tools implements, machinery, articles and things of whatsoever nature required in or for the rendering, completion or defects correction of the Services but does not include materials;
- **1.1.15.** "Facilities" means the land and buildings, detailed in the Scope of Works, and any additions, or omission thereto, made available by the Employer for the purposes of the Contract, on, under, over, in or through which the Services are to be rendered or carried out;
- **1.1.16.** "Form of Offer and Acceptance" means the written communication by the Employer to the Service Provider recording the acceptance of the Service Provider's offer;



- 1.1.17. "Identified Projects" means any projects, other than routine Services, identified and agreed to by the Parties during the Contract period or any extensions thereto, to be completed in terms of the Contract.
- **1.1.18.** "Materials" includes all materials, commodities, articles and things required to be furnished under the Contract for the execution of the Services:
- **1.1.19.** "Month" refers to the period commencing on a certain day of a month to the day preceding the corresponding day of the next month:
- 1.1.20. "Parties" means the Employer and the Service Provider;
- **1.1.21.** "Pricing Data" means the document that contains the Bill of Quantities and provides the criteria and assumptions, which it will be assumed in the Contract were taken into account by the Service Provider when developing his prices;
- **1.1.22.** "Services" means all the work to be performed by the Service Provider during the Contract Period in accordance with the Contract, as more fully set out in the Scope of Works, as amended from time to time by written agreement between the Parties;
- **1.1.23.** "Service Provider" means the Tenderer, as named in the Contract Data, whose offer has been accepted by or on behalf of the Employer and, where applicable, includes the Service Provider's heirs, executors, administrators, trustees, judicial managers or liquidators, as the case may be, but not, except with the written consent of the Employer, any assignee of the Service Provider:
- **1.1.24.** "Service Manager" means the representative of the Employer named as the Service Manager in the Contract Data. The Employer reserves the right to replace the said Service Manager, by written notice to the Service Provider, without the need to furnish reasons therefor;
- **1.1.25.** "Scope of Work" refers to the document which defines the Employer's objectives and requirements and specifications and any other requirements and constraints relating to the manner in which the Services must, or may, be provided or performed;
- **1.1.26.** "Service Period" refers to the period indicated in the Contract Data during which the Service Provider shall render the Services required in terms of the Contract;
- 1.1.27. "Transitional Stage" refers to the period indicated in the Contract Data, which commences immediately on the expiry of the Service Period, and during which the Services to be provided by the Service Provider shall include, inter alia, the provision and transfer to the incoming service provider of managerial support and information, as detailed in the Scope of Works.
- 2. INTERPRETATION
- 2.1. In this Contract, except where the context otherwise requires:
 - 2.1.1 The masculine includes the feminine and the neuter, vice versa;
 - 2.1.2 The singular includes the plural; and vice versa
 - 2.1.3 Any reference to a natural person includes a body corporate, firm, association or consortium/joint venture/partnership, vice versa.
- 2.2. The headings to the clauses of this Contract are included for reference purposes only and shall not affect the interpretation of the provisions to which they relate.
- 2.3. Words and phrases defined in any clause shall bear the meanings assigned thereto.
- 2.4. The various parts of the Contract are severable and may be interpreted as such.
- 2.5. The expressions listed in clause 1 bear the meanings as assigned thereto and cognate expressions bear corresponding meanings.



2.6. If any provision in a definition clause is a substantive provision conferring rights or imposing obligations on any Party, effect shall be given to it as if it were a substantive clause in the body of the Contract, notwithstanding that it is only contained in the interpretation clause.

3. DURATION

- 3.1. The rights and obligations of the Parties to this Contract shall commence on the Commencement Date.
- 3.2. Subject to the terms of clauses 33 and 34 relating to breach and termination respectively, the Contract will commence on the Commencement Date and terminate on the expiry of the Contract Period, unless it is extended in terms of clause 3.3.
- 3.3. The terms or duration of the Contract may be extended as a result of bona fide negotiations between the Parties. No extension of term or duration of the Contract shall however be valid unless the terms and conditions of such extension has been reduced to writing and signed by the authorised representatives of both Parties.
- 4. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE EMPLOYER
- 4.1. The Employer shall give access to or supply the Service Provider with:
 - 4.1.1 All relevant, available data and information required and requested by the Service Provider for the proper execution of the Services; and
 - 4.1.2 Such assistance as shall reasonably be required by the Service Provider for the execution of its duties under the Contract.
- 5. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE SERVICE PROVIDER
- 5.1. The Service Provider shall, in executing his obligations, comply with the Service Manager's written instructions on any matter relating to the Services.
- 5.2. The Service Provider shall take instructions only from the Service Manager or other persons authorised by the Service Manager in terms of Clause 6.
- 5.3. The Service Provider shall not have the power of attorney or authority to enter into any contract or to otherwise bind or incur liability on behalf of the Employer, save where prior written authorisation has been obtained.
- 5.4. The Service Provider shall ensure that it, its employees, agents and representatives have the relevant experience and capacity necessary for rendering of the Services with the reasonable degree of skill, care and diligence that may be expected of professionals providing services similar to the Services.
- 5.5. Should any member of the Service Provider's team, in the opinion of the Service Manager or occupants of the Facilities, misconduct himself or is incompetent or negligent in the delivery of the Services, or whose presence on the Facilities is otherwise considered by the Service Manager, or occupants of the Facilities, on reasonable grounds, to be undesirable, the Employer may, in writing and together with reasons therefor, request that such person be removed. Such person shall not again be employed on the Services without the prior written consent of the Employer.
- 5.6. The Service Provider undertakes to effect such removal, as referred to in 5.5 above, within a day of receipt of the Employer's written request.
- 5.7. The Service Provider shall ensure that reasonable levels of care and responsibility are exercised when using items belonging to the Employer in the delivery of the Services.
- 5.8. During the ongoing provision of the Services the Service Provider shall at all times keep the Facilities clean and in a safe condition.



5.9. Notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, it is specifically agreed that the appointment of the Service Provider shall not create an employment contract or relationship between the Parties and the Service Provider or his employees shall therefore not be entitled to any benefits to which the employees of the Employer may be entitled.

6. SERVICE MANAGER

- 6.1. The Service Manager shall administer the Contract on behalf of the Employer in accordance with the provisions of the Contract.
- 6.2. The Service Manager may delegate any of his powers and authority and may cancel such delegation, on the prior written notification thereof to the Service Provider.
- 6.3. Such delegation shall continue in force until the Service Manager notifies the Service Provider in writing that the delegation is terminated.
- 6.4. The Service Provider may at any time, prior to giving effect thereto, refer any written order or instruction of the Service Manager's delegatee to the Service Manager who shall confirm, reverse or vary such order or instruction.

7. SECURITY

- 7.1. The Service Provider shall provide to the Employer security in the amount and in the form set out in the Contract Data and any expenditure incurred in doing so shall be borne by the Service Provider.
- 7.2. Should the Service Provider fail to select the security to be provided or should the Service Provider fail to provide the Employer with the selected security within 21 days from Commencement Date, it shall be deemed that the Service Provider has selected a security in the form of a retention of 2.5 % of the Contract Sum (excl. VAT).

8. SECURITY CLEARANCE

- 8.1. In the event of security clearance becoming necessary, the Service Provider, any subcontractors and all human resources utilized by the Service Provider undertake to undergo security clearance, for which purpose the necessary forms will be made available to the Service Provider at the relevant time by the Employer. The Service Provider accepts that if he or any of his human resources refuses to undergo the required security clearance, they will not be allowed on the Facilities to render the Services.
- 8.2. It is required that all persons engaged in the rendering of the Services shall be easily identifiable and where required, security cleared.

9. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 9.1. The Service Provider undertakes to keep any and all information, of whatever nature, relating to the Contract or which he becomes privy to due to his presence at the Facilities, strictly confidential and such shall not be sold, traded, published or otherwise disclosed to anyone in any manner whatsoever, including by means of photocopy or other reproduction, without the Employer's prior written consent. As disclosure or improper use of the confidential information, without the Employer's prior written consent, will cause the Employer harm:
 - 9.1.1 the Service Provider shall be liable for any loss or damages suffered by the Employer and shall indemnify the Employer against any claims by third parties as a result of such unauthorised disclosure or use thereof, either in whole or in part; and/or
 - 9.2.1 the Employer shall be entitled to cancel the Contract
- 9.2. The Service Provider shall be entitled to disclose such confidential information to the following persons, who have a clear need to know interest, in order to assist with the rendering of the Services on the Contract:

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- 9.2.1 employees, officers and directors of the Service Provider; and
- 9.2.2 any professional consultant or agent retained by the Service Provider for the purpose of rendering the Services, provided that the identity of such consultant or agent is made known to the Employer in writing and the Employer acknowledges in writing that the confidential information may be disclosed to such person.
- 9.3. The Service Provider shall be responsible for ensuring that all persons to whom the confidential information is disclosed under this Contract shall keep such information confidential and shall not disclose or divulge the same to any unauthorised person.
- 9.4. The confidential information shall remain the property of the Employer and the Employer may demand the return or destruction thereof, at the cost of the Service Provider, at any time upon giving written notice to the Service Provider. Within ten (10) days of receipt of such notice, the Service Provider shall return all of the original confidential information and shall destroy all copies and reproductions (both written and electronic) in its possession or in the possession of persons to whom it was disclosed and furnish a certificate to the Employer stating as much.

10. AMBIGUITY IN DOCUMENTS

10.1. The several documents forming the Contract are to be taken as mutually explanatory of one another and any ambiguity in or discrepancy between them shall be explained and, if necessary, rectified by the Service Manager who shall thereupon issue to the Service Provider a written explanation giving details of the adjustments, if any, and a written instruction directing what Service, if any, is to be delivered.

11. INSURANCES

11.1. It is the responsibility of the Service Provider to assess his risks on this project and to ensure that he obtains and maintains the adequate insurances to cover such risks.

12. ACCESS TO THE FACILITIES AND COMMENCEMENT OF THE SERVICES

- 12.1. The Service Provider shall provide the Employer, within 21 days of the Commencement Date, with an acceptable health and safety plan and such other information required in terms of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (85 of 1993).
- 12.2. The Service Period shall commence 30 days from Commencement date, or on such other date as maybe specified in the Contract Data
- 12.3. Notwithstanding the provision of 12.2, the Service Provider shall be given access to the Facilities or portions thereof, only after the provision by the Service Provider of an acceptable health and safety plan and of security clearance being obtained in terms of Clauses 12.1 and 8.1 respectively.
- 12.4. The Service Provider shall be given access to the Facilities or portions thereof and shall render the Services in accordance with its programme, referred to in clause 13 or after the receipt by him of a written instruction to this effect.
- 12.5. If the Employer fails to give the Service Provider access to the facility or any portion thereof for any reason other than default by the Service Provider and the Service Provider suffers additional costs as a result thereof, the Service Provider shall be entitled to make a claim therefor provided that the Service Provider is able to prove his claim and that he has taken all reasonable steps to mitigate the additional costs.

13. PROGRAMME

13.1. The Service Provider shall deliver to the Service Manager within 14 days from Commencement Date, a realistic programme and a cash flow for the delivery of the Services. The programme shall describe and detail the order in which the Services are to be rendered and shall be subject to the approval of the Service Manager, which written approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.



- 13.2. The Service Provider shall, on receipt of a written request from the Service Manager, furnish the Employer with any documents or information, of whatever nature, in support of the programme and/or in relation to the manner in which the Services are to be rendered and/or the resources to be supplied and used in the rendering of the Services and/or progress of the various parts of the Contract; and/or a detailed cash flow forecast.
- 13.3. A programme and the cash flow forecast will be submitted in terms of 13.1 and reviewed quarterly or as circumstances may require.
- 13.4. Agreement to the programme by the Service Manager or any adjustment thereto will not alter the responsibilities of the Service Provider in terms of this Contract.

14. SUBCONTRACTING

- 14.1. The Service Provider may subcontract any part of the Services at its discretion. The subcontracts shall incorporate the applicable terms, conditions and requirements of this Contract.
- 14.2. Subcontracting by the Service Provider shall not be construed as relieving the Service Provider from any obligations under the Contract or imposing any liability on the Employer.
- 15. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS INDEMNITY
- 15.1. The Service Provider undertakes to obtain the necessary consent from the proprietors or their licensees should the Service Provider make use of the intellectual property of any other person.
- 15.2. The Service Provider further indemnifies the Employer against any claim or action (including costs on an attorney and client scale) caused by or arising from the failure to obtain such consent.
- 16. COMPLIANCE WITH LEGISLATION
- 16.1. This clause applies to legislation emanating from national and provincial government as well as that of any local authorities in whose area of jurisdiction the Facilities fall and which have a bearing on the delivery of the Services and Facilities under this Contract.
- 16.2. All the applicable legislation, which does not specifically allow discretion in respect of compliance by the Employer, shall be followed exactly as intended by such legislation regardless of any instructions, verbal or in writing, to the contrary.
- 16.3. Should any applicable legislation allow discretion in respect of compliance by the Employer it shall be followed exactly as intended by the relevant legislation as if no discretion is allowed until such time as specific instructions in writing are issued to the Service Provider by the Service Manager.
- 16.4. The Service Provider shall in the provision of the Services comply with the provisions of, and give all notices and pay all fees, taxes, levies and other charges required to be given or paid in terms of any legislation or imposed by any other body or person. The Service Provider hereby indemnifies the Employer against any liability for any breach of the provision of this clause.
- 16.5. It is the responsibility of the Service Provider to obtain the consents, permissions and/or permits, referred to in Clause 16.4, in the provision of the Services.
- 16.6. The Service Provider shall not have a claim against the Employer, and the Employer shall not be liable to refund the Service Provider for any of the fees, taxes, levies and other charges referred to Clause 16.4.
- 17. REPORTING OF INCIDENTS
- 17.1. In addition to the above, the Service Provider shall, as soon as possible, notify the Employer in writing of any incidents at the Facilities, which resulted or could have resulted in damage to property or injury or death to persons.

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- 17.2. The Service Provider shall verbally notify the Service Manager of any of the incidents referred to in 17.1 immediately after the occurrence thereof.
- 17.3. The Service Provider shall follow up the verbal notification referred to in 17.2 with a detailed written report on such incidents to the Service Manager within the time frame indicated by the Service Manager, but in any event within 48 hours of the incident.
- 17.4. The written report referred to in 17.3 shall provide for all incidents, which resulted in injury, death or damage to property.
- 17.5. The Service Provider shall notify the Employer immediately, on becoming aware of the Contract requiring him to undertake anything that is illegal or impossible

18. NUISANCE

- 18.1. The Service Provider shall deliver the Services in a manner that shall not cause unnecessary noise, nuisance, or hinder the normal activities in the Facilities.
- 18.2. The Service Provider hereby indemnifies the Employer against any liability arising out of the Service Provider's non-compliance with his obligations in terms of Clause 18.1.
- 19. MATERIALS, WORKMANSHIP AND EQUIPMENT
- 19.1. All Services delivered, and materials and workmanship shall comply with the requirements of this Contract, the manufacturer's specification; good industry practice and the Service Manager's written instructions and shall be suitable for the purpose intended.
- 19.2. The Service Provider shall, in accordance with the Scope of Works or if instructed by the Service Manager, carry out tests demonstrating the acceptability of the relevant Services provided, or the suitability of materials or equipment to be used.
- 19.3. The Service Provider shall provide all necessary assistance, labour, materials, testing equipment and instruments for the purpose of such tests to be performed by himself or, if so instructed by the Service Manager, for the purposes of tests to be performed by any other person.
- 19.4. All costs for tests carried out shall be deemed to be included in the Service Provider's prices
- 19.5. Copies of the reports on the tests referred to in Clause 19.2 shall be forwarded by the Service Provider to the Employer within 10 days of the tests being completed.

20. URGENT WORK

- 20.1. The Employer may, by itself or through another service provider, effect any remedial or other repair work which becomes necessary due to no act or omission on the part of the Service Provider.
- 20.2. If the remedial or repair work became necessary due to an act or omission on the part of the Service Provider, its employees, agents or representatives, the Service Provider shall effect such remedial or repair work at its own cost.
- 20.3. If the remedial or repair work is urgently necessary due to an act or omission on the part of the Service Provider, its employees, agents or representatives and the Service Provider refuses to or is not available or able to effect such remedial or repair work, the Employer may effect such remedial or repair work either by itself or through another service provider.
- 20.4. If the Employer effects the remedial or repair work in terms of 20.3, then the Employer may recover such costs, losses or damages from the Service Provider or by deducting the same from any amount still due under this Contract or under any other contract presently or hereafter existing between the Employer and the Service Provider and for this purpose all these contracts shall be considered one indivisible whole.

21. INDEMNIFICATIONS



- 21.1. The Service Provider shall be liable for and hereby indemnifies the Employer against any liability, claim, demand, loss, cost, damage, action, suits or legal proceedings whether arising in common law or by statute consequent upon:
 - 21.1.1 personal injuries to or the death of any person arising out of, related to, occasioned by, attributed to, or in the cause of or caused by the rendering of the Services;
 - 21.1.2 loss of or damage to any movable or immovable or personal property or property contiguous to the Facilities whether belonging to or under the control of the Employer or any other body or person arising out of, related to, occasioned by, attributed to, or in the cause of or caused by reason of the rendering of the Services;
 - 21.1.3 any liens, attachments, charges or other encumbrances or claims upon or in respect of any materials parts, work-in-process or finished work furnished to, or in respect of which any payment has been made by the Employer.
- 21.2. The Employer accepts liability for all acts or omissions of its employees, agents or representatives.
- 22. VARIATIONS
- 22.1. The Employer may at any time during the Contract Period, vary the Services by way of additions, omissions, or substitutions.
- 22.2. No variation by the Employer of whatever nature shall vitiate the Contract.
- 22.3. Any Services required by the Employer outside of the Services as referred to in the Scope of Works will be regarded as being Identified Projects and shall be dealt with under clause 23 and shall be executed as a variation order.
- 22.4. The Service Provider shall inform the Employer of any instructions that are deemed to be Additional Services prior to such instructions being executed.
- 22.5. Additional Services will only be executed by the Service Provider after receipt by him of a written instruction from the Service Manager.
- 22.6. If no prior written authorisation, as required in 22.5 above, has been obtained, the Employer shall not reimburse the Service Provider for the Additional Services so executed, and the Service Provider agrees that it shall not have a claim for payment for such Additional Services.
- 22.7. The Additional Services will be valued at the rates in the Pricing Data.
- 23. IDENTIFIED PROJECTS
- 23.1. The Service Provider shall inform the Employer of any instructions that are deemed to be Identified Projects prior to such instructions being executed.
- 23.2. The Employer is not obliged to engage the services of the Service Provider on Identified Projects. The Employer may, by itself, through another service provider or through the Service Provider effect the services/works under Identified Projects.
- 23.3. Identified Projects will only be executed by the Service Provider after receipt by him of a written instruction from the Service Manager.
- 23.4. If no prior written authorisation, as required in 23.3 above, has been obtained, the Employer shall not reimburse the Service Provider for the Identified Projects so executed, and the Service Provider agrees that it shall not have a claim for payment for such Identified Projects.
- 23.5 In respect of the Identified Projects, the written instruction referred to in 23.3 shall:
 - (a) describe the services/works required to be executed by the Service Provider under the Identified Project;

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- (b) state the due commencement and completion dates of the relevant Identified Project;
- (c) state the total cost of the relevant Identified Project as agreed to between the Parties; and
- (d) any additional requirements, conditions of contract and/or restrictions, other than those already stated in the Contract, that will be applicable.
- 23.6 Within 14 days of receipt of the written instruction referred to in 23.5, the Service Provider shall furnish the Employer with a realistic programme and a cash flow for the relevant Identified Project as required in 13.
- 23.7 Where an Identified Project comprises services/works that are of the same or similar character executed under the same or similar conditions as those to which the rates in the Pricing Data apply, it shall be valued at such rates.
- 23.8 Where an Identified Project comprises services/works that are not of the same or similar character executed under the same or similar conditions as those to which the rates in the Pricing Data apply, it shall be valued at market related rates to be agreed to in writing between the Employer and the Service Provider and in advance of executing the Identified Project. Failing agreement, the rates applicable shall be as determined by the Employer.
- 23.9 If the Service Provider fails to complete the Identified Project by the completion date specified in the written instruction referred to in 23.3, then the Service Provider will be liable for a penalty, at the rate stated in the Contract Data, for every day that lapses from the due completion date of the relevant Identified Project to the date of the actual completion of such Identified Project.
- 23.10 If the Identified Projects are delayed by variations, omissions, additions, substitutions or organised work stoppages by any workman not due to any action on the part of the Service Provider, exceptionally inclement weather, any substantial increase in provisional quantities or any other cause beyond the Service Provider's control, including delays caused by the Employer, then the Service Provider shall be entitled to apply in writing within 21 days of the cause of delay arising to the Service Manager for extension of the due completion date of the relevant Identified Project stating the cause of delay and period of extension applied for.
- 23.11 If during the period for completion of the Identified Project or any extension thereof abnormal rainfall or wet conditions occur, the formula below shall be used to calculate separately the delay for each calendar month or part thereof. It shall be calculated each month during the period referred to herein above, or until the issue date of the certificate of completion for the relevant Identified Project, whichever is the shorter period. The delay calculated for a given month shall be used to determine the interim extension of time granted for the month. At the end of the applicable period referred to above, the aggregate of the monthly delays will be taken into account for the final determination of the total extension of time for the Contract:

$$V = (Nw - Nn) + (Rw - Rn)$$

- V = Delays due to rain in calendar days in respect of the calendar month under consideration.
- Nw = Actual number of days during the calendar month on which a rainfall of Y mm or more per day has been recorded
- Rw = Actual rainfall in mm for the calendar month under consideration.
- Nn = Average number of days in the relevant calendar month (as derived from existing rainfall records provided in the project specifications) on which a rainfall of Y mm or more per day has been recorded.
- Rn = Average rainfall in mm for the calendar month, as derived from the rainfall records supplied in the project specifications.
- X = 20, unless otherwise provided in the project specifications.



Y = 10, unless otherwise provided in the project specifications.

The total delay that will be taken into account for the determination of the total extension of time for the Contract shall be the algebraic sum of the monthly totals for the period under consideration. But if the grand total is negative, the time for completion shall not be reduced on account of abnormal rainfall. The total extension of time for any calendar month shall not exceed (Nc - Nn) calendar days, where Nc = number of days calendar days in the month under consideration

The factor (Nw – Nn) shall be considered to represent a fair allowance for variations from the average number of days during which rainfall equals or exceeds Y mm per day.

The factor $(Rw - Rn) \div X$ shall be considered to represent a fair allowance for variations from the average for the number of days during which rainfall does not equal or exceed Y mm per day, but when wet conditions prevent or disrupt work.

This formula does not take into account any flood damage, which could cause further or concurrent delays and which should be treated separately in so far as extension of time is concerned.

Accurate rain gaugings shall be taken at a suitable point on the site daily at 08:00 unless otherwise agreed to by the Service Manager, and the Contractor shall, at his own expense, take all necessary precautions to ensure that the rain gauges cannot be interfered with by unauthorized persons.

Information regarding existing rainfall records, if available from a suitable rainfall station near the site, will be supplied in the project specifications, together with calculations of rain delays for previous years in accordance with the above formula. The average of these delays will be regarded as normal rain delays which the Contractor shall accommodate in his programme, and for which no extension of time will be considered.

- 23.12 Upon receipt of such written application, referred to in 23.10, the Employer may in writing extend the due completion date of the relevant Identified Project by a period to be determined by the Employer or may refuse to extend the due completion date of the relevant Identified Project. The due completion date of an Identified Project may not be extended beyond the end of the Contract Period stated in the Contract Data.
- 23.13 Any decision given by the Employer, in terms of 23.12, shall be final and binding on the Parties.
- 23.14 Should the Service Provider fail to apply in writing for an extension of the due completion date of the relevant Identified Projects within the 21 days referred to in 23.10, or should the Employer not grant an extension of the due completion date then the due completion date stipulated in the relevant written instruction referred to in 23.5 shall not be extended nor the Service Provider exonerated from liability to pay the penalty stipulated in 23.9 or from specific performance of the service/works within the period in the relevant written instruction.

24. SUSPENSION OF THE SERVICES

- 24.1 The Service Provider shall, on the written order of the Service Manager, suspend the provision of the Services or any part thereof for such time or times and in such manner as the Service Manager shall order and shall, during such suspension, properly protect the Services so far as is necessary.
- 24.2 If the Service Provider is instructed in writing by the Service Manager to suspend any or all of the Services, the Service Provider shall re-schedule the relevant Services. For the duration of such suspension all penalties applicable to that Service will be waived. Should the Service Provider suffer any additional costs resulting from such suspension, the Service Provider shall be entitled to make a claim therefor provided that the Service Provider shall prove his claim and that he has taken all reasonable steps to mitigate the additional costs.



24.3 If the Service Provider is unable to render any of the Services for any reason other than an instruction by the Employer to suspend the Services in terms of clause 24.1, the Employer shall not be liable for any claim of whatever nature, including a claim for costs, by the Service Provider.

25. PENALTY FOR NON-PERFORMANCE

- 25.1 The Service Provider shall be liable for a performance deduction, if the Service Provider in rendering any of the Services required under the Scope of Works, as amended from time to time,
 - 25.1.1 delays in performing any of the Services;
 - 25.1.2 fails to perform any of the Services;
 - 25.1.3 fails to perform any of the Services to the standard required in the Scope of Works, as amended from time to time.
- 25.2 The performance deduction shall be calculated in accordance with the formula detailed in the Scope of Works.
- 25.3 The Service Provider shall not be liable for a performance deduction, if the Service Provider is unable to perform due to no fault of his own, his employees, agents or representatives.
- 26. PAYMENTS
- 26.1 The Service Manager will evaluate the Service Provider's performance on a monthly basis.
- 26.2 The Service Provider shall submit a monthly certificate taking into account the following:
 - 26.2.1 the assessment of the Services rendered during the assessment month, including routine services, management fees, and services using call down rates;
 - 26.2.2 adjustments in terms of the pricing data;
 - 26.2.3 additional work rendered by the Service Provider;
 - 26.2.4 CPAP adjustment where stated in the Contract Data; and
 - 26.2.5 VAT. Vat will be indicated separately in all documents.
- 26.3 If the Service Provider elects a security of 2,5% retention, or a 1,25% cash and 1,25% retention, then 5% of all moneys (excl. VAT) in the monthly certificate assessed by the Service Manager as being due to the Service Provider will be retained until such time as the amount retained equals 2.5% or 1,25%, whichever is applicable, of the Contract Sum (excl. VAT)
- The monthly certificate shall be supported by a detailed report substantiating the Services rendered at each Facility during the month under assessment.
- 26.5 The monthly certificate shall be assessed by the Service Manager. If the Service Manager agrees with the certificate, he will issue a statement within 14 days of the receipt of the certificate, taking into account inter alia the following:
 - i. Deductions for penalties;
 - ii. Deductions for overpayments:
 - iii. Deductions for retention
 - iv. Deductions for damages.
- The Service Provider shall, on receipt of the statement referred to in 26.5, issue to the Employer a tax invoice in the amount reflected in the statement. The Employer shall effect payment to the Service Provider within 16 days of receipt of the tax invoice.



- 26.7 If the Service Manager does not agree with the certificate issued by the Service Provider in terms of Clause 26.2, the Service Manager shall within 14 days of receipt of the certificate, issue a statement in the amount to which the Service Manager agrees and shall give reasons for rejecting the balance of the claim indicated in the statement.
- 26.8 The Service Provider shall furnish the Employer with a tax invoice in the amount indicated in the statement referred to in Clause 26.7.
- With regards to the claim in dispute, the Service Provider may, within 14 days of the Service Manager issuing the statement referred to in 26.7, submit a revised certificate or a justification for his claim or declare a dispute in terms of 34.
- 26.10 If it is later resolved that the amount in dispute or any part thereof is owing to the Service Provider, the Employer shall be liable for interest thereon from 30 days after the issue of the relevant monthly certificate referred to in 26.2 until the date of payment at the interest rate determined from time to time, by the Minister of Finance in terms of section 80 (1)(b) of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act 1 of 1999), as amended.
- 26.11 All the work shall be evaluated in accordance with the provisions of the Pricing Data.
- 26.12 In assessing the quality of the work presented by the Service Provider, the Employer may enlist the assistance of third persons. In assessing the work the third person shall act reasonably. The selection of such third persons shall be in the absolute discretion of the Employer and the Service Provider shall abide by such selection.
- 26.13 Any and all extra costs incurred by the Service Provider, resulting from the Service Provider having to address and/or rectify queries arising from a claim submitted in respect of work done, shall be for the account of the Service Provider.
- 27. RELEASE OF SECURITY
- 27.1 If the Service Provider has furnished a security by way of a variable guarantee of 2.5% of the Contract Sum (excl. VAT), the security will be reduced and be released in accordance with the provisions of such variable guarantee.
- 27.2 If the Service Provider elects to furnish a security by way of a cash deposit of 2.5% of the Contract Sum (excl. VAT), then the security will be released as follows:
 - 27.2.1 annually in equal portions, subject to 27.2.2 and 27.2.3;
 - 27.2.2 95% of the last annual portion of retention shall be released within 30 days of the expiry of the Service Period;
 - 27.2.3 the remaining retention shall be released within 30 days of the issue of the Certificate of Completion.
- 27.3 If the form of security selected is:
 - (a) a retention of 2.5% of the Contract Sum (excl. VAT); or
 - (b) a 1,25% cash deposit and a 1,25% retention of the Contract Sum (excl. VAT).

then security will only be released after the 2,5% or 1,25% retention respectively has been accumulated, as follows:

- 27.3.1 annually in equal portions, subject to 27.3.2 and 27.3.3;
- 27.3.2 95% of the last annual portion of retention shall be released within 30 days of the expiry of the Service Period;
- 27.3.3 the remaining retention shall be released within 30 days of the issue of the Certificate of Completion.

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28. OVERPAYMENTS

28.1 If any overpayment of whatever nature is made to the Service Provider, the Service Provider shall be obliged to repay such amount to the Employer and the Employer shall be entitled to deduct such over payment from any amount due to the Service Provider, in respect of this Contract or any other contract, which the Employer may have with the Service Provider. The Employer shall be entitled to claim interest on any and all overpayments made to the Service Provider at the rate prescribed, from time to time, by the Minister of Finance in terms of section 80 (1)(b) of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act 1 of 1999), as amended.

29. COMPLETION

- 28.1 At the expiry of the Service Period the Service Manager shall furnish the Service Provider with a written list of Employer's Assets and Data handed over at commencement of the Contract and accumulated during the Contract Period.
- 29.2 At the expiry of the Contract Period, the Service Manager shall issue to the Service Provider a Certificate of Completion.
- 29.3 Upon the issue of a Certificate of Completion, unless otherwise provided in the Contract:
 - 29.3.1 The Guarantee shall be returned, if applicable.
 - 29.3.2 The final cash deposit or retention, whichever is applicable, shall be reduced to zero.
- 30. ASSIGNMENT
- 30.1 The rights and obligations of the Parties in terms of this Contract shall not be ceded, assigned, delegated, or otherwise transferred, by either Party to any person outside of the Service Provider and the Employer, save with the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 30.2 Each Party warrants that he is acting as a principal and not as an agent of an undisclosed principal.
- 31. INDULGENCES
- 31.2 No extension of time, latitude or other indulgences which may be given or allowed by either Party to the other shall constitute a waiver or alteration of this Contract, or affect such Party's rights, or prevent such Party from strictly enforcing due compliance with each and every provision of this Contract.
- 32. OWNERSHIP AND PUBLICATION OF DOCUMENTS
- 32.1 The Employer will become the owner of the information, documents, advice, recommendations and reports collected, furnished and/or compiled by the Service Provider during the course of, and for the purposes of executing this Contract, all of which will be handed over to the Employer, unless otherwise stipulated in the Contract, within ten (10) days of request therefor, but in any event on the termination and/or cancellation of this Contract for whatever reason. The Service Provider relinquishes its retention or any other rights to which it may be entitled.
- 32.2 The copyright of all documents, recommendations and reports compiled by the Service Provider during the course of and for the purposes of finalising Services, and the Contract as a whole, will vest in the Employer, and may not be reproduced or distributed or made available to any person outside the Employer's service, or to any institution in any way, without the prior written consent of the Employer. The Employer shall have the right to use such material for any other purpose without the approval of, notification to or payment to the Service Provider.
- 32.3 The copyright of all electronic aids, software programmes etc. prepared or developed in terms of this Contract shall be vested in the Employer, who shall have the right to use such material for any other purpose without the approval of, information or payment to the Service Provider.
- 32.4 In case of the Service Provider providing documents or material to the Employer, the development of which has not been at the expense of the Employer, copyright shall not be



vested in the Employer. The Service Provider shall be required to indicate to which documents and/or materials this provision applies.

- 32.5 The Service Provider hereby indemnifies the Employer against any action or claim that may be instituted against the Employer and for any damages suffered or legal costs (including costs on an attorney and client scale) incurred on the grounds of an alleged infringement of any copyright or any other intellectual property right in connection with the work outlined in this Contract.
- 32.6 All information, documents, recommendations, programmes and reports collected or compiled must be regarded as confidential and may not be communicated or made available to any person outside the Employer's service and may not be published either during the currency of this Contract or after termination thereof without the prior written consent of the Employer.

33. BREACH OF CONTRACT

- 33.1 In the event of a breach by the Service Provider of any of the terms and conditions of this Contract, the Employer shall issue a notice of non- compliance requiring compliance within 10 (ten) days. In the event that the Service Provider fails to remedy such breach on expiry of the notice period, then the Employer shall without prejudice to any other rights that it may have, be entitled to exercise any or all of the following rights:
 - 33.1.1 Enforce strict compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract;
 - 33.1.2 To terminate this Contract without prejudice to any other rights it may have;
 - 33.1.3 To suspend further payments to the Service Provider;
 - 33.1.4 To appoint other service providers to complete the execution of the Services, in which event the Service Provider shall be held liable for costs incurred in connection with and arising from the appointment of such a service provider as well as damages suffered.
- 33.2 The Service Provider agrees to, within ten (10) days of written request from the Employer, give access to and to make available all information, documents, programmes, advice, recommendations and reports collected, furnished and/or compiled by them to enable the Employer to assume responsibility for and the benefit of the project as a whole.
- 33.3 In the event of breach by the Employer of the terms and conditions of this Contract, and in the event of the Employer remaining in breach after ten (10) days' written notice calling for rectification of the breach, the Service Provider shall be entitled to:
 - 33.3.1 enforce strict compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract; or
 - 33.3.2 terminate the Contract by delivering written notice to the Employer to that effect to the extent that such breach is of a material term of this Contract.

34. STOPPAGE AND/OR TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

- 34.1 The Employer reserves the right to terminate this Contract or temporarily stop the Services, or any part thereof, at any stage of completion.
- 34.2 The Employer shall have the right to terminate this Contract without prejudice to any of its rights upon the occurrence of any of the following acts:
 - 34.2.1 on breach of this Contract by the Service Provider as stipulated in Clause 33;
 - 34.2.2 on commencement of any action for the dissolution and/or liquidation of the Service Provider, except for purposes of an amalgamation or restructuring approved in advance by the Employer in writing;
 - 34.2.3 if the Service Provider receives a court order to be placed under judicial management or to commence liquidation proceedings that is not withdrawn or struck out within five (5) days;



- 34.2.4 if the Service Provider informs the Employer that it intends to cease performing its obligations in terms of this Contract;
- 34.2.5 if the Service Provider informs the Employer that it is incapable of completing the Services as described: or
- 34.2.6 if in the opinion of the Employer the Service Provider acted dishonestly;
- 34.3 The Employer reserves the right to, even in the absence of breach or the events referred to in 34, terminate this Contract at any time, by giving one (1) calendar month written notice to the Service Provider.
- 34.4 Further, the Contract shall be considered as having been terminated:
 - 34.4.1 where the Employer stops the Contract and/or the Project and instructions to resume or reinstate the Services are not issued within twelve (12) months of the instruction; or
 - 34.4.2 if instructions, necessary for the Service Provider to continue with the Services after a stoppage instruction, are not received from the Employer within three (3) months after such instructions were requested by the Service Provider.
- 34.5 Should the Contract between the Employer and the Service Provider, or any part thereof, be terminated by either of the Parties due to reasons not attributed to the Service Provider:
 - 34.5.1 The Service Provider will be remunerated for the appropriate portion of the Services satisfactorily completed, calculated in accordance with the agreed rates.
 - 34.5.2 Invoices for work done shall be submitted to the Employer within three (3) months after the termination of the Contract, failing which the Employer will not be obliged to pay same.
 - 34.5.3 The Service Provider shall not be entitled to advance a right of retention or any similar right if this Contract is terminated and specifically agrees to, within ten (10) days of written request from the Employer, give access to and to make available all information, documents, programmes, advice, recommendations and reports collected, furnished and/or compiled by them to enable the Employer to assume responsibility for and the benefit of the Contract as a whole.

35. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 35.1 In the event of a dispute, the Parties shall endeavour to resolve such dispute through negotiation, in good faith.
- 35.2 If the Parties fail to resolve a dispute through negotiation as mentioned in 35.1, within 14 days of a dispute being declared, the Parties may by written agreement refer the matter to mediation.
- 35.3 The mediator shall be a person agreed to by the Parties, failing agreement, the President: South African Facilities Management Institute shall nominate the mediator.
- Whether or not mediation resolves the dispute and irrespective of the outcome of thereof, the Parties shall bear their own costs arising from the mediation and shall equally share the costs of the mediator and related costs. The mediator and the Parties shall, before the commencement of the mediation, agree on a scale of fees on which the mediator's fees will be based.
- 35.5 The Parties shall appoint the mediator within 21 days of agreeing to mediate.
- On appointment of the mediator, the Parties shall jointly with the mediator decide on the procedure to be followed, representation, dates and venue for the mediation.



- 35.7 If the dispute or any part thereof is settled, the agreement shall be recorded by the mediator and signed by both Parties. The agreement shall be binding on the Parties to the extent that it correctly records the issues agreed upon between the Parties.
- 35.8 If the dispute or any part thereof remains unresolved, it may be resolved by litigation proceedings.
- 35.9 If the mediator or any Party, at any time during the mediation process, is of the opinion that the mediation will not resolve the dispute, then he may in writing stop the mediation process. The dispute may then be dealt with in terms of 35.8.
- 35.10 Notwithstanding anything else herein contained to the contrary, it is agreed that irrespective of the fact that the dispute is referred to negotiation, mediation or litigation in court, the decision of the Employer on the dispute involved will immediately be given effect to by the Service Provider and the Service Provider shall proceed with the Services with all diligence unless the Parties agree otherwise in writing.
- 36. GENERAL
- 36.1 This is the entire Contract between the Parties and may only be amended if reduced to writing and signed by the duly authorised representatives of both Parties, whereafter such amendments will take effect.
- 36.2 The Contract shall be governed by, construed and interpreted according to the law of the Republic of South Africa.
- 37. DOMICILIUM CITANDI ET EXECUTANDI
- 37.1 The domicilium citandi et executandi of the Parties for all purposes arising from this Contract for the service of notices and legal process shall be as specified by the Parities in the Contract Data.
- 37.2 Each of the Parties shall be entitled at any time by way of written notice to the other Party, to change its domicilium citandi et executandi to another physical address.
- 37.3 Any notice in terms of the conditions of the Agreement must either be:
 - 37.3.1 delivered by hand during normal business hours of the recipient; or
 - 37.3.2 sent by prepaid registered post to the address chosen by the addressee.
- 37.4 A notice in terms of the provisions of this Agreement shall be considered to be duly received:
 - 37.4.1 if hand-delivered on the date of delivery;
 - 37.4.2 if sent by registered post as indicated in clause 37.3.2 above, ten (10) days after the date it was posted, unless the contrary is proved.
- 37.5 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied in this Agreement, the written notice or communication actually received by one of the Parties from the other, including by way of facsimile transmission, shall be adequate written notice or communication to such Party.
- 37.6 Any notice, request, consent, or other communication made between the Parties pursuant to the Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been made when delivered in person to an authorized representative of the Party to whom the communication is addressed, or one day after being sent by facsimile to such Party at the number specified in the Contract Data or one week after being sent by registered post to the addressee specified in the Contract Data.

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DEFINITIONS

- 1.1. The following words and expressions shall have the meanings herby assigned to them except where the context otherwise requires:
- 1.1.1 <u>"Additional Services"</u> are increases in the quality of the routine Services detailed in the Scope of Works
- 1.1.2 <u>"Bill of Quantities"</u> means the document so designated in the Pricing Data that the Services and indicates the quantities and rates associated with each item the Service Provider for the Services Completed
- 1.1.3 <u>"Certificate of Completions"</u> means the certificate issued by the Service Manager signifying that the contract has expired;
- 1.1.4 <u>"Commencement Date"</u> means the date on when the Services Provider is notified the Employer's acceptance of its offer:
- 1.1.5 "Contract" means the Contract signed by the parties and of which these conditions of Contract form part of, and such amendments and additions to the Contract as may be agreed in writing between the Parties:
- 1.1.6 <u>"Contract Data"</u> means the specific data, which together with these Conditions of Contract, Scope of Works and Pricing Data collectively describe the Risks, Liabilities and Obligations of the contacting Parties and the procedures for the administration of the Contract;
- 1.1.7 "Contract Period" is from the Commencement Date for the period stated in the Contract Data:
- 1.1.8 <u>"Contract Price"</u> means the to be paid for the Service in accordance with the Pricing Data, subject to such additions thereto or dedication thereto or deductions there from as may be from time to time under the provision of the Contract;
- 1.1.9 <u>"Contract Sum"</u> refers to the amount stated by the Services Provider in the form of Offer and Acceptance;
- 1.1.10 <u>"CPAP"</u> means contract price adjustment provisions used for the adjustment of fluctuations in the cost of labour, plant and material and goods as stated in the Contract Data:
- 1.1.11 "Day" means a calendar day:

- 1.1.18 <u>"Materials"</u> includes all materials, commodities, articles and things required to be the contract for the execution of the Services;
- 1.1.19 "Month" refers to the period commencing on a certain day of the month to the day preceding the corresponding day of the next month:
- 1.1.20 <u>"Parties"</u> means the Employer and the Service Provider:



- 1.1.21 <u>"Pricing Data"</u> means the document that contains the Bill of Quantities and provides the criteria and assumptions, which it will be assumed in the Contract were taken into account by the Service Provider when developing his prices;
- 1.1.22 <u>"Rates"</u> means for all items bided in this document shall include for additional cost, and shall be representative of the actual cost involved in the executing thereof plus a reasonable mark up and should be valid whether the work associated therewith will be carried out once or more frequently; "Not Applicable" "(N/A)" Means not to be priced or completed.
- 1.1.23 <u>"Services"</u> means all the work to be performed by the Service Provider during the Contract period in accordance with the Contract, as more fully set out in the Scope of Works, as amended from time to time by written agreement between the Parties;
- 1.1.24 <u>"Service Provider"</u> means the Bidder, as named in the Contract Data whose offer has been accepted by or on behalf of the Employer and where applicable, includes the Service Provider's heirs, executors administrators, trustees, judicial managers or liquidators as the case may be, but not except with written consent of the Employer, any assignee of the Service Provider;
- 1.1.25 <u>"Service Manager"</u> means the representative of the Employer named as the Service Manager in the Contract Data. The Employer reserves the right to replace the said Service Manager, by written notice to the Service Provider, without the need to furnish reasons thereto:
- 1.1.26 "Scope of Work" refers to the document which defines the Employer's objectives and requirements and specifications and any other requirements and constraints relating to the manner in which the Services must, or may, be provided or performed;
- 1.1.27 <u>"Service Period"</u> refers to the period indicated in the Contract Data, during which the Service Provider shall render the Services required in terms of the Contract;
- 1.1.28 <u>"Transitional Stage"</u> refers to the period indicated in the Contract Data which commences immediately on the expiry of the Service Period, and which the Services to be provided by the Service Provider shall include, inter alia the provision and transfer to the incoming service provider of managerial support and information, as detailed in the Scope of Works.

INTERPRETATION

- 2.1. In this Contract, except where the context otherwise requires:
- 2.1.1. The masculine includes the feminine and the neuter, vice versa;
- 2.1.2. The Singular includes the plural; and vice versa;
- 2.1.3. Any Reference to a natural person includes a body corporate, firm, association or consortium/joint venture/partnership, vice versa.
- 2.2. The headings to the clauses of this contract are included for references purposes only and shall not affect the interpretation of the provision to which they relate.
- 2.3. Words and phrases defined in any clause shall bear the meanings assigned thereto.
- 2.4. The various parts of the Contract are severable and may be interpreted as such.
- 2.5. The expressions listed in clause 1 bear the meanings as assigned thereto and cognate expressions bear corresponding meanings.
- 2.6. If any provision in a definition clause is a substantive provision conferring or imposing obligations on any Party, effect shall be given it as if it were a substantive clause in the body of the Contract, notwithstanding that it is only contained in the interpretation clause.

DURATION

- 3.1. The rights and obligations of the Parties to this Contract shall commence on the Commencement Date.
- 3.2. Subject to the terms of clauses 33 and 34 relating to breach and termination respectively, the Contract will commence on Commencement Date and terminate on the expiry of the Contract Period unless it is extended in terms of clause 3.3.
- 3.3. The terms of duration of the Contract may be extended as a result of bona fide negotiations between the Parties. No extension of term or duration of Contract shall however be valid unless the terms and conditions of such extension has been reduced in writing and signed by the authorized representatives of both Parties.



RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF EMPLOYER

- 4.1. The Employer shall give access to or supply the Service Provider with:
- 4.1.1. All relevant, available data and information required and requested by the Services Provider for the proper execution of the Service;
- 4.1.2. Such assistance as shall reasonably be required by the Service Provider for the duties under the Contract.

RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE SERVICES PROVIDER

- 5.1. The Service Provider shall, in executing his obligations, comply with the Service Manager's written instructions on any matter relating to the Services
- 5.2. The Service provider shall take instructions only from the Service Manager or persons authorized by the Service Manager in terms of clause 6
- 5.3. The Service Provider shall not have the power of attorney or authority to enter into any contract or to otherwise bind or incur liability on behalf of the Employer, save where prior written authorization has been obtained.
- 5.4. The Service Provider shall ensure that it, its employees, agents and representatives have the relevant experience and capacity necessary for rendering of the Services with the reasonable degree of skill, care and diligence that may be expected of Professionals providing services to the Services.
- 5.5. Should the any member of the Service Provider's team, in the opinion of the Service Manager or occupants of the Facilities, misconduct himself or is incompetent or negligent in the delivery of the Services, or whose presence on the Facilities is otherwise considered by the Service Manager, or occupants of the Facilities, on a reasonable grounds to be undesirable the Employer may, in writing and other with reason thereof request that such person be removed. Such person shall not again be employed on the Services without the prior written consent of the Employer
- 5.6. The Service Provider undertakes to effect such removal as referred to in 5.5 above, within a day of receipt of the Employer written request.
- 5.7. The Service Provider shall ensure that reasonable levels of care and responsibility are exercised when using items belonging to the Employer in the delivery of the Services.
- 5.8. During the ongoing provision of the Services the Services Provider shall at all times keep the Facilities clean and in a safe condition.
- 5.9. Notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, it is specifically agreed that the appointment of the Service Provider shall not create an employment contract or relationship between the Parties and the Service Provider or his employees shall therefore not be entitled to any benefits to which the employees of the Employer may be entitled.

SERVICE MANAGER

- 6.1. The Service Manager shall administer the Contract on behalf of the Employer in accordance with the provisions of the Contract.
- 6.2. The Service Manager may delegate any of his powers and authority and may cancel such delegation on prior written notification thereof to the Service Provider.
- 6.3. Such delegation shall continue in force until the Service Manager notifies the Service Provider in writing that the delegation is terminated.
- 6.4. The Service Provider may at any time, prior to giving effect thereto, refer any written order or instruction of the Service Manager's delegate to the Service Manager who shall confirm, reverse or verify the order or instruction.

SECURITY CLEARANCE

7.1. Security Clearance is necessary, and all human resources utilized by the Service Provider and the Service Provider undertake to undergo Security Clearances for which the necessary forms will be made available to the Service Providers at the relevant time by the Employer. The Service Provider accepts that if he or any of his resources refuses to undergo the required security clearance they will not awarded on be allowed on the Facilities or to render services.

CONFIDENTIALITY

8.1. The Service Provider undertakes to keep any and all information, whatever nature, relating to the Contract or which he becomes privy to due to his presence at the Facilities, strictly confidential and such not to be sold, traded, published or otherwise disclosed to anyone in any matter whatsoever, including by means of photocopy or other reproductions, without the Employer's prior written consent, A disclosure or improper use of the confidential information, without the Employer's prior written consent will cause the Employer harm:



- 4.1.3. The service provider shall be liable for any loss or damages suffered by the Employer and shall indemnify the Employer against any claim by third parties as a result of such unauthorized disclosure or use thereof, either in whole or in part; and/or:
- 4.1.4. The Employer shall be entitled to cancel the contract.
- 8.2. The Service Provider shall be entitled to disclose such confidential information to the following persons, who have a clear need to know interest, in order to assist with the rendering of the Services on the Contract:
- 8.2.1. Employees, officers and directors of the Service Providers
- 8.3. Any professional consultant or agent retained by the Service Provider for the purpose of rendering the Services, provided that the identity of such consultant or agent is made known to the Employer in writing and the Employer acknowledges in writing that the confidential information may be disclosed to such person.

The several documents forming the Contract are to be taken as mutually explanatory of one another and any ambiguity in or discrepancy between them shall be explained and if necessary, rectified by the Service Manager who shall thereupon issue to the Services Provider a written explanation giving details of the adjustments, if any, and a written instruction what Service, if any is to be delivered.

INSURANCES

10.1. It is the responsibility of the Service Provider to assess his Risk on the contract and to ensure that the he obtains and maintains the adequate insurances to cover all such Risks.

ACCESS TO FACILITIES AND COMMENCEMENT OF SERVICES

- 11.1. The Services Provider shall provide the Employer within 21 days of Commencement Date with an acceptable Health and Safety plan and such other information required in terms of the Occupational Health and Safety Act (85 of 1993)
- 11.2. The Services Period shall commence on the Commencement Date or on such other date as maybe specified in the Contract.
- 11.3. Notwithstanding the provision of 11.2 the Service Provider shall be given access to the Facilities or portions thereof, only after the provision by the Service Provider of an acceptable Health and Safety plan and Security clearance being obtained in term of clause 11.1 and 7.1 respectively

SUBCONTRACTING



12.1. The Service Provider may not Subcontract any part of the Contract Services at it discretion

12.2. The only services that may be subcontracted is when there is a specialized services to be done, this can only done with the written consent and approval from the Service Manager.

COMPLIANCE WITH LEGISLATION

- 13.1. This clause applies to legislation emanating from national and provincial government as well as that of any local authority in whose area of jurisdiction the Facilities fall and which the intellectual property of any other person.
- 13.2. All the applications legislation, which does not specifically allow discretion in respect of compliance the Employer shall be exactly as intended by such legislation regardless of any instruction, verbal or in writing, to the contrary.
- 13.3. Should any applicable legislation allow discretion in respect of compliance by the Employer it shall be followed exactly as intended by the relevant legislation as if no discretion is allowed until such time as specific instructions in writing are issued to the Service Provider by the Service Manager?

REPORTING OF INCIDENTS

- 14.1. In addition to the above the Service Provider shall as soon as possible, notify the Employer in writing of any incidents at the Facilities, which or could have resulted in damage to property or injury or depth to persons.
- 14.2. The Service Provider shall follow up verbal notification with a detailed written report on incidents to the Service Manager within the time frame indicated by the Service Manager, but in any event within 48 hours of the incident.
- 14.3. The Service Provider shall notify the Employer immediately, on becoming of the Contract requiring him to undertake anything that is illegal or impossible.

NUISANCE

- 15.1. The Service Provider shall deliver the Service in a manner that shall not cause unnecessary noise, nuisance, or hinder the normal activities in the Facilities.
- 15.2. The Service Provider hereby indemnifies the Employer against any Liability arising out of the Service Provider no-compliance with his obligations in term of Clause 15.1

MATERIAL, WORKMANSHIP, AND EQUIPMENT

- 16.1. All Services delivered, and materials and workmanship shall comply with the requirements of this Contract the manufacturer's specification; good industry practices and the Service Manager's written instructions and shall be suitable for the purpose intended.
- 16.2. The Service Provider shall in accordance with the Scope of Works or if instructed by the Service Manager, carry out tests demonstrating the acceptability of the relevant Services provided, or the suitability of materials or equipment to be used.

URGENT WORK (EMERGENCY'S)

- 17.1. The Employer may, by itself or through another service provider, effect any remedial or other repair work which becomes necessary due to ne act or omission on the part of the Service Provider.
- 17.2. If the Employer effects the remedial or repair work in of 20.1 then the Employer may recover such cost, losses or damages from the Service Provider or deduct the same from any amount still due under this contract or under any other contract presently or hereafter existing between the Employer and the Service Provider and for this purpose all these contracts shall be considered one indivisible whole.

INDEMNIFICATIONS

- 18.1. The Service Provider shall be liable for and herby indemnifies the Employer against any liability, claim, demands, loss, costs, damages, action, suites or legal proceedings whether arising in common law or by statute consequent upon.
- 18.2. The Employ accepts liability for all acts or omissions of its employees or representatives. VARIATIONS
- 19.1. The Employer may at any time during the Contract Period, vary the Services by way of additions, omissions, or substitution.
- 19.2. No variation by the Employer of whatever nature shall vitiate the Contract.
- 19.3. If no prior written authorization, has been obtained, the Employer shall not reimburse the Service Provider for the Additional Services so executed, and the Service Provider agrees that it shall not have a claim for payment for such additional Services

SUSPENSION OF THE SERVICES

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- 20.1. The Service Provider shall, on written order of the Service Manager, suspend the provision of the Services or any part thereof for time or times and in such manner as the Service Manager shall order and shall during such suspension, properly protect the Services so far as is necessary.
- 20.2. If the Service Provider is unable to render any of the Services for any reason other than and instruction by the Employer to suspend the Services in terms of clause 23.1, the Employer shall be liable for any claim of whatever nature, including a claim for cost, by the Services Provider.

PENALTY FOR NON-PERFORMANCE

21.1. The Service Provider shall be liable for a performance deduction, if the Service Provider in rendering any of the Services required under the Scope of Works, as amended from time to time.

PAYMENTS TERMS AND INVOICE SUBMISSIONS

- 22.1. With Reference to Paragraph 4.12 of FM Circular 31 of 2024 of the Department All service providers must submit their invoices within 30 days after a job has been completed, together with a signed and stamped date of completion as per the User Department.
- 22.2. Invoices not submitted within 30 days will be considered invalid for payment. "The Contractor shall submit a detailed invoice to the DPWI, within sixteen (16) calendar days following the completion of the work or the delivery of services. The invoice must include all necessary documentation, including but not limited to, itemised costs, job cards. Failure to submit an invoice within the aforementioned period shall result in a forfeiture of the right to receive payment for the completed work or services.
- 22.3. The DPWI shall have no obligation to make any payments for work completed or services rendered if the invoice is not submitted within the specified 30-day period."
- 22.4. On completion of the Contract, the Service Provider must submit all outstanding invoices for services completed within 90days of the last day of the expired contract.
- 22.5. Service Providers should note that when submitting a tax invoice, tax invoices should follow the same sequence of ID numbers / complaint numbers as given by the Project Manager. Any deviation from the said sequence will result in penalisation unless determined to be valid, based on the scope of work.

OVERPAYMENTS

- 23.1. If any overpayments of whatever nature is made to the Service Provider, the Service Provider shall be obliged to repay such amount to the Employer and the Employer shall be entitled to deduct such over payment from any amount due to the Service Provider in respect of this contract, which the Employer may have with the Service Provider.
- 23.2. The Employer shall be entitled to claim interest on any and all overpayments made to the Service Provider at the rate prescribed, from time to time, by the Minister of Finance in terms of 80(1)(b) of the Public Finance Management Act 1999 (Act, 1 of 1999) as amended.

BREACH OF CONTRACT

- 24.1. In the event of a breach by the Service Provider of any of the terms and conditions of this Contract, the Employer shall issue a notice of non-compliance within 10(ten) days. In the event that the Service Provider fails to remedy such breach on expiry of the notice period, then the Employer shall without prejudice to any other rights that it may have, be entitled to exercise any or all of the following:
- 24.1.1. Enforce strict compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract;
- 24.1.2. Terminate this contract without prejudice to any other rights it may have;
- 24.1.3. To suspend further payments to the Services Provider;
- 24.1.4. To appoint other services providers to complete the execution of the Services, in which event the Services Provider shall be held liable for cost incurred in connection with and arising from the appointment of such a service provider as well as damages suffered.
- 24.1.5. In the event of breach by the Employer of the terms and conditions of this Contract, and in the event of the Employer remaining in breach after 10(ten) days written notice calling for rectification of the breach, the Service Provider shall be entitled to:
- 24.1.5.1. Enforce strict compliance with the terms and conditions of the Contract; or
- 24.1.5.2. Terminate the Contract by delivering written notice to the Employer to that effect to the extent that such breach is of a material term of this Contract.

STOPPAGE AND/OR TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

25.1. The Employer reserves the right to terminate this Contract or to temporarily stop the Services, or any part of thereof at any stage of completion.

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- 25.2. The Employer shall have the right to terminate this contract without prejudice to any of its rights upon occurrence of any of the following;
- 25.2.1. on breach of this Contract by the Service Provider as stipulated in Clause 27
- 25.2.2. on commencement of any action for the dissolution and/or liquidation of the Service provider except for the purposes of amalgamation or restructuring approved in advance by the Employer in writing;
- 25.2.3. If the Service Provider receives a court order to be paid under judicial management or commence liquidation proceedings that is not withdrawn or struck out with five (5)
- 25.2.4. If the Service Provider informs the Employer that it intends to cease performing its obligation in terms of this Contract:
- 25.2.5. If the Service Provider informs the Employer that it is incapable on completing the Services as described; or
- 25.2.6. If in the opinion of the Employer the Service Provider acted dishonestly;
- 25.3. The Employer reserves the right to, even in the absence of breach or the event referred to, terminate this contract at any time, by giving one (1) calendar month written notice to the Service Provider.
- 25.4. Further the Contract shall be considered as having terminated:
- 25.4.1. where the Employer stops the Contract or the Contract and instruction to resume or reinstate the Services are not issued with twelve (12) months of the instructions; or
- 25.4.2. if instructions, necessary for the Service Provider to continue with the Service after a stoppage instruction are not received from the Employer within three (3) months after such instruction were requested by the Service provided
- 25.5. Should the Contract between the Employer and the Service Provider, or any part thereof, be terminated by either of the Parties due to reasons not attributed to the Service Provider:
- 25.5.1. The Service Provider will be remunerated for the appropriate portion of the Services satisfactorily completed, calculated in accordance with the agreed rates.
- 25.5.2. 28.5.2. Invoices for work done shall be submitted to the Employer within three (3) months after the termination of the Contract, failing which the Employer will not be obliged to pay same.
- 25.5.3. The Service Provided shall not be entitled to advance a right or any similar right if this Contract is terminated and specifically agrees to within ten (10) days of written request from the Employer, give access to and to make available all information, document, advice, recommendations and reports collected, furnished and or compiled by them to enable the Employer to assume responsibility for and the benefit of the Contract as a whole.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 26.1. In the event of a dispute, the Parties shall endeavor to resolve such dispute through negotiation, in good faith.
- 26.2. If the Parties fail to resolve a dispute through negotiations as mentioned in 29.1 within 24 days of a dispute being declared, the Parties may by written agreement refer the matter to mediation.
- 26.3. Whether or not mediation resolves the dispute and irrespective of the outcome of the thereof, the Parties shall bear their own costs arising from the mediation and shall equally share the cost of the mediator and related costs. The mediator and the Parties shall, before the commencement of the mediation, agree on a scale of fees on the mediator's fees will be based.
- 26.4. The Parties shall appoint a mediator within 21 days of agreeing to mediate.
- 26.5. On appointment of the mediator the Parties shall jointly decide on the procedure to be followed, representation, dates and venue for the mediation.
- 26.6. If the Dispute or any part thereof remains unresolved it may be resolved by litigation proceedings
- 26.7. Notwithstanding anything else herein contained to the contrary, it is agreed that irrespective of the fact that the dispute is referred to negotiations, mediation or litigation in court, the decision of the Employer on the dispute involved will immediately be given effect to be the Services Provider and the Service Provider shall proceed with the Services with diligence unless the Parties agree otherwise in writing.

GENERAL

27.1. This is the entire Contract between the Parties and may only be amended if reduced to writing signed by the duly authorized representatives of both Parties, where after such amendments will take effect.

- 1.1 This Contract shall be valid for a period of thirty six (36) months commencing from the date of the letter of acceptance (DPW07EC) of this Bid and may be extended for a further period not exceeding twelve (12) months, on the same conditions contained herein. If NO written extension is given the contract will conclude.
- 1.2 This is a fixed scheduled priced contract and no price adjustment of whatever nature, except for the reduction or increase in the Value-Added Tax, shall be applicable to this contract.
- 1.3 Should the Contract be renewed for a further period of 12 months the same conditions contained herein shall apply.

Payment shall be as set out in clauses herein.

3. SCOPE OF CONTRACT

- 6.1 This contract is for the maintenance/repairs as per schedule 1in properties, namely Official Quarters, Living Quarters and Messes in Military, Correctional Services and South African Police Services Bases, Prestige, State Owned Buildings, State Owned Housing, etc. as well as certain hired buildings and structures falling under the control of the Department or other departments hereafter referred to as "User" Departments.

The work included in such new contracts will automatically be excluded from the contract.

- 6.4 The Department reserves the right if required to employ any other contractor for any project in any region or area. The Department reserves the right to allocate works/projects/orders to successful Bidders in any area with the aim to spread the assignments between them.

Thus, the successful Bidder do not have the right to all projects/works/orders in the region it bided for.

- The Department will not appoint the same Service Provider for more than two areas per discipline. (Depending on the successful bids received and range of bids in the estimations of the area) This will be done in the interest of spreading work between more service providers. The Department will only appoint the same Service Provider with more than two areas per discipline in the case where there is a shortfall of successful bidders.

8. RATES and PRICES

All rates tendered by the Bidder for items in this document shall include for additional costs, if any that may occur as a result of these Special Conditions of Contract as well as for the supply of normal equipment and everything necessary for the proper performance of the work. Estimated quantities given cannot be guaranteed to be entrusted to the Bidder to whom this contract has been awarded.

8.2 Unit rates entered into the Schedule 2 of Quantities:

- 8.2.1 shall be representative of the actual cost involved in the execution thereof plus a reasonable mark-up and should be valid whether the work associated therewith will be carried out once only or more frequently, costing to include the possibility that the emergency work to go into overtime as this cannot be claimed later.

- 10.6 Carry out repairs during normal working hours and emergency repairs during weekend and public holidays when required.

11. ACCESS CARDS TO SECURITY AREAS

- 11.1 Should the work fall within a security area, the Bidder shall obtain, either from the S.A. National Defence Force, S.A. Police or User Department, access cards for his personnel and employees who work within such an area.
- 11.2 The Bidder shall comply with any regulations or instructions issued from time to time, concerning the safety of persons and property, by the S.A. National Defence Force, Correctional Services, S.A. Police Service, Prestige or Ministerial complexes.

Only South Africa Identity Documents will be accepted on site.

12. SECURITY CHECK ON PERSONNEL

- 12.1 The Department or the Chief of the South Africa National Defence Force, or the Commissioner of the South Africa Police Service may require the Bidder to have his personnel or a certain number of them security classified.
- 12.2 In the event of either the Department, the Chief of South Africa National Defence Force or the Commissioner of the South Africa Police Service requesting the removal of a person or persons from the site for security reasons, the Bidder shall do so forthwith and the Bidder shall thereafter ensure that such person or persons are denied access to the site and/or to any documents or information relating to the work.
- 12.3 Only South Africa Identity Document will be accepted on site.

13. TRAINED STAFF

- 13.1 The Bidder shall use competent trained staff directly employed and supervised by himself.
- 13.2 All Technician's/Artisan's certificates of qualification and apprenticeship contracts shall be submitted with the tender for evaluation by this Department.
- 13.3 By not complying with this clause the tender shall not be taken in consideration and shall or could lead to disqualification.

- 13.4 Bidders shall satisfy the Department in all respects that their Electricians/Technicians are suitably qualified to carry out the specified repairs covered by this contract.
- 13.5 Bidders are to note that the equipment to be repaired under this contract is of utmost strategic importance to the Department and full proof of the Bidders ability to satisfactorily perform the repairs and servicing is necessary. The Bidder's premises will be inspected for plant, equipment and general good management before contracts are awarded.

14. DRESS CODE

- 14.1 The following dress code must be adhered to at all times by all workers:
- 14.2 Workers must have a <u>COMPANY WORK SUIT</u> with the company logo on it.
- 14.3 Must have clear identification tags with name number and a photograph openly displayed with the company logo as background.
- 14.4 The dress code must adhere to the OHSA in terms of protection for all workers for this Particular service.
- 14.5 Failure to adhere to the above criteria will result in the workers not gaining entry to any site for this particular service

15. MATERIAL OF EQUAL QUALITY

- 15.1 New parts, components and material used shall be of equal specification and shall match the existing item that is being replaced. Only genuine parts are acceptable to the Department and the use of pirate parts will not be allowed. New parts, components and material shall conform to SANS 9001.
- 15.2 Parts will be installed and connected to the supplier's specification.
- 15.3 The Bidder shall submit to the Department any suppliers or factory guarantee of repaired or replaced components together with his invoice and shall ensure that such guarantees are not jeopardised in any way. All new parts, components and material used in this contract shall be guaranteed for a period of at least 12 months.
- 15.4 The serial numbers of original and new components such as motors, compressors etc., <u>shall</u> be entered on job cards and invoices submitted for payment.
- NOTE: The Department reserves the right to instruct the Bidder to mark by stencilling or engraving any new part or component of an installation with the complaint number for the repair at his own cost. The marking shall be in a conspicuous place and not spoil the appearance or cause any damage to the part or component.

16. REDUNDANT MATERIAL, RUBBISH AND WASTE

All rubbish and waste shall be removed from the site by the Bidder and the plant rooms shall be kept in a clean and neat condition. The Bidder will be required to submit pictures of the redundant/waste material upon request.

17. FRAUDULENT CONDUCT

17.1 Fraudulent conduct shall mean any conduct aimed at obtaining an unjust profit and/or intentional poor quality of work and submitting of inflated, false or incorrect Invoices, fictitious Suppler Invoices or any contravention of the National Treasury Regulations

18. EXECUTION OF REPAIRS

- The Contractor shall, in the event of repairs or replacements becoming necessary, submit a Technical report with an estimate of the cost of the work concerned to the Regional Representative and on receipt of instructions to that effect put the work in hand. The technical report must be supported with photos to give an indication of the repairs required and include a motivation for replacement of parts.
- The sole purpose of the estimate is to determine the magnitude of the repair and shall not be treated as a firm and final price. The Contractor shall be bound to the labour rates and the price per suppliers invoice plus mark-up in the case of non-scheduled items in this contract. Should the Contractor find that the final cost will be higher than the estimated cost, the Contractor shall obtain a written instruction from the Regional Representative before continuing with the work.
- 18.3 The Regional Representative reserves the right to execute such repairs and replacements with his own staff or by any other means.
- 18.4 If the Contractor fails to respond within the time limits as stated above, the Department should have the right to appoint any other third party to do the work without further notification to the Contractor. The additional costs, if any for such work, executed by the third party, will be for the account of the Contractor.
- **18.4.1** NOTE: RESPONSE TIME: The Contractor shall commence with repair work within 24 hours after receipt of an instruction and immediately in the case of emergency repairs in accordance with clause 21 of this contract.

MANAGEMENT AND EXECUTION OF WORK The Successful Bidder undertakes to:

- 19.1 Provide the Department with a list of names of his representatives / agents who will be responsible for the management and execution of the work at the individual buildings / areas covered by this contract. Seven (7) days after letter of acceptance date, failing to do so will be in Breach of the contract and may lead to termination of this contract.
- 19.2 Arrange with the occupants of buildings regarding access to the premises in order to execute the required service.
- 19.3 Take adequate precautions to prevent damage to buildings, to fittings and furnishing inside the premises and elsewhere on site:
- 19.4 Accept liability and indemnifies the Department against any claims whatsoever arising from his conduct and/or the conduct of his employees.

- 19.5 Safeguard all his employees in accordance with the regulations of the Unemployment Insurance Act 1966, (Act No. 30 of 1966) and any amendments thereof;
- 19.6 Provide qualified artisan(s) to carry out any emergency repair work on a 24 hours basis, including week-ends and public holidays.
- 19.7 Perform maintenance, servicing and repair work during normal working hours and overtime will only be approved as permitted by the Department Representative.
- 19.8 Make suitable arrangements regarding the signing of job cards / Ebis forms with the respective client/user departments. It must be noted that no extra time will be allowed or paid for this exercise and NO invoice will be paid without the original required signed documents. It is also required from the Bidder to sign time in and out in register to be found with the User Department on site.
- 19.9 It is strongly recommended to take as many photos necessary of the work in progress and submit with invoicing as supporting evidence of works performed.
- 19.10 It is of the utmost importance that the contractor whilst working or repairing any Works at any of the Air Force Landing strips, the necessary clearance and reflective protection clothing and demarcating is done before any work is commenced and completed.
- 19.11 Only Authorised specialised services may be sub-contracted.

20. OFFICIAL INSTRUCTION FOR REPAIRS

- 20.1 An official instruction for each repair shall be issued to the Bidder. <u>The Bidder may not accept any instruction from the User Department and/or its employer, or enter into any negotiations with the User Department in regard to any work to be done.</u>
- 20.2 Instructions for repairs may only be issued to Bidders by officials of this Department. For each repair the complaint number issued for that repair as well as details regarding the defects shall be given to the Bidder in writing. If the Bidder has facsimile facilities, the instruction will be faxed or emailed to him. The Bidder shall not proceed with any work without an official instruction.
- 20.3 No payments shall be made for work executed without the necessary written authority.
- 20.4 Payments will be delayed and invoices returned if order numbers and complaint numbers do not appear on invoices submitted for payment.

21. EMERGENCY REPAIRS

- For purposes of this Bid document emergency services shall mean work which, in the opinion of the Department, must be carried out without any undue delay, notwithstanding that it may have to be done during normal working hours, Saturday, Sunday and Public Holidays, within time frames as above.
 - 21.2 Emergency repairs after hours may be executed with only receipt of an official complaint (CPT) number and only on the telephonic instruction of the Control Works Manager of this Department.
 - 21.3 The Bidder shall however ensure that the official of the User Department signs the job card. The Bidder shall also ensure that he obtains the official instruction from the Department on the following working day. No payment will be made without a complaint number, official instruction and duly completed and signed job card.

21.4 Only breakdowns which affect public health or the operation and safety of sensitive equipment (Refrigeration, Fresh Water Pumps, Sewerage Pumps, IT Equipment in Laboratories, Access Control, power failure to complexes and buildings, security related defects, etc.) shall be treated as emergency repairs. Breakdowns involving personal comfort will not be considered as emergency repairs unless authorised as such by the Regional Representative of this Department.

22. JOB CARDS ("M" FORMS) FOR REPAIRS

- 22.1 The Bidder must provide his own supply of Job Cards in accordance with the example included herein.
- 22.2 Job Cards shall be completed in all respects for each and every repair work.

 Complete job card for each and every day the service is rendered to be submitted to the Respective Works Manager. Job cards will indicate "job still in progress" and the final job card will indicate "job completed". This job card with Job completed must be faxed/e-mailed the same day to the Departmental Representative, copy left with the client Department and all original Job Cards to be submitted with invoice for payment.
- 22.3 The Job Card must be completed legibly in black ink after completion of each repair.

 All columns of section (1) one and (2) two on the job card shall be completed by the Bidder and all un-used portions/lines of section (2) two shall be deleted and counter signed by the responsible representative of the User Department, who will also sign-off the Job Card Section Three (3) pertains. Black ink shall be used in this regard.
- 22.4 Only the artisan who executed the repair work may sign the job card and submit it to the User Department for signature.
- 22.5 In addition to the Original Completed Job Card submitted with the account, the Bidder must submit a copy of the completed Job Card to the User Department for audit purposes and retain a third copy for his official records.
- 22.6 Failure to comply with the above could delay payment.
- 22.7 In the event where the User Department do not have an official date stamp, the onus is on the Bidder to see that the client sign and date in the allocated block on the job card. (No job card will be accepted should the above not be completed)
- 22.8 No Photocopied Job Cards will be accepted under any circumstances with invoicing.
- 22.9 Having blank or incomplete Job cards signed by the client departments before or after work is completed is deemed to be of a fraudulent nature and is in breach of this contract and can and will lead to the cancellation of the contract
- 22.10 The Job Card must be signed by the User Department immediately after the work has been completed, not days/weeks/months thereafter.
- 22.10.1 NOTE: All job cards (hours spent) are to be completed on site. The use of correctional fluid will not be allowed on any documentation.
- 23. SUBMISSION OF SUPPLIER'S INVOICES (NON SCHEDULED REPAIRS)
- 23.1 Bidders shall submit a certified copy of the supplier's tax invoice (SAPS certified), attached to their accounts in respect of non-scheduled items purchased for such repairs.
- 23.2 Descriptions like "1 x compressor" or "1 x wire" are not acceptable and will lead to the delay of payments. The full description that is essential to order such an item from a supplier, i.e. make, model, serial number, size, capacity, etc. shall be listed on the account.

- 23.3 A separate invoice for each repair shall be submitted. Only invoices from registered and approved suppliers/dealers for the respective equipment/items/parts must be supplied.
- 23.4 The suppliers invoice must comply with the following criteria, which will be deemed acceptable to the Department;
 - 23.4.1 Must be on a Company Letter Head;
 - 23.4.2 The words 'tax invoice' in a prominent place;
 - 23.4.3 The name, address and registration number of the supplier;
 - 23.4.4 The name and address of the recipient;
 - 23.4.5 An individual serialized invoice number and the date upon which the tax invoice is issued;
 - 23.4.6 Description of the goods or services supplied;
 - 23.4.7 The quantity or volume of the goods or services supplied;
 - 23.4.8 Either:
 - 23.4.8.1 The value of the supply, the amount of tax charged and the consideration for the supply; or
 - 23.4.8.2 Where the amount of tax charged is calculated by applying the tax fraction to the consideration, the consideration for the supply and either the amount of the tax charged, or a statement that it includes a charge in respect of the tax and the rate at which the tax was charged.
- 23.5 Prices must be clear with no corrections; no Correction ink may and must not be used on any documentation.
- 23.6 The supplier's address and contact details must be clear and current (contactable)
- 23.7 The items listed on the supplier's invoice must be related to the service in question and correlate with items claimed for on job card.
- 23.8 Failure to comply with the above will result in non-payment or a delay to this particular Payment.
- 23.9 The Department reserve the right to scrutinize all supplier's invoices, prices for items supplied and services rendered shall be market related.

24. INVOICES FROM BIDDER

- 24.1 Invoices for services rendered, must be accompanied by Original Job Cards, official instruction and suppliers invoices for non-scheduled items claimed for. The price for each item on the job card shall be cross referenced with the applicable price for similar items in the original Bid document by means of the page and item numbers e.g. 2.2 (page 2, item 2
- 24.2 The following information is required on the layout of an invoice:
 - 24.2.1 Invoice must be on company's letterhead;
 - 24.2.2 Invoice must be addressed to DPW;
 - 24.2.3 Invoice must have invoice date and number;
 - 24.2.4 If charge for VAT, invoice must indicate "TAX INVOICE" and company's VAT registration number must appear on invoice;
 - 24.2.5 Invoice must provide, address of Client Dept. where and what service was rendered;
 - 24.2.6 CPT reference and order numbers must appear on invoice;
 - 24.2.7 Full description of work been carried out;

24.2.8 The name and email address of the respective Works Manager handling the specific service.

24.3 Services to equipment:

- 24.3.1 Services are not compulsory
- 24.3.2 Services can be cancelled at the Department's discretion.
- 24.3.3 Services can only be executed on the receiving of a call centre complaint from the Regional Representative.
- 24.3.4 Services completed without call centre complaint will not be paid by the Department
- 24.3.5 The Department will not pay services requested by our Clients to the Contractor and attended by the Contractor without DPW Official.
- 24.3.6 Where major work, extensive repairs, replacement of equipment or where there is damage to facilities or equipment; the contractor shall include photos of the entire repair process with the invoice that is from the first inspection to the completion of the work.

25. PAYMENT TO CONTRACTORS

- 25.1 Invoices can be submitted weekly or monthly, but it is requested from the Bidders to submit invoices frequently not later than 30 days after completion of a job.
- 25.2 Should the late submitting of invoices frequently occur without valid reason the Department will have the right to terminate the contract.
- 25.3 Bidders are also urge to submit all outstanding invoices within six (6) months after completion of this contract.
- 25.4 The irregular and non-compliant submission of invoices in respect of completed work shall be taken into account in the assessment of a Bidder's overall performance.
- 25.5 Payment of invoices complying with all the requirements will be made within 30 days after official departmental receipt of correct invoices.
- 25.5.1 NOTE: Any errors made by the Bidder, intentionally or unintentionally in the compilation of the job cards and for accounts discovered at a later stage, shall be rectified and the over payment recovered by the Department.
- 25.5.1.1 The Contractor may not proceed with any new work/repairs unless all invoices pertaining to prior work/repairs done to, or in respect of the same facility/installation/components have been duly submitted to the Department for payment.

26. PROFIT ON MATERIAL

26.1 Percentage mark-up is allowed on non-scheduled material only and shall be the percentage as rated in schedule two. The total discount obtained from the supplier shall be credited to the Department. The percentage mark-up shall then be calculated on the total discount price excluding VAT. The mark-up ceiling shall not exceed 20%.

27. HOURS OF WORK

The Bidder shall undertake to carry out the repair/servicing during normal working hours, UNLESS PRIOR arrangements for working outside normal working hours have been requested by the User Department and approved by this Department. Such work done outside normal working hours shall be claimed as per labour scheduled rate in Schedule Two, on non-schedule items only.

29. EXECUTION OF WORK BY OTHERS

29.1 Although this Bid includes day-to-day repairs to all State Owned Buildings under the jurisdiction of this Department, the respective User Departments who are responsible for minor repairs, reserves the right to carry out such minor repairs by others.

30. RESTRICTION ON THE USE OF LABOUR

- Where possible and practical Bidders are to make allowance for on-site training of un-skilled basic mechanical/Plumbing work.
- 30.2 All work on this contract is to be carried out with hand labour where possible by workers recruited from the local area. Wage rates are to be negotiated with the local civics and chiefs of the relevant area (tribal communities).
- 30.3 The Department may request the contractor to supply a detailed list of all employed casual workers.

31. MARKING OF EQUIPMENT

31.1 The Bidder shall permanently mark all new installations serviced under this contract. The number on each installation shall be unique, issued by the Department and stamped on a metal plate and pop riveted to the installation. The marking shall be in a conspicuous position, but shall not deface the appearance of the installation. Where equipment is already marked with inventory numbers, such will be used and recorded.

32. SUBMISSION OF PROGRESS REPORTS

32.1 The Bidder shall be required to provide the Department with a progress report on a weekly basis of all services that are in progress and of those completed. The progress report shall include the status of each job i.e. "completed" or in "progress" as well the completion date or expected completion date and reasons for delay. The progress report can either be submitted individually to each respective Works Manager or as one report with a breakdown highlighting each Works Manager's work. The progress reports must be submitted every Friday or the preceding day if it falls on a public holiday. Job Cards for completed work should also be scanned and emailed to the respective works managers on a weekly basis.

33. Department of Public Works and Infrastructure Call Centre

33.1 The Department has a Department of Public Works and Infrastructure Call Centre in place which deals with all unplanned and terms contracts complaints. These complaints are subjected to close times which are linked to this contract in respect of the times frames to react to the required service delivery. The successful Bidder shall comply with these times frames and report close calls (service completed) on a weekly basis as above.

34 IMPORTANT NOTICE

- 34.1 THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER WILL BE SUBJECTED TO POSITIVE SECURITY CLEARANCE
- 35. ASSOCIATED ELECTRICAL WORK
- 35.1 The Contractor may be required to undertake repairs to electrical work associated with control systems, starters, motors and engine protection equipment including power conductors.
- NOTE: All such work shall be carried out by, or under the supervision of a Licensed Electrician only and all work done shall comply with the Standard Wiring Regulations, S.A.B.S. 0142, as well as the Department's Standard Specification for Electrical Equipment and Installations for Mechanical Services, Issue VIII, 1984.

 All electrical work falls within the scope of this document and is the responsibility on the main contractor.

1. PREAMBLE

In terms of Construction Regulation 5(1)(a) of the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993), the Department of Public Works, as the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf, shall be responsible to prepare a baseline risk assessment for an intended construction work project. In terms of construction regulations 5(1)(b), the client must prepare a suitable, sufficiently documented and coherent site specific Health & Safety Specifications for any intended construction project and provide any Principal Contractor who is making a bid or appointed to perform construction work for the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf with the same.

The Client's further duties are as described in The Act and the Regulations made there-under. The Principal Contractor shall be responsible for the Health & Safety Policy for the site in terms of Section 7 of the Act and in line with Construction Regulation 5 as well as the Health and Safety Plan for the project.

This 'Health and Safety Specifications' document is governed by the "Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act No. 85 of 1993), hereinafter referred to as 'The Act'. Notwithstanding this, cognisance should be taken of the fact that no single Act or its set of Regulations can be read in isolation. Furthermore, although the definition of Health and Safety Specifications stipulates 'a documented specification of all health and safety requirements pertaining to associated works on a construction site, so as to ensure the health and safety of persons', it is required that the entire scope of the Labour legislation, including the Basic Conditions of Employment Act be considered as part of the legal compliance system. With reference to this specification document this requirement is limited to all health, safety and environmental issues pertaining to the site of the project as referred to here-in. Despite the foregoing it is reiterated that environmental management shall receive due attention.



Due to the wide scope and definition of construction work, every construction activity and site will be different, and circumstances and conditions may change even on a daily basis. Therefore, due caution is to be taken by the Principal Contractor when drafting the Health and Safety Plan based on these Health and Safety Specifications. Prior to drafting the Health and Safety Plan, and in consideration of the information contained here-in, the contractor shall set up a Risk Assessment Program to identify and determine the scope and details of any risk associated with any hazard at the construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard. This Risk Assessment and the steps identified will be the basis or point of departure for the Health and Safety Plan. The Health and Safety Plan shall include documented 'Methods of Statement' (see definitions under Construction Regulations) detailing the key activities to be performed in order to reduce as far as practicable, the hazards identified in the Risk Assessment.

The Department of Public Works is tasked to provide accommodation and operational facilities to a very large proportion of the approximate 40 National Departments responsible for the governance of the Department of Public Works. A very large number of State employees and public users of the facilities and the services provided there-in directly interacts with the facilities provided by the well-being, health and safety of a great number of people. This Department thus has directly or indirectly, an impact on the Republic of South Africa as well as the National Parliament.

In this a high premium is to be placed on the health and safety of the most valuable assets of the Department of Public Works. These are its personnel, the personnel of its Clients and the physical assets of which it is the custodian and may also include the public as well. The responsibilities the Department and relevant stakeholders have toward its employees and other people present in the facilities or on the sites are captured further in this specification document. These responsibilities stem from both moral, civil and a variety of legal obligations. The Principal Contractor is to take due cognisance of the above statement.

Every effort has been made to ensure that this specification document is accurate and adequate in all respects. Should it however, contain any errors or omissions they may not be considered as grounds for claims under the contract for additional reimbursement or extension of time, or relieve the Principal Contractor from his responsibilities and accountability in respect of the project to which this specification document pertains. Any such inaccuracies, inconsistencies and/or inadequacies must immediately be brought to the attention of the Agent and/or Client.

2. SCOPE OF HEALTH AND SAFETY SPECIFICATION DOCUMENT

These Specifications should be read in conjunction with the Act, the Construction Regulations and all other Regulations and Safety Standards which were or will be promulgated under the Act or incorporated into the Act and be in force or come into force during the effective duration of the project. The stipulations in this specification, as well as those contained in all other documentation pertaining to the project, including contract documentation and technical specifications shall not be interpreted, in any way whatsoever, to countermand or nullify any stipulation of the Act, Regulations and Safety Standards which are promulgated under, or incorporated into the Act.

3. PURPOSE

The Department is obligated to implement measures to ensure the health and safety of all people and properties affected under its custodianship or contractual commitments, and is further obligated to monitor that these measures are structured and applied according to the requirements of these Health and Safety Specifications. (All references to the singular shall also be regarded as references to the plural)

The purpose of this specification document is to provide the relevant Principal Contractor (and his /her contractor) with any information other than the standard conditions pertaining to construction sites which might affect the health and safety of persons at work and the health and safety of persons in connection with the use of plant and machinery; and to protect persons other than persons at work against hazards to

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health and safety arising out of or in connection with the activities of persons at work during the carrying out of construction work for the Department of Public Works. The Principal Contractor (and his /her contractor) is to be briefed on the significant health and safety aspects of the project and to be provided with information and requirements on inter alia:

- a) Safety considerations affecting the site of the project and its environment;
- b) Health and safety aspects of the associated structures and equipment;
- Submissions on health and safety matters required from the Principal Contractor (and his /her contractor); and
- d) The Principal Contractor's (and his /her contractor) health & safety plan.

To serve to ensure that the Principal Contractor (and his /her contractor) is fully aware of what is expected from him/her with regard to the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act No. 85 of 1993) and the Regulations made there-under including the applicable safety standards, and in particular in terms of Section 7 and 8 of the Act, Construction regulations 7 and 8.

To inform the Principal Contractor that the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993 (Act 85 of 1993) in its entirety shall apply to the contract to which this specification document applies. The Construction Regulations promulgated on 07 February 2014 shall apply to any person involved in construction work pertaining to this project, as will the Act.



4. DEFINITIONS - The most important definitions in the Act and Regulations pertaining this specification document are hereby extracted.

to

"Purpose of the Act" -

To provide for the health and safety of persons at work and the health and safety of persons in connection with the use of plant and machinery; the protection of persons other than persons at work against hazards to health and safety arising out of or in connection with the activities of persons at work; to establish an advisory council for occupational health and safety; and to provide for matters connected therewith.

"Agent" –

means any person who acts as a representative for a client:

"Client" -

means any person for whom construction work is performed;

"Construction Work" is defined as any work in connection with -

- (a) The construction, erection, alteration, renovation, repair, demolition or dismantling of or addition to a building or any similar structure; or
- (b) the construction, erection, maintenance, demolition or dismantling of any bridge, dam canal, road, railway, runway, runway, sewer or water reticulation system; or the moving of earth, clearing or land, the making of excavation, piling or any similar civil engineering structure or type of work;

"Construction work permit"

means a document issued in terms of construction regulations 3

"Contractor" -

means an employer, as defined in Section 1 of the Act, who performs construction work and includes Principal Contractors;

"Health and Safety File" -

means a file, or other record in permanent form, containing the information required a contemplated in the regulations;

"Health and Safety Plan" -

means a documented plan which addresses hazards identified and includes safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;

"Health and Safety Specification" -

means a documented specification of all health and safety requirements pertaining to the associated works on a construction site, so as to ensure the health and safety of persons;



"Method Statement" -

means a document detailing the key activities to be performed in order to reduce as reasonably as practicable the hazards identified in any risk assessment;

"Principal Contractor" -

means an employer, as defined in section 1 of the Act who performs construction work and is appointed by the client to be in overall control and management of a part of or the whole of a construction site;

"Risk Assessment" -

means a program to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard.

5. OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY MANAGEMENT

5.1 Structure and Organization of OH&S Responsibilities

5.1.1. Overall Supervision and Responsibility for OH&S

- * The Client and/or its Agent on its behalf to ensure that the Principal Contractor, appointed in terms of Construction Regulation 5(5), implements and maintains the agreed and approved H&S Plan. Failure on the part of the Client or Agent to comply with this requirement will not relieve the Principal Contractor from any one or more of his/her duties under the Act and Regulations.
- * The Chief Executive Officer of the Principal Contractor in terms of Section 16 (1) of the Act to ensure that the Employer (as defined in the Act) complies with the Act. The pro forma Legal Compliance Audit may be used for this purpose by the Principal Contractor or his/her appointed contractor.
- * All OH&S Act (85 /1993), Section 16 (2) appointee/s as detailed in his/her/their respective appointment forms to regularly, in writing, report to their principals on matters of health and safety per routine and ad hoc inspections and on any deviations as soon as observed, regardless of whether the observation was made during any routine or ad hoc inspection and to ensure that the reports are made available to the principal Contractor to become part of site records (Health & Safety File).
- * The Construction Manager and Assistant Construction Manager appointed in terms of Construction Regulation 8(1), 8(2) to regularly, in writing, report to their principals on matters of health and safety per routine and ad hoc inspections and on any deviations as soon as observed, regardless of whether the observation was made during any routine or ad hoc inspection and to ensure that the reports are made available to the principal Contractor to become part of site records (Health & Safety File).
- * All Health and Safety Representatives (SHE-Reps) shall act and report as per Section 18 of the Act

5.1.2. Further (Specific) Supervision Responsibilities for OH&S



Several appointments or designations of responsible and /or competent people in specific areas of construction work are required by the Act and Regulations. The following competent appointments, where applicable, in terms of the Construction Regulations are required to ensure compliance to the Act, Regulations and Safety Standards.

This list may be used as a reference or tool to determine which components of the Act and Regulations would be applicable to a particular site, as was intended under paragraph 3 & 4 of the Chapter "Preamble" (page 4) above. This list must not be assumed to be exclusive or comprehensive.

5.2 Communication & Liaison

- 5.2.1 OH&S Liaison between the Employer, the Principal Contractor, the other Contractors, the Designer and other concerned parties shall be through the H&S Committee as per the procedures determined by the H&S Committee.
- 5.2.2 In addition to the above, communication may be directly to the Client or his appointed Agent, verbally or in writing, as and when the need arises.

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- 5.2.3 Consultation with the workforce on OH&S matters will be through their Supervisors and H&S Representatives ('SHE Reps')
- 5.2.4 The Principal Contractor will be responsible for the dissemination of all relevant OH&S information to the other Contractors e.g. design changes agreed with the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf and the Designer, instructions by the Client and/or his/her agent, exchange of information between Contractors, the reporting of hazardous/dangerous conditions/situations etc.

INTERPRETATION

- (i) The Occupational Health and Safety Act and all its Regulations, with the exception of the Construction Regulations, distinguish between the roles, responsibilities and functions of employers and employees respectively. It views consultants and contractors as employees of the "owner" of a construction or operational project, the "owner" being regarded as the employer. Only if formally agreed to by way of the written agreement in this regard between the "owner(s)" and consultant and /or between the "owner(s)" and the contractor(s), will these assumptions be relinquished in favour of the position agreed upon between the relevant parties.
- (ii) The position taken by the Construction Regulations is that the "owner", in terms of its instructions, operates (has to operate) in the role of client as per relevant definition. The contractors working for the "client" are seen to be in two categories, i.e. the Principal Contractor and Contractors. The Principal Contractor has to take full responsibility for the health and safety on the site of the relevant project / contract. This includes monitoring health and safety conditions and overseeing administrative measures required by the Construction Regulations from all contractors on the project site. (Ordinary / sub) Contractors are required to operate under the scrutiny and control (in terms of all health and safety measures which are covered in the Construction Regulations) of the Principal Contractor. Where, for the work the Principal Contractor will have to execute himself, practical health and safety measures are applicable, he will also be subject to the relevant requirements with which (ordinary / sub) Contractors have to comply. The Principal Contractor will, however, not have to actually fulfill such requirements in respect of any of the work / functions of any (ordinary / sub) Contractors on the site for which he has been appointed as Principal Contractor. However, he has to monitor / oversee such processes, ensuring that the requirements are complied with and that the required appointments / evaluations / inspections / assessments and tests are done and that the records are duly generated and kept as prescribed in the Construction Regulations. This has to feature clearly in the Principal Contractor's Health and Safety Plan.

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RESPONSIBILITIES

7.1 Client

- 7.1.1 The Client or his appointed Agent on his behalf will appoint each Principal Contractor for this project or phase/section of the project in writing for assuming the role of Principal Contractor as intended by the Construction Regulations and determined by the Bills of Quantities.
- 7.1.2 The Client or his appointed Agent on his behalf shall discuss and negotiate with the Principal Contractor the contents of the health and safety plan of the both Principal Contractor and Contractor for approval.
- 7.1.3 The Client or his appointed Agent on his behalf, will take reasonable steps to ensure that the health and safety plan of both the Principal Contractor and Contractor is implemented and maintained. The steps taken will include periodic audits at intervals of at least once every month.
- 7.1.4 The Client or his appointed Agent on his behalf, will prevent the Principal Contractor and/or the Contractor from commencing or continuing with construction work should the Principal Contractor and/or the Contractor at any stage in the execution of the works be found to:
 - have failed to have complied with any of the administrative measures required by the Construction Regulations in preparation for the construction project or any physical preparations necessary in terms of the Act;
 - have failed to implement or maintain their health and safety plan;
 - have executed construction work which is not in accordance with their health and safety plan; or
 - act in any way which may pose a threat to the health and safety of any person(s) present on the site of the works or in its vicinity, irrespective of him/them being employed or legitimately on the site of the works or in its vicinity.

7.2 Principal Contractor

- 7.2.1 The Principal Contractor shall accept the appointment under the terms and Conditions of Contract. The Principal Contractor shall sign and agree to those terms and conditions and shall, before commencing work, notify the Department of Labour of the intended construction work in terms of Regulation 3 of the Construction Regulations. Annexure B of this Specification contains a "Notification of Construction Work" form. The Principal Contractor shall submit the notification in writing prior to commencement of work and inform the Client or his Agent accordingly.
- 7.2.2 The Principal Contractor shall ensure that he is fully conversant with the requirements of this Specification and all relevant health and safety legislation. This Specification is not intended to supersede the Act nor the Construction Regulations or any part of either. Those sections of the Act and the Construction Regulations which apply to the scope of work to be performed by the Principal Contractor in terms of this contract (entirely or in part) will continue to be legally required of the Principal Contractor to comply with. The Principal Contractor will in no manner or means be absolved from the responsibility to comply with all applicable sections of the Act, the Construction Regulations or any Regulations proclaimed under the Act or which may perceivable be applicable to this contract.
- 7.2.3 The Principal Contractor shall provide and demonstrate to the Client a suitable and sufficiently documented health and safety plan based on this Specification, the Act and the Construction Regulations, which shall be applied from the date of commencement of and for the duration of execution of the works. This plan shall, as appendices, include the health and safety plans of all Sub-contractors for which he has to take responsibility in terms of this contract.



7.2.4 The Principal Contractor shall provide proof of his registration and good standing with the Compensation Fund or with a licensed compensation insurer prior to commencement with the works.

- 7.2.5 The Potential Principal Contractor shall, in submitting his tender, demonstrate that he has made provision for the cost of compliance with the specified health and safety requirements, the Act and Construction Regulations. (Note: This shall have to be contained in the conditions of tender upon which a tenderer's offer is based.)
- 7.2.6 The Principal Contractor shall consistently demonstrate his competence and the adequacy of his resources to perform the duties imposed on the Principal Contractor in terms of this Specification, the Act and the Construction Regulations.
- 7.2.7 The Principal Contractor shall ensure that a copy of his health and safety plan is available on site and is presented upon request to the Client, an Inspector, Employee or Sub-contractor.
- 7.2.8 The Principal Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file, which shall include all documentation required in terms of the provisions of this Specification, the Act and the Construction Regulations, is opened and kept on site and made available to the Client or Inspector upon request. Upon completion of the works, the Principal Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Client.
- 7.2.9 The Principal Contractor shall, throughout execution of the contract, ensure that all conditions imposed on his Sub-contractors in terms of the Act and the Construction Regulations are complied with as if they were the Principal Contractor.
- 7.2.10 The Principal Contractor shall from time to time evaluate the relevance of the Health and Safety Plan and revise the same as required, following which revised plan shall be submitted to the Client and/or his/her Agent for approval.
- 7.3 **Contractor** (Responsibilities of in terms of this contract and health and safety specification)

As per 7.2 above, as and where applicable or as indicated in the letter of appointment.

8.SCOPE OF WORK (also refer to paragraph 2 on page 5)

These specifications are applicable to the specific scope of work pertaining to the above-mentioned project as detailed in the tender documents, this amongst all includes for example:

"Phase 1 – Refurbishment of existing houses & outbuildings for Library information services consisting of elaborate audio visual aids and facilities including auditoriums.

- Site clearance (what does this entail?)
- Site hoarding, demarcation and demolition as follows:
- Bulk Earthworks comprising...(excavations, filling, compaction, evening surface.....)
- Piling (by drilling, excavating....pile driving...pile hammering...????)

Phase 2 – Construction of a new four (4) storied Administration building.

- Preparation of site by leveling, compaction etc.
- Excavations for parking areas/services
- Etc."

(elaborate sufficiently and provide adequate information to give full understanding of all work to be done)

[Notes to the Client, Designer, Project Manager, Architect, Agent:

add references to the above project and include specific elements identified as the 'Critical Few'. The 'Critical Few' refer to those few or singular elements of the project that have the potential to impact in a major



or devastating way on the project as a whole in the event of an accident or incident occurring. (20:80 principle)

Because of the inherent generic nature of the Health and Safety Specifications document, specific relevant information on the project must be provided and it may be necessary to draft the required information under this paragraph on a separate attached document.

If at any time after commencement of the project changes are brought about to the design or construction, sufficient health and safety information and appropriate resources are to be made available to the Principal Contractor to execute the work safely.]

N.B Construction Regulation 5(1)(g) determines that potential contractors submitting tenders have made provision for the cost of health and safety measures during the construction process. The Principal Contractor shall on tendering make provision for the cost of health and safety measures in terms of his/her documented Health and Safety Plan and measures based on these Health and Safety Specifications during the period of the project. The cost shall be duly quantified and clearly identified for such identifiable purpose.

THE HEALTH AND SAFETY PLAN IS THEREFORE TO BE INCLUDED WITH THE TENDER DOCUMENTS WHEN TENDERS ARE INVITED FOR THE PROJECT.

9. HEALTH AND SAFETY FILE

The Principal Contractor must, in terms of Construction Regulation 7(1)(b), keep a Health & Safety File on site at all times that must include all documentation required in terms of the Act and Regulations and must also include a list of all Contractors on site that are accountable to the Principal Contractor and the agreements between the parties and details of work being done. A more detailed list of documents and other legal requirements that must be kept in the Health and Safety File is attached as an addendum to this document.

IMPORTANT:

The Health and Safety File will remain the property of the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf throughout the period of the project and shall be consolidated and handed over to the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf at the time of completion of the project.

10. OH&S GOALS AND OBJECTIVES AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR MONITORING AND REVIEWING OH&S PERFORMANCE

The Principal Contractor is required to maintain an acceptable disabling incident frequency rate (DIFR) and report on this to the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf on a monthly basis.

11. IDENTIFICATION OF HAZARDS AND DEVELOPMENT OF RISK ASSESSMENTS, STANDARD WORKING PROCEDURES (SWP) AND METHOD STATEMENTS

The Principal Contractor is required to develop Risk Assessments, Standard Working Procedures (SWP) and Method Statements for each activity executed in the contract or project (see 4. below "Project/Site Specific Requirements")

The identification of hazards is over and above the hazards identification programme and those hazards identified during the drafting of the Health and Safety Plan.

12. ARRANGEMENTS FOR MONITORING AND REVIEW

12.1 Monthly Audit by Client and/or its Agent on its behalf

The Client and/or its Agent on its behalf will be conducting Periodic Audits at times agreed with the Principal Contractor Audit to comply with Construction Regulation 7(1)(c)(vii) to ensure that the principal contractor has implemented, is adhering to and is maintaining the agreed and approved OH&S Plan.

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12.2 Other audits and inspections by client and/or its agent on its behalf.

The Client and/or its Agent on its behalf reserves the right to conduct any other ad hoc audits and inspections as it and/or its Agent on its behalf deem necessary.

A representative of the Principal Contractor and the relevant Health and Safety Representative(s) (SHE-Reps) must accompany the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf on all Audits and Inspections and may conduct their own audit/inspection at the same time. Each party will, however, take responsibility for the results of his/her own audit/inspection results. The Client and/or its Agent on its behalf may require to be handed a copy of the minutes of the previous Health and Safety Committee meeting reflecting possible recommendations made by that committee to the Employer for reference purposes.

12.3 Reports

- 12.3.1 The Principal Contractor shall report all incidents where an employee is injured on duty to the extent that he/she:
 - * dies
 - * becomes unconscious
 - * loses a limb or part of a limb
 - * is injured or becomes ill to such a degree that he/she is likely either to die or to suffer a permanent physical defect or likely to be unable for a period of at least 14 days either to work or continue with the activity for which he/she was usually employed

OR where:

- * a major incident occurred
- * the health or safety of any person was endangered
- * where a dangerous substance was spilled
- * the uncontrolled release of any substance under pressure took place
- machinery or any part of machinery fractured or failed resulting in flying, falling or uncontrolled moving objects
- machinery ran out of control,

to the Provincial Director of the Department of Labour within seven days and at the same time to the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf.

Refer in this regard to Section 24 of the Act & General Administrative Regulation 8.

- 12.3.2 The Principal Contractor is required to provide the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf with copies of all statutory reports required in terms of the Act and the Regulations.
- 12.3.3 The Principal Contractor is required to provide the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf with a monthly "SHE Risk Management Report".
- 12.3.4 The Principal Contractor is required to provide a.s.a.p. the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf with copies of all internal and external accident/incident investigation reports including the reports contemplated in 12.7, 12.8.2, 15, 16, 17, 21 and 22 below. As soon as the occurrence of any accident/incident of whatever nature comes to the notice of the Principal Contractor, it shall be reported immediately to the relevant Regional Manager for that particular jurisdiction.
- 12.4 Review

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The Principal Contractor is to review the Hazard Identification, Risk Assessments and Standard Work Processes at each Production Planning and Progress Report meeting as the construction work develops and progresses and each time changes are made to the designs, plans and construction methods and processes.

The Principal Contractor must provide the Client and/or its Agent on its behalf, other Contractors and all other concerned parties with copies of any changes, alterations or amendments as contemplated in the above paragraph.

12.5 Site Rules and other Restrictions

12.5.1 Site OH&S Rules

The Principal Contractor must develop a set of site-specific OH&S rules that will be applied to regulate the Health and Safety Plan and associated aspects of the construction.

When required for a site by law, visitors and non-employees upon entering the site shall be issued with the proper Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as and when necessary.

12.5.2 Security Arrangements

The Principal Contractor must establish site access rules and implement and maintain these throughout the construction period. Access control must include the rule that non-employees shall at all times be provided with fulltime supervision while on site.

The Principal Contractor must develop a set of Security rules and procedures and maintain these throughout the construction period.

If not already tasked to the H&S Officer appointed in terms of Construction Regulation 6(6), the Principal Contractor must appoint a competent Emergency Controller who must develop contingency plans for any emergency that may arise on site as indicated by the risk assessments. These must include a monthly practice/testing programme for the plans e.g. January: trench collapse, February: flooding etc. and practiced/tested with all persons on site at the time, participating.

12.6 Training

The contents and syllabi of all training required by the Act and Regulations including any other related or relevant training as required must be included in the Principal Contractor's Health and Safety Plan and Health and Safety File.

12.6.1 General Induction Training

All employees of the Principal and other Contractors must be in possession of proof of General Induction training

12.6.2 Site Specific Induction Training

All employees of the Principal and other Contractors must be in possession of Site Specific Occupational Health and Safety Induction or other qualifying training.

12.6.3 Other Training

All operators, drivers and users of construction vehicles, mobile plant and other equipment must be in possession of valid proof of training.

All employees in jobs requiring training in terms of the Act and Regulations must be in possession of valid proof of training as follows:



Occupational Health and Safety Training Requirements: (as required by the Construction Regulations and as indicated by the Health and Safety Specification Document & the Risk Assessment/s and recommendations by the Health and Safety Committee):

- General Induction (Section 8 of the Act)
- * Site/Job Specific Induction (also visitors) (Sections 8 & 9 of the Act)
- * Site/Project Manager
- * Construction Supervisor
- * OH&S Representatives (Section 18 (3) of the Act)
- * Training of the Appointees indicated in 12.6.1 & 12.6.2 above
- * Operation of Cranes (Driven Machinery Regulations 18 (11)
- * Operators & Drivers of Construction Vehicles & Mobile Plant (Construction Regulation 23)
- * Basic Fire Prevention & Protection (Environmental Regulations 9 and Construction Regulation 29)
- * As a minimum basic First Aid to be upgraded when necessary (General Safety Regulations 3)
- * Storekeeping Methods & Safe Stacking (Construction Regulation 28)
- * Emergency, Security and Fire coordinator

12.7 Accident and Incident Investigation

The Principal Contractor is responsible to oversee the investigation of all accidents/incidents where employees and non-employees were injured to the extent that he/she/they had to receive first aid or be referred for medical treatment by a doctor, hospital or clinic. (General Administrative Regulation 9)

The results of the investigation to be entered into the Accident/Incident Register listed above. (General Administrative Regulation 9)

The Principal Contractor is responsible for the investigation of all non-injury incidents as described in Section 24 (1) (b) & (c) of the Act and keeping a record of the results of such investigations including the steps taken to prevent similar incidents in future.

The Principal Contractor is responsible for the investigation of all road traffic accidents relating to the construction site and keeping a record of the results of such investigations including the steps taken to prevent similar accidents in future.

Notwithstanding the requirements of Section 24 of the Act, ALL incidents shall be investigated and reported on in writing, irrespective of whether such incident gave rise to injury or damage.

12.8 H&S Representatives (SHE-Reps – 'safety, health & environment') and H&S Committees

12.8.1 Designation of H&S Representatives('SHE - Reps')

Where the Principal Contractor employs more that 20 persons (including the employees of other Contractors (sub-contractors) he has to appoint one H&S Representatives for every 50 employees or part thereof. (Section 17 of the Act and General Administrative Regulation 6. & 7.)

H&S Representatives have to be designated in writing and the designation shall be in accordance with the Collective Agreement as concluded between the parties as is required in terms of General Administration Regulation 6.

12.8.2 Duties and Functions of the H&S Representatives

The Principal Contractor must ensure that the designated H&S Representatives conduct at least a weekly inspection of their respective areas of responsibility using a checklist and report thereon to the Principal Contractor, after which these reports shall be consolidated for submission to the Health and Safety Committee.

H&S Representatives must be included in and be part of accident/incident investigations.

H&S Representatives shall be members of at least one H&S Committee and must attend all meetings of that H&S committee.

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12.8.3 Establishment of H&S Committee(s)

The Principal Contractor must establish H&S Committees consisting of designated H&S Representatives together with a number of Employers Representatives appointed as per Section 19(3) that are not allowed to exceed the number of H&S Representatives on the committee. The persons nominated by the employer on a H&S Committee must be designated in writing for such period as may be determined by him. The H&S Committee shall co-opt advisory (temporary) members and determine the procedures of the meetings including the chairmanship.

The H&S Committee must meet minimum monthly and consider, at least, the following Agenda for the first meeting. Thereafter the H&S Committee shall determine its own procedures as per the previous paragraph.


