In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

#### **General Conditions of Contract**

#### 1. Definitions

- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. **"Contract price"** means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. **"Corrupt practice"** means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. **"Countervailing duties"** are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6. "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. **"Force majeure"** means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13. **"Fraudulent practice"** means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15. **"Goods"** means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.



- 1.16. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17. **"Local content"** means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18. **"Manufacture"** means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19. **"Order"** means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. "Project site" where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22. "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24. "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25. "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

#### 2. Application

- 2.1. These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2. Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3. Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

#### 3. General

- 3.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2. With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

# 4. Standards

4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

# 5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be

Any reference to words "Bid" or Bidder" herein and/or in any other documentation shall be construed to have the same meaning as the words "Tenderr" or "Tenderer".

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Effective date 02 August 2010

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- made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

# 6. Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

#### 7. Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3. The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
  - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
  - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4. The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

#### 8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1. All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2. If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3. If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4. If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5. Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.



- 8.6. Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7. Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8. The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

#### 9. Packing

- 9.1. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2. The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

## 10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1. Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2. Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

#### 11. Insurance

11.1. The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

## 12. Transportation

12.1. Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

### 13. Incidental services

- 13.1. The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
  - (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
  - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
  - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
  - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and

Any reference to words "Bid" or Bidder" herein and/or in any other documentation shall be construed to have the same meaning as the words "Tender" or "Tenderer".

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- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2. Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

#### 14. Spare parts

- 14.1. As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:
  - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
  - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
    - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
    - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

#### 15. Warranty

- 15.1. The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2. This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3. The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5. If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

# 16. Payment

- 16.1. The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2. The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3. Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4. Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

### 17. Prices



17.1. Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

## 18. Contract amendments

18.1. No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

# 19. Assignment

19.1. The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

#### 20. Subcontracts

20.1. The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

## 21. Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1. Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2. If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3. No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4. The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- 21.5. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

#### 22. Penalties

22.1. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

#### 23. Termination for default

23.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:



- (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
- (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2. In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period of not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.
- Any restriction on any person by the Accounting Officer/ Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer/ Authority, also be applicable to any enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer/ Authority actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish The National Treasury, with the following information:
  - The name and address of the supplier and/or person restricted by the purchaser;
  - ii) The date of commencement of the restriction
  - iii) The period of the restriction; and
  - iv) The reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a count of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the pubic sector for a period not less than five years and not more than ten years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

### 24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1. When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.



## 25. Force Majeure

- 25.1. Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2. If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

#### 26. Termination for insolvency

26.1. The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

## 27. Settlement of Disputes

- 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in Connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.
- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of the procedure specified in the SCC.
- 27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
  - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under contract unless they Otherwise agree; and
  - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

# 28. Limitation of Liability

- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;
  - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss 12 or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
  - (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

Any reference to words "Bid" or Bidder" herein and/or in any other documentation shall be construed to have the same meaning as the words "Tender" or "Tenderer".

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### 29. Governing language

29.1. The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

#### 30. Applicable law

30.1. The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

#### 31. Notices

- 31.1. Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2. The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

#### 32. Taxes and duties

- 32.1. A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2. A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3. No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African

## 33. National Industrial Participation Programme (NIPP)

33.1 The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

# 34. Prohibition of Restrictive Practices

- In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding (or bid rigging).
- 34.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.
- 34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.

### 3. CONDITIONS

### A. Personnel

### 1) Labour Requirements

The contractor is to appoint a minimum of 1 (one) groundsman

The contractor shall ensure the stipulated staff quota on site to execute tasks on a regular work day basis; with no diverting of allocated groundsman to any other work.

The stipulated staff is a minimum, and in the event that the there is an inability to complete work in the time frames specified, the contractor will be responsible for additional resources as required to meet the specified obligations at no additional costs to the department.

All officials on site shall be in their safety clothing (continental suit and safety shoes) at all times while on duty they shall be presentable and clearly identifiable, non-compliance will result in the official being immediately removed from site by project manager or delegated official.

### 2) Labour Relations

For appointment of groundsman, service providers are to adhere to Basic Conditions of Employment Act No.75 of 1997 Sectoral Determination1: Contract Cleaners of South Africa.

The above Determination shall be used in conjunction with all other relevant legislation and labour laws of the Republic of South Africa.

Service providers may be asked to produce required documents at any point in the contract for all officials working on the client premises.

### 3) Service Times

The service shall be limited to a 45 hour work week between Monday to Friday.



### **B.** Administration

### 1) Transport

The service provider shall include the transportation costs for refuse removal; travel to service site for labour, equipment, material and site meetings with project manager. The quoted costs must cover the duration of the contract period.

### C. Supply of Resources and Storage

### 1) Supply of Equipment and Materials

The contractor shall be responsible for the supply and maintenance of equipment and materials required for providing of the service at the required standard and department has the right to accept or reject any of these items.

Equipment used for any part of the service shall comply with regulations of machinery as stipulated in the Occupational Health and safety Act (Act 85 of 1993).

The department can where possible provide storage space for storage of equipment free of charge to the contractor.

Should there be an unavailability of space, then the contractor will be required to remove their equipment from the site.

The department has the right to inspect the allocated space and upon discretion cancel the arrangement.

### 2) Consumables

The contractor is at own cost responsible for supply of all consumable items (including plastic refuse bags and toilet paper) that are necessary for the supplying of effective services.

The Department has the right to accept or reject any of these items.

### 3) Power and water supply

No electricity will be provided to the contractors for the operation of equipment. The department shall as available at existing points supply water for operational purposes to the contractor free of charge.

The contractor is to consult with the local municipality to establish the status of water restrictions and in the event that restrictions are in place they are to convey the information to the project manager within two (2) days.

In the event of water restrictions, the contractor may upon own discretion make its own arrangements in supplying water without the right of recourse against the department.

### D. Safety

### 1) Signage

The contractor is to supply neat warning signs which are to be of a size and design to be easily recognisable to the general public.

The signs are to be used wherever work is in progress, more especially hazardous work to alert all persons using the facility and surrounds.

The warning signs are to be made in English and another local language, and shall be used for the term of the contract.



### 2). Hazardous Chemicals and Tasks

The contractor shall not store or use poisons, flammable chemicals and materials on the property without the written consent of the department.

In the event that some tasks are deemed hazardous to the wellbeing of occupants as well as visitors to facility; such tasks will be avoided until the risk can be averted. Measures used to mitigate risk shall not pose further financial implication to the department.

### E. Service Responsibilities

The successful service provider must:

- i) Ensure that fair labour practices are complied with.
- ii) Indemnify, protect, defend and hold harmless the Department from and against any and all claims, demands, actions and proceedings whatsoever including all fees, costs and expenses incurred in respect thereof and arising out of:

### 4. SPECIFICATION

### A. Agricultural Remedies

### 1) Composting

Compost supplied is to be free of stones, disease/virus and weeds as well as odours that are regarded as noxious or pose nuisance, with a sample provided for approval by the project manager.

The compost shall be spread as a cover over the planting area/required area comprising of a layer 30mm, and shall not cause damage to plants.

The compost shall be dug into the soil to a depth of 250mm-300mm to mix thoroughly with the soil.

This is to be done at the request of the project manager, with intervals of twelve (12) months

### 2) Fertilizing

The contractor is to ensure that the area to be fertilized is watered before and after fertilizing sufficiently to avoid burning the plants.

### a) Granules

Granular controlled release or slow release fertilizer shall be applied at a rate of 30g per m<sup>2</sup> on the lawn every third (3<sup>rd</sup>) month.

### b) Pellets

An organic fertilizer (pellets) shall be applied 30g per m<sup>2</sup> for bedding plants every third (3<sup>rd</sup>) month.

### 3) Mulching

Mulch supplied will be bark chips 40mm-60mm for tree pits and 30mm-50mm for planting areas; it is to be free of stones, disease/virus and weeds and to the project manager's satisfaction.

The mulch shall be spread as a cover over the required area comprising of a layer 20mm at regular intervals of twelve (12) months and watered thoroughly.

The contractor shall avoid having the mulch touch up against the stems of any plants where possible.

### 4) Pest Control

### a) Vegetation

The weed shall be removed mechanically from the affected area, with no use of any herbicides.

### B. Miscellaneous

- 1) Hard Surfaces
- a) Sweeping

All hard surfaces and drainage channels shall be swept clean of all debris on a once (1) weekly basis or as required.

### 2) Lawn Maintenance

Supplementary horticultural practices shall be carried out once every twelve (12) months or at the project manager's discretion over all lawn areas.



After all maintenance work has been carried out the surface shall be well drenched with water

### a) Top-dressing

Medium shall be a mixture of compost and fine river sand free of stones and weeds. Top dressing shall be applied as a complete 10mm cover over the surface of lawn and levelled off to even out surfaces.

### b) Transplanting

All damaged areas on turf shall be replaced with sods or stolons of the same species and quality of turf as soon as they appear.

### 3) Refuse

The contractor will remove all refuse (this is to include all foreign objects such as paper, plastic, glass, stones, leaves) shall be collected and removed from site on a weekly basis.

• Refuse unattended beyond the stipulated time frame or not in refuse bags and not in refuse area shall be regarded as dumping.

All costs of refuse disposal at an approved municipal dump site shall be included in the quoted price.

Where refuse is stored on site for collection, it shall be out of site and not cause any nuisance, the contractor is to communicate with project manager as to areas which may be used for refuse storage.

• The refuse bins on site are at no point to be used for garden refuse unless provided by the service provider.

### 4) Tree Maintenance

### a) Staking

Trees shall be supported with an appropriate wooden stake(s) which shall be:

- 30mm-40mm wider than the stem girth, and tied with a rubber tie or wire strung through a hose to the approval of the project manager.
- Stakes are to be 10mm-15mm higher than the apex of the specimen
- The stake shall be sturdy enough to support the tree in heavy winds and ensure the tree is positioned straight in calmer days.
- The staking shall cause no harm to the tree at any point, and the trees will be inspected once every month, although the contractor will remedy any stakes coming undone as soon as they appear.

### b) Tree Pits/Basins

Tree pits shall be maintained at 300mm around trunk/stem around the younger trees and 70mm-100mm deep, the soil around the stem shall not form a mound around stem and roots shall not be exposed unnecessarily.

Mulch shall be spread in the basin as a cover of 20mm-40mm.

### c) Tree Replacement

In the event where trees need to be replaced due to negligence on the contractor's part, this shall be recorded and communicated with the project manager as to approve of the specie, condition and size of the tree to be replaced.



### 5) Mowing

A single mowing cycle shall comprise of mowing, edging, raking all grassed surfaces on the facility and removal of the clippings from the mown areas.

The areas described as "wild grass" and "lawn" will be communicated between service provider and project manager on site.

All foreign objects shall be removed from the turf before starting operation.

The blades of the turf are to be cut at a height of 10mm-20mm using only a rotary mower with a grass collection box fitted to it, only in the event that the lawn is not reasonably level, or it would be steeply sloped and impractical to use a wheeled lawn mowers to ensure even cut will there be consideration of other implements.

This height stipulation may be altered due to specie requirements

The turf shall be cut at regular intervals of once (1) every week from the period 1 September to 30 April, and once (1) every second (2<sup>nd</sup>) week from 1 May to 31 August.

The edges shall be neatly trimmed in conjunction with the mowing programme using a line to keep the edges straight in sections requiring so.

The equipment used in edging shall be limited to equipment ensuring even, neat and vertical edges avoiding the widening of gaps along sidewalks, bedding or roads.

Clippings may not remain on mown surface overnight and shall be removed on the same day of operation.

All areas to be cut are to be cut within three (3) days of beginning the mowing cycle. The grassed area shall be maintained to the satisfaction of the project manager.

Equipment used in the mowing programme shall be in good working condition to give a professional cut.

An acceptable lawn shall be free of ridges, have an even surface, no lines and clippings. The service provider shall ensure sufficient and suitable implements so as to keep within time frames of the task.

Should the need for additional resources to carry out the task arise to keep within the time frames, the service provider shall ensure contractual obligations are achieved at no additional cost to the department.

The proposed intervals will be reviewed as per growth rate and prevailing weather conditions dictate and are to be communicated with project manager on an ongoing basis.

### 6) Pruning

The plants shall be pruned in accordance to season and plant species.

Healthy plants are not to be cut unless otherwise instructed by the project manager. The equipment used is to be in good working condition with sharp blades and sterilized so as to be free of pathogens.

All refuse generated from the pruning shall be removed from site immediately after operation.

Broken and dead branches shall be pruned as soon as they are noticed.



The contractor shall communicate with the project manager before, to avoid excessive pruning of plants which shall be carried out once (1) every three (3) months.

### a) Bedding

Shrubs and perennials with vigorous growth shall be pruned to maintain good shape and encourage growth.

### b) Trees

All trees growing on the property which are accessible with a pole pruner or equivalent implement, not in excess of height of 5 m and a diameter of 40 mm, shall be maintained by the contractor to display a good quality specimen which shall have the following traits:

- Single main stem growing from the ground.
- Depending on the size, the lower 25-40% shall be free of lateral branches.
- No multi stems or water shoots arising from the soil shall be accepted and are to be pruned as soon as they emerge.

All trees requiring pruning shall be done so as not to damage property and furthermore the specimen itself.

The pruned appendage shall not:

- Have jagged edges
- Tears in the bark
- Die back from improper pruning technique
- Disease from improper pruning and subs standard equipment.

The pruned appendages shall be treated immediately with a sealant or approved solution to prevent exposure of the wound to disease and virus. The solution shall be applied as per the product label.

Palm trees where present are to be pruned so as to produce a "V" shaped crown and remove all the dead fronds as close as possible to the trunk.

### 7) Plant Maintenance

### a) Planting

Plants provided shall be kept in good condition until such time as they are planted, after which they shall form part of the maintenance contract and cared for accordingly.

Plant material for new areas and changing of annual plants; shall not include the replacing of plants which have died due to negligence of the service provider; such instance shall be remedied at the service providers own expense.

Plants provided shall be to the requirements and approval of the project manager. Planting shall only be carried out at the project manager's request. Plants provided are to display

- Vigour in growth within bags
- Be free of pests and disease



- Bags are free of weeds and stones
- Specified size
- True to species

All areas for planting shall be demarcated and prepared beforehand with required fertilizers and composts with holes 70% larger than planting bag
All planting shall meet the time frames specified by the project manager for the duration of the contract.

### b) Transplanting

Plants requiring transplanting shall be done so as per their seasonal and specie requirements. The contractor shall communicate with the project manager before transplanting any plants. This shall form part of the contract agreement and carried out on a monthly basis when required.

Transplanting shall be carried out to control overgrowth, and bare patches where plants have died will need to be replaced with same/similar species included in the maintenance cost as part of the contract agreement.

Plants which have died due to negligence shall be replaced at contractors own cost. Specimens shall be to project manager's approval.

Bare and open patches shall be planted up as per the project manager's discretion.

### 8) Irrigation

Irrigation is to be done on lawn and bedding areas at regular intervals in addition with natural rainfall.

Care shall be taken so as to not over water lawn and bedding areas to create mud pools and excess run-off of water on the property, more especially after heavy rains.

### a) Bedding

The bedding areas are to be watered a minimum of once (1) a week the soil should be moist and not drenched, to a depth of 25mm-40mm below soil surface

### b) Lawn

The lawn is to be watered a minimum of once (1) a week, the soil should be moist and not drenched, to a depth of 10mm-15mm below soil surface.
