NOTES:

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions

- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. **"Contract"** means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. **"Contract price"** means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6. **"Country of origin"** means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. **"Force majeure"** means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13. **"Fraudulent practice"** means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15. **"Goods"** means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.



- 1.16. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17. "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18. **"Manufacture"** means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19. "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. "Project site" where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22. "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24. "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25. "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1. These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2. With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. Standards

4.1. The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be

- 5.2. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3. Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4. The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2. The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3. The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4. The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1. All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2. If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3. If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4. If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5. Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.

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- 8.6. Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7. Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8. The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1. The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2. The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1. Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2. Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

11.1. The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

12.1. Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

- 13.1. The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
 - (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
 - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and

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- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2. Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- 14.1. As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:
 - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
 - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1. The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2. This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3. The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4. Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5. If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1. The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2. The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3. Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4. Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17. Prices



17.1. Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Contract amendments

18.1. No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. Assignment

19.1. The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1. The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1. Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2. If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3. No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4. The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
- 21.5. Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6. Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1. Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

23.1. The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

Any reference to words "Bid" or Bidder" herein and/or in any other documentation shall be construed to have the same meaning as the words "Tender" or "Tenderer".

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- (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
- (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2. In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period of not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.
- Any restriction on any person by the Accounting Officer/ Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer/ Authority, also be applicable to any enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer/ Authority actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish The National Treasury, with the following information:
 - i) The name and address of the supplier and/or person restricted by the purchaser;
 - ii) The date of commencement of the restriction
 - iii) The period of the restriction; and
 - iv) The reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a count of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the pubic sector for a period not less than five years and not more than ten years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

24.1. When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

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25. Force Majeure

- 25.1. Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2. If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1. The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

- 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in Connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.
- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of the procedure specified in the SCC.
- 27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
 - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under contract unless they Otherwise agree; and
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. Limitation of Liability

- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6:
 - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss 12 or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
 - (b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

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29. Governing language

29.1. The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1. The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

31. Notices

- 31.1. Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2. The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

- 32.1. A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2. A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3. No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African

33. National Industrial Participation Programme (NIPP)

The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34. Prohibition of Restrictive Practices

- If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.

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1 Background

The purpose of this document is to provide requirement specification of Audio-Visual/Video Conference for 38 Church Square Building based on the Client's requirements

2 Current Infrastructure

Audio visual equipment should be provided to meet the functional requirements listed. All equipment should be of high quality specified and adequate to provide a high standard of functionality and simplicity of use.

Where possible equipment should comply with the existing standards/brands in use to ease integration, management and support.

- · Monitors Samsung Smart Signage
- Interfacing, Switching and Control Extron
- · Audio conferencing Bosch
- Video Conferencing Polycom
- Teleconferencing Polycom
- Microphones Beyerdynamic

The VC communications equipment must have support for all encryption standards. These requirements are not prescriptive, but consideration must be given to integration, especially for networked equipment e.g. Video Conferencing, existing skills, and uniformity of use for users.

3 Scope of work

3.1 Auditorium B07

- 2 x 75" UHD Displays Mounted next to each other in the front of the room, where one will have the ability to show content and the other Video when in a Video Conference. The one showing Content should be interactive. Two additional 55" FHD Displays will be used to extend the content to the audience in the back of the room.
- Provision for inputs from at least 4 HDMI devices e.g. Video Conferencing, DVD, DSTV (IP Based through a set top box or integrated with Display), and an inroom PC to allow high definition visual display with audio. The provide Switcher needs to have a minimum of 8 inputs and 6 outputs that will allow for matrix switching. Assume that all sources need to be extended over twisted pair to and from the rack.
- Provision for Laptops into the system via HDMI as well as VGA-A. This will be through an auto switching wall plated situated in the front of the room. We also require Apple Airplay or Windows Miracast for wireless content sharing flexibility. This device should allow multiple users to connect and up to four sources to be displayed simultaneously. This device should also have the functionality of an

- infinite whiteboard and annotation through both of the 75" displays in the front of the room. The content should be shareable to the far side through VC.
- IP Video Conferencing (FHD) system which is Standards based. Camera must be a PTZ FHD Camera with 12x Zoom capabilities. 2 cameras need to be provided for this room, one focussing on the speakers and the other on the audience. One should have the ability to present all above sources except DSTV through the VC System.
- Consideration must be given for improved audio through installation of a high-fidelity wall and ceiling mount speaker system. The ceiling mount speakers need to have a 170° dispersion because of the ceiling height, which is the same reason for the required 2 Flush mount ceiling mount Beamforming Microphone Array microphones. These microphones should not take up any inputs on the DSP which will leave 12 inputs available for the microphones, line level audio and future expansion. A lapel microphone should also be integrated that can facilitate voice lift, and a handheld mic for Q&A Sessions. These should also tie into a VC Call and audio recording.
- The system should be easy to use without training, which can be controlled from a 10" Touch panel, and the possibility of adding a wireless touch panel.
- We also require a 7" room booking appliances that can display a room's meeting information and availability and allow for booking from outside the auditorium. - The equipment of this room will be installed into the AV equipment rack, which should be supplied. This rack should be a 43U 1000 deep rack with all required blanking plates to close of the rack together with needed brush panels and patch panels. This rack will be the main AV rack into which the IPTV as well as the Resource Manager will be deployed. This will be deployed on the same floor as the auditorium, but in a different location.

3.2 Boardroom G-06 (22 Seater) - Projector

- Table top popups where both has been assembled with a VGA-A, HDMI and Mini DP fall through cables with RSA 3 pin power. We also require Apple Airplay or Windows Miracast for wireless content sharing flexibility. This device should allow multiple users to connect and up to four sources to be displayed simultaneously. This device should also have the functionality of an infinite whiteboard and annotation.
- IP Video Conferencing (FHD) system which is Standards based. Camera must be a PTZ FHD Camera with 4x Zoom capabilities.

- Consideration must be given for improved audio through installation of a high-fidelity wall and ceiling mount speaker system. A discussion system also need to be installed, and it needs to integrate into the VC system and facilitate camera tracking and recording.
- The system should be easy to use without training, which can be controlled from a 3.5" Touch panel built into the popup, and the possibility of adding a wireless touch panel.
- We also require a 7" room booking appliances that can display a room's meeting information and availability and allow for booking from outside the Boardroom.

3.3 Training Rooms B29 and B30

- These two training rooms are back to back with a room divider between them.

- Provision for inputs from at least 4 HDMI devices e.g. Video Conferencing, DVD, DSTV (IP Based through a set top box or integrated with Display 1 feed for both training rooms), and an in-room PC (Supplied by us 1 per training room) to allow high definition visual display with audio. The provide Switcher needs to have a minimum of 8 inputs and 6 outputs that will allow for matrix switching. Assume that all sources need to be extended over twisted pair to and from the rack.
- Other sources included the provision for Laptops into the system via HDMI as well as VGA-A. This will be through an auto switching wall plate situated in the front of the room. We also require Apple Airplay or Windows Miracast for wireless content sharing flexibility. This device should allow multiple users to connect and up to four sources to be displayed simultaneously. This device should also have the functionality of an infinite whiteboard and annotation, although interactivity is not a current requirement.
- Consideration must be given for improved audio through installation of a high-fidelity wall and ceiling mount speaker system. The ceiling mount speakers need to have a 170° dispersion because of the ceiling height, which is the same reason for the required 1 Flush mount ceiling mount Beamforming Microphone Array microphone per training room. These microphones should not take up any inputs on the DSP which will leave 12 inputs available for the microphones, line level audio and future expansion. One lapel Microphone (Per Training room) should also be integrated that can facilitate voice lift, and One Handheld mic (Per Training room) for Q&A Sessions.
- The system should be easy to use without training, which can be controlled from a 7" Touch panel, and the possibility of adding a wireless touch panel.
- A networkable Audio recorder should also be proposed.

3.4 Boardrooms Rooms G-021 / G-022 / G-023

- These Boardrooms must be provided with basic capability to support meetings, allow presentations and for teleconferencing, and one should be able to upgrade these rooms to video conferencing room by simply adding a camera if need be.
- Room G-022 needs to be designed with a WUXGA 5000Lumens Laser projector and screen (motorised in ceiling) suitable for the boardroom size with a 16:10 Aspect Ratio. The other 2 rooms can be designed to include all the same functionalities as indicated below, but with 65" UHD Monitors.
- These two 65" boardrooms (G-021 and G-023) however needs to be interactive collaborative boardrooms that should allow for Apple Airplay or Windows Miracast for wireless content sharing flexibility as well as a trusty HDMI connection for wireline simplicity. This device should allow multiple users to connect and up to four sources to be displayed simultaneously. This device should also have the functionality of an infinite whiteboard. The same wireless device need to be installed in the G-022 Boardroom, although interactivity is not yet a requirement.
- DSTV also needs to be available on these displays.
- The system should be easy to use without training, which can be controlled from an in-wall Keypad designed for handling common AV functions such as power, input switching, volume control, and Ethernet control of AV devices.
- SIP-Based IP Conference Phone with HD Voice and Noise-Block technology is needed.

3.5 Meeting Rooms 1-12 (16 Seats-P) / 2-12 (10 Seats-P) / 3-13 (10 Seats-P) / 4-12 (10 Seats-P) / 5-12 (6 Seats-P)

- These Meeting rooms must be provided with basic capability to support meetings, allow presentations and for teleconferencing, and one should be able to upgrade these rooms to video conferencing room by simply adding a camera if need be.
- Room 1-12 needs to be designed with a WUXGA 5000Lumens Laser projector and screen (motorised in ceiling) suitable for the boardroom size with a 16:10 Aspect Ratio. The other 4 rooms can be designed to include all the same functionalities as indicated below, but with 55" FHD Monitors.
- The remaining four 55" meeting rooms however need to be interactive collaborative meeting rooms that should allow for Apple Airplay or Windows Miracast for wireless content sharing flexibility as well as a trusty HDMI connection for wireline simplicity. This device should allow multiple users to connect and up to four sources to be displayed simultaneously. This device should also have the functionality of an infinite whiteboard. The same wireless device need to be installed in the G-022 Boardroom, although interactivity is not yet a requirement.
- DSTV also needs to be available on these displays.
- The system should be easy to use without training, which can be controlled from an in-wall Keypad designed for handling common AV functions such as power, input switching, volume control, and Ethernet control of AV devices.
- SIP-Based IP Conference Phone with HD Voice and Noise-Block technology is needed.

3.6 Video Conferencing Bridge

Overview

The Video Conferencing solution proposed should be a multi-platform conferencing system allowing for communication between the following:

- 1. All H.323 and SIP compliant VC endpoints. (Polycom, LifeSize etc.).
- 2. Laptops and computers equipped with camera and microphone.
- 3. Skype for Business and Lync.
- 4. Mobile devices such as tablets and smart phones.

- 5. Analog telephony systems
- 6. PBX

A Conference node is needed on premise. The conference node need to be managed by the management node, which needs to be owned and services by the proposed bidder. A SIP trunk will control the communication between the PBX and Conference node.

Network Requirements

There should be no limit to the amount of conferencing nodes that can be deployed. The conference node should be a virtual machine. This should be able to run on any of the following:

- 1. ESXI 4.1, 5.x and 6.x
- 2. Hyper-V
- 3. KVM Kernel based Virtual Machine
- 4. XEN

The requirements for the virtual machine is all dependent on the number of concurrent connections that are required. In this case the required amount will be 25 ports. The requirement for each port should not exceed 1 X CPU and 1GB of RAM.

Firewall Ports

The system should provide for two network interfaces. One will be public facing to communicate with the management node and the other will be facing the internal network. The conference will be placed in the DMZ to accommodate for the solution and maintain the security and control on the network. See Implementation Diagram for details.

The public facing IP will also serve as the main entry point for external parties connecting to the conference node via one of the above-mentioned platforms.

Encryption and Security

All communication links between the Management Node and Conferencing Nodes, and between Conferencing Nodes, should use an IPsec transport with the following settings:

- 256-bit AES-CBC for encryption
- SHA 512 hashing for integrity checking
- 4096 bit Diffie-Hellman modulus for key exchange.

No other ciphers, hashes or moduli are permitted.

Encrypted connections between conference nodes and endpoints should use:


- AES 128-bit encryption for media
- TLS for SIP call control
- SRTP for SIP media.
- H.235 for H.323 media

Web/Desktop/Mobile clients should use:

- HTTPS TLS for signalling
- DTLS and SRTMP (encrypted RTMP) for media

A digitally signed certificate should be loaded on the management node to identify and ensure a secure connection to the WEBRTC.

White Label Branding

This portal need to be custom branded according to Treasury requirements. Treasury will provide a web server with a DNS entry to allow for a custom landing page for users making use of the WebRTC, the Web server will have internet access for external parties to be able to connect.

Each Virtual meeting room should have the ability to be branded individually. This will only have an impact on the first person who connects to the virtual room. As the other parties join, the system will display the connected parties instead of the branding.

During a VC call a water mark need to be present showing the company's corporate branding.

A detailed document of the required artwork needed to white label the VC Platform needs to be submitted with the tender.

All hosting and licencing should be included for a 3-year period.

3.7 Central AV Resource Management Platform

We also need a resource management software platform that can provides access to usage data, create reports, and control the system from any computer on the LAN or WAN. The software should allow you to manage AV technology while effectively leveraging valuable help desk resources.

3.8 Room booking system

The room should be easy to book

This proposed solution should be a stand-alone system consists of elegantly-designed Scheduling Panels that connect directly to Microsoft Exchange, Office 365, or Google Calendar. Users can reserve rooms with a couple taps on the panel or from their mobile device. We should be able to customize the interface with the meeting options we need. Seeing that we want to deploy these in multiple locations, it is imperative that the proposed touch panels should have multiple mounting options, including on-wall, in-wall, as well as secure mounting to almost any flat surface, including glass or granite.

Scheduling Panels

The Scheduling Panels should not require any additional scheduling software or external processors to work. These panels should be Power over Ethernet and have bright red and green LEDs that make it easy to see if a room is occupied. These touch panels should come in 5", 7" and a 10" options.

Room Scheduling Analytics

Room scheduling touch panels should provide various reporting information that will allow us to analyze room usage, activity patterns, and occupancy trends. A Scheduling Activity file with room usage and meeting data can be downloaded concurrently from multiple touch panels. You can transform this readily-available information with data analytics tools to create powerful reports.

Room Occupancy Monitoring

All panels should have a digital input that can be connected to an occupancy sensor, which monitor room occupancy and, after a user-defined time, release the room back to available status. The Sensor for each room should be included in the offering. These sensors should provide exceptional coverage using ultrasonic and passive infrared detection technologies. This system should be able to be upgraded to enables smart connections between the in-room control devices and services to save valuable time by preparing the room for the participant prior to their arrival as well as allow all booking to be made through an Outlook Add-In.

3.9 IPTV

A Central IPTV headend needs to be installed that will have the following functionality.

- Ability to distribute content on a segregated VLAN
- Ability to provide multi format content or transcode any media to be distributed via standard multicast IP Protocol
- Ability to provide end to end management of end devices connected to the network to ensure compliance with the subscription licenses;
- Ability to also support encryption of the content thereby preventing unauthorized distribution or access;
- Ability to provide a centralized access portal for content management;
- Ability to provide an IP based setup box at requested projectors.
- Units must be controlled from a remote location;

- The solution should ideally have an application programming interface(API) that will allow treasury to access the system;
- It must be easy to use, manage and monitor using standard monitoring systems and tools.
- A set top box should be supplied for each area where DSTV is required.
- The head-end should cater for 6 transponder channel listings from DSTV.
