CALL FOR NOMINATIONS OF PERSONS TO SERVE ON THE BOARD OF THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT BOARD (CIDB)

The Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) is a Schedule 3A Government entity that reports to the Minister of Public Works and Infrastructure. It operates in terms of the Construction Industry Development Board Act, 2000 (Act No. 38 of 2000). The CIDB plays a significant role in promoting a regulatory and developmental framework that builds the state's construction delivery capability for social and economic benefits. The core mandate of the entity is to facilitate and promote the contribution of the construction industry to South Africa's economy and society.

Members of the Board of the CIDB are the Accounting Authority of the public entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act (Act No. 1 of 1999) and their primary role is to provide strategic oversight over the entity. The appointed Board members will execute the following functions – provide strategic guidance to the Chief Executive Officer and the entire executive management of the CIDB; ensure effective utilisation of resources; ensure compliance with legal and reporting requirements; approve and monitor compliance with CIDB regulations, policies and related prescripts; as well as promote best practices in relation standard and guidelines for various facets of the construction industry.

The Board members will serve for a period of three (3) years from the date of appointment by the Minister. In line with the Act, the Minister is required to re-appoint one third of the board members that are currently serving. All board members that are eligible for reappointment should apply through the nomination procedure outlined hereto.

The nominated persons shall be competent persons with experience and/or expertise in the construction industry, built environment and infrastructure development, infrastructure financing, construction health and safety, human capital development, corporate governance, management science, financial management, law, communications, marketing, international standards related to infrastructure and information communication technology.

The nominated persons are also expected to have knowledge of the needs and functions of various sectors within the industry. This includes organs of state regulating the construction industry; regulatory bodies in the built environment, scientific and professional institutions; construction industry voluntary associations; suppliers of building materials for infrastructure development and knowledge of the functions of the construction liaison office and other related community engagement structures.

Shortlisted nominees will be subjected to a screening process and any other compliance requirement, which will determine eligibility to continue as a Board member. In pursuit of transformational objectives, the Minister will take into cognizance geographical representation, race, gender, including consideration of women, youth and persons with disabilities in the appointment of the Board.

Nominations should be in writing on a prescribed form (accessible on the website) and must contain the following information:

- Full name(s), address, telephone number(s) and email address of the nominating person or organization.
- Full name(s), identity number, address, telephone number(s) and email address of the nominee.
- A typed motivation (maximum: 1 page and minimum font of 10) by the nominator stating reasons why they deem the nominees to be the best candidate to be appointed as one of the members of the Board of CIDB.

Documentation to be submitted:

- A short Curriculum Vitae of the applicant (maximum: 2 pages and minimum font of 10) covering the following areas: the applicant's full name(s), ID number, race, gender, residential and postal address, telephone numbers, qualifications, experience, knowledge and skills, as well as names and contact details of at least two references.
- Certified copies of qualifications and other related documents will be requested from shortlisted candidates.
- Due to large volume of responses anticipated, receipt of the nominations will be acknowledged through an automated response. Should one not receive this automated response they should call in on the number provided below to verify if their documents have been successfully transmitted.
- Correspondence will be entered into with shortlisted candidates only.
- Nominees who do not receive confirmation or feedback within six (6) weeks after the closing date should consider their nomination bids as unsuccessful.
- Nominations received after the closing date will not be considered.
- The Minister reserves the right not to make an appointment.
- Nominees should not have current membership of more than three (3) Boards, whether in the private or public sector.
- Nominees with foreign qualifications are obligated to attach the SAQA Certificate of Evaluation.

Nominators and nominees are to take notice of the conditions of board membership and disqualification criteria as stipulated under Section 6 and 7 of the CIDB Act, (No. 38 of 2000). Nominees are required to sign a declaration on the nominations form confirming that they have no conflict of interest in relation to their interest in being appointed to the CIDB Board and that they meet all the qualification criteria.

N.B. Those who submitted nominations between 01 November to 27 December 2025 must re-submit their nominations.
