The Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI) invites bids for the appointment of an Insurance Broker or Insurance Company to insure the movable assets (heritage collection) at Groote Schuur House/Museum for a short term period of one year. The insurance should cover the movable assets (Heritage Collection) on all risks basis (e.g. fire /peril/accidental loss and damage). It must be noted that the Groote Schuur House at present is not used as a residence but as the museum although it is not officially declared as a museum. The collection was declared Cultural Treasure.

2. DELIVERABLES AND TASKS

The House Contents Movable Assets (Heritage Collection): The contents of Groote Schuur House consist of two collections - Rhodes and the Groote Schuur Collection which includes items from the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure.

All the mentioned items are kept at this house. There are also unique features in the house, such as the Spanish leather panels from the 17th century on the walls of the drawing rooms and copies in wood of the Zimbabwe Bird on the bannisters of the main staircase. All the paneling, doors and floors are made in Burmese teak which is now an endangered species and which can only be replaced at considerable cost. The house has 35 rooms (not all furnished) and four lobbies.
