

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- National Department of Public Works hereby request the submission of quotation for the professional tree felling services of trees between the height
- Before quotation the Contractor will have to inspect the site before quotation to get the specific requirements for each tree to be cut.
- The Contractor shall be familiar with the standard practices to be adhered to when doing tree felling service.
- Reasonable care shall be taken to prevent injuries to people or damage to property by ensuring that:
- Equipment is properly managed, safety checks before the operation are done to ensure that they are in good working order and equipped with the required safety devices.
- Necessary warnings signs are displayed to inform the public of the potential.
- Contractor shall not cause damage to any existing property, including fencing during the operation otherwise they will be liable for the damage costs.
- Contractor shall demarcate/ cordon off the work area with hazard tape/ cones and or traffic signs.
- Contractor shall ensure that all equipment is in good operating order, free of oil and fuel tank and shall not produce smoke in excess of the regulations of the Environmental Conservation Act 73/1989.
- All branches and debris shall be neatly stacked so as not endanger or interfere with the public utilizing the facility.
- Ensure adequate holding wood approximately 15% of the diameter to maintain control of the tree when it is falling.
- Establish a good directional felling to prevent injury to the chainsaw operator, or damage to other trees and environmental area.



SITE CLEARING AT ERF 87 (LIBODE MAGISTRATE RESIDENCE)

1) SCOPE OF WORKS

- i) Cutting of trees
- ii) Treat all tree stumps after cutting. (Stumps to be less than 0,5m high. Make rings around stump and cut roots and treat immediately with chemical).
- iii) Cutting of shrubs with height of 3m and below.
- iv) Grass cutting
- v) Clear and removes all vegetation debris on site to the dumping site

2) SPECIFICATION

A. Removal of Trees

- Cutting and removal of trees and shrubs
- The trees which require removal shall be cut down to ground level in height of the stump (or manageable height in pieces which the contractor will be able to manage so as not to cause damage to property and or injured the personnel.

B. Treatment and Removal of Tree Stump

- The stump above shall be treated with an approved herbicide solution so as to retard/hinder future growth after cutting
- All stumps will need to be prepared beforehand for the application of the solution so as to make sure of its effectiveness as specified on the product label.
- Contractor shall send in a product label ahead of starting any of the work to project manager.
- The contractor shall ensure that persons working with chemicals are informed people, and if necessary the project manager may request certificates allowing applicators to handle chemicals from the contractor.
- Contractor shall exercise care to ensure that the herbicide does not spill unnecessarily onto the soil.



C. Removal of Refuse From Site

- All the debris/refuse accumulated from the project shall be removed from site
- Refuse may not remain on site over weekend and may not remain on site for longer than three days.
- All debris shall be disposed of at an approved disposal site within the time frames stipulated.
- All other debris will still be the contractor's responsibility to dispose of.

D. Use of Tools & Other Resources

- The contractor shall supply own labour, materials, transport and equipment to undertake the work from beginning to end.
- All the tools to be used shall make use of fuel (Two stroke petrol, for machines, etc.). There is no power / electricity available for use by contractor on site.

E. Occupational Health & Safety

It is the contractor's responsibility to ensure that the best industry practices are employed to ensure safety of all personnel working and using the site as well as prevent damage to equipment.

Bidder to provide a project plan/proposal of how they intend to complete all work as well as mitigating measure to be used.

Competency certificates to be included in work package.

No personnel shall be allowed to work on site without necessary protective clothing and equipment.

The following protective clothing/equipment is mandatory:

- i. Helmet (preferably with straps)
- ii. Suitable eye protection for work being carried out
- iii. Protective gloves
- iv. A respirator mask must be used for application of herbicide.
- v. Safety shoes

The area in which the contractor is working on shall be cordoned off to restrict access for unauthorized personnel (barrier tape may be used for this exercise).

Upon completion of work in the various areas, the contractor shall make safe the area in which they worked on before removing barricade.



F. Signage on Site

The following safety signs together with any other safety signs that may be deemed necessary on a construction site, shall be placed on the construction site where applicable

- Indicating "no unauthorized entry"
- Indicating the position of the first aid kit
- Indicating the position of the firefighting equipment (where applicable)
- 'No Smoking signs' (where applicable)

G. Conclusion

The Principal Contractor is required to comply with all the requirements of this specification. Should it be discovered during the initial stage that the contractor does not comply, the client or the client's representative may stop the site operations until the deviation has been rectified. This specification is done in accordance with the South African Legislations and is therefore binding. Where there is contradiction between the OHS Act or its Regulations and this specification, the OHS Act or its Regulations will take precedence.

H. Contractor's Liability

It is contractor's responsibility to ensure that correct methods are used when felling trees in order to prevent damage to adjoining property.

- Any damage to property resulting from the actions of the contractor or people under the employ of the company shall be rectified by the contractor at own expense.
- ii. Where such rectifications have not been made, the payment to render the services shall be held and the department may use any monies due to the contractor to make good of the damages.
- iii. Contactor must have liability insurance to cover the project from start to completion.

I. PAYMENT

Complete work will be constituted as work which adheres to all item listed in:

- Scope of works
- Occupational health & safety & Liability insurance

No payment shall be processed for:

i.Partially done/incomplete work

ii.Substandard work

iii. Work where the contractor has not followed the specification



J. Terms of Contract

The contractor shall have (20) day working days to complete all work, starting from date of which they are notified of their successful tender.

After (40) days the contract will be terminated and contractor will not be allowed back on site.

Another contractor will be appointed to carry out the work and paid at the defaulting contractor's expense.

In the event that the contractor has justifiable i.e. (rainfall, wind conditions and other factors) cause not to finish within reasonable time, the contractor may request in writing an extension from the project manager five days before the five day time frame elapses, late submission will be disregarded. For screening purposes the contractor to submit document with quotation.

General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions

- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. **"Contract price"** means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6. "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the is obtained.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. - 1.13. **"Fraudulent practice"** means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15. "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.



- 1.16. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17. "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18. "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19. "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. "Project site" where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22. "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.

- Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to 23.3 impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period of not exceeding 10 years.
- If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person with the supplier, the 23.4 supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fall to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

- 34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.
