1. Purpose

The purpose is to appoint a suitable and accredited training provider to deliver a Data and Records Management course for officials of the Department Public Works and Infrastructure, Cape Town Regional Office.

2. Background

Data and Records management is one of the critical aspects of any organisation. Officials must develop and improve their record and data management techniques and systems. The course targets officials dealing with records management in the Public Service, such as Administrators, Clerks and Supervisors. A total of 12 officials will be attending the training.

3. Learning Objectives

By the end of this course, delegates will be able to:

- Record and data management systems and the related processes
- Overview of the guidelines that relate to record and data management
- Record and data management: data, storage and retrieval aspects
- Planning a storage and retrieval system
- Implementing and maintaining a filing system
- Guidelines for retention and disposal of records
- Archiving and disposal of records
- Practical tips and templates for use at work
- Practical application to own work environment and related types of data that are worked with
- Good administrative practices and processes
- Using technology effectively for data management
- Quality Management Systems

3.1 The course must be set at a minimum NQF level 4 unit standard. On completion of the course, course delegates will awarded certificates of completion.

3.2 It is a requirement that all service providers facilitating any training must be accredited with a relevant Quality Assurance / SETA or Quality Council for Trades and Occupations (QCTO) body and must have a valid letter confirming such accreditation.

4. Training Methodology, Delivery and Duration

The methodology for the delivery of the course must include a combination of both theoretical and practical approaches. The course will be delivered through

a face-to-face classroom setup with appropriate case studies and practical exercises. A successful training provider must provide a training venue, learning material, computer resources and online access. The course duration is two days of class time.

- A comprehensive CV showing the facilitator's subject matter expertise in data and records management;

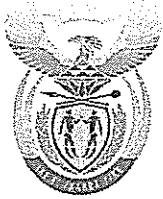
