



- 1. Fencing must be erected from 04:00 to 06h00 on Friday 03 February 2025 around City Hall. The fencing should be erected along the curb in Darling Street, right next to the City Hall and it should be at least 1.8 meters high.
- 2. The fence must go all along the yellow line on Corporation Street (where taxis park), and should cross Corporation street from the corner of Corporation and Longmarket to the large pillars next to the mutual building, and go down Longmarket Street from Corporation to Parade Street, along the curb of Parade Street back to Darling Street. The crossing in Corporation Street should also be equipped with a gate. Roeland Street and other streets. Fence layout will be provided to the successful service provider.
- It is kindly requested that all street fencing should be erected by Wednesday 05 February 2025 before 22:00.
- 4. Further to this, Parade Street must be fenced in with a gate closing at Darling Street and Longmarket Street. Fencing must run on the curb next to the library, running into the library next to the library entrance. The enclosed sidewalk next to the library will be used for OB trucks.
- In addition, the portion of the parking on the parade next to Darling Street must be fenced off, in order to be used for emergency vehicles, self-drive MP's and the vehicles of VIP's.






