“The Mpumalanga Division of the High Court is the most magnificent of them all”

When President Cyril Ramaphosa officially opened the Mpumalanga Division of the High Court earlier in November 2019, he said there were benefits to being the “last-born” (referring to the fact that Mpumalanga is the last province to receive its own high court). He said the 12-courtroom building was the most magnificent of them all, adding that it, however, came at a price.

The Mpumalanga Division of the High Court was constructed by the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure's entity, the Independent Development Trust (IDT). Before the official opening of the high court, Minister Patricia De Lille handed over a symbolic key to Justice and Correctional Services Minister Ronald Lamola and mentioned that what goes on inside the court was the responsibility of Minister Lamola. We open this issue with an article on the launch of an initiative by the Department in support of the fight against Gender-Based Violence. The initiative comes after Minister De Lille, on 18 September 2019, participating in the joint sitting of the National Assembly, made a commitment that DPWI would allocate unoccupied state-owned buildings for service delivery purposes, particularly providing shelter for GBV victims. MINISTERS JOIN HANDS TO FIGHT THE SCOURGE OF GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

To demonstrate that the South African government is committed to fight Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and also serious about providing safe spaces for women and children who are survivors of abuse, Public Works and Infrastructure Minister Patricia De Lille handed over a centre for women and children affected by GBV to Social Development Minister Lindiwe Zulu on 5 December 2019.

The centre in Salvokop, Pretoria previously catered for children who are survivors of abuse, but has since been expanded to also serve women who are survivors of the scourge. Handing over the centre, Minister De Lille spoke about the loss of her sister whom she revealed was a victim of GBV.

Other officials who attended the event are Salvokop councillor Fortune Mampuru and Deputy Minister for Women Hlengiwe Mkhize. During the event, a torch of peace was lit in remembrance of all those who have lost their lives due to Gender-Based Violence.



The DPWI is in the process of identifying more state-owned properties to be used by the Social Development Department as safe homes for the abused and in the coming months, more shelters will be provided in other parts of the country. The initiative is also part of the Emergency Response Plan on GBV and femicide in South Africa, as pronounced by President Cyril Ramaphosa.

DPWI also committed to using buildings and public spaces to erect billboards with anti-GBV messages targeted at men as part of the campaign to eradicate this social ill. In light of this, Minister De Lille and Minister Zulu also braved the rain to launch a billboard that has a message stating that violence and abuse were poison to society and urging everyone to 'make it stop.' The billboard also has a contact number that can be used by anyone facing abuse to get help.





MPUMALANGA DIVISION OF THE HIGH COURT USHERS FRESH LEGAL BREATH TO THE PROVINCE

“Government is really taking the dispensing of justice to a new level.” These were the words of Public Works and Infrastructure Minister Patricia De Lille, MP when handing over a symbolic key of the newly-built Mpumalanga Division of the High Court, to her Justice and Correctional Services counterpart Minister Ronald Lamola. The hand-over took place minutes before the Court was officially opened by President Cyril Ramaphosa in Mbombela, on 8 November 2019.

The Court, which was constructed by the DPWI entity the Independent Development Trust (IDT) - commenced with its functions in May this year and this signalled the end of an era where the people of Mpumalanga used to travel to other provinces for serious criminal offences and civil claims above the

jurisdiction of the Magistrates Courts. Residents now save time and money while accessing all legal rights.

Whistling and jubilant ululation filled the space when the State President cut a ribbon, officially declaring the Court functional, before doing a walkabout on the premises. Deputy Chief Justice of the Constitutional Court, Justice Sisi Khampepe, Judge President of the Mpumalanga Division of the High Court, Francis Legodi and Premier of Mpumalanga Hon. Refilwe Mtsweni-Tsipane were among the dignitaries who attended the official opening.

President Ramaphosa used his speech on the day to urge public service employees to protect the rights of South African citizens,

adding that the courts should not be used to fight battles where the state has degraded the rights of its people. "Our courts face significant resource challenges and are already burdened with huge caseloads and backlogs as they strive to uphold the rights of citizens. It should not be, indeed it should never be, that the resources of our courts are used to fight legal battles where local, provincial and national departments have failed to meet their obligations and responsibilities to our citizens," implored the President.



Welcoming the President and the new Project in the Province, Premier Refilwe Mtsweni-Tsipane said they were delighted to receive the High Court, adding that the people of Mpumalanga now had a fresh legal breath. She said, "Standing here today, on behalf of the people of Mpumalanga, we are indeed delighted to have our own court."



Judge President of the Mpumalanga Division of High Court Francis Legodi said that the wait for the court had been too long, adding that there was a time where he thought the building would be opened when he had retired. Legodi proceeded to assure everyone that the inside and outside of the building would reflect the inside and outside beauty of the people who work in it. He said, "These are the people who will know no tittle, position or status. These will be people who will see each other as equals."

He further pointed out that the oath that judicial officers take remains as an undertaking that they have made to the people of South Africa that says 'the judicial officer will exercise the judicial function without fear, favour or prejudice.'





MINISTER DE LILLE LAUNCHES THE 12TH GREEN BUILDING RATING TOOLS

Public Works and Infrastructure Minister Patricia De Lille says government is highly supportive of the green economy, adding that the transition to a green economy aims to redress the adverse impact of the energy and carbon intensive economy. She was speaking at the launch of the 12th Green Building Rating Tools for new and existing buildings at a Convention held from 2 to 4 October 2019 in Cape Town.

The Green Building Council develops the Green Star SA rating tools to provide an objective measurement for green buildings in South Africa and the African continent. These tools recognise and reward environmental leadership in the property industry. The Green Star tools are created for each building type and support design professionals and developers in creating a better built environment for the people and the planet.

The tools are based on 9 different categories, each with a range of credits that address environmental and sustainability aspects of designing, constructing and operating a building.

The introduction of Assessment Rating would contribute to the Global Sustainable Development Goals. The Public Works and Infrastructure Green Building Policy serves as a benchmark for National and Provincial Departments of DPWI. The development of the Green Building Rating Tools will be used in assessing buildings occupied by Government departments.

It is envisaged that the tools will recognise the economical imperatives of Government and develop collaboration with built environment stakeholders.

Minister De Lille, who, as a government minister, is head of the property development arm of the public sector said the Department was seeking the best way to build facilities and infrastructure for green outcomes.

“As a Department, we are committed to working with the Green Building Council to create green living spaces, a commitment that includes a three way partnership between the department, Agrément South Africa and the Green Building Council of South Africa”.

DEPUTY MINISTER APPEALS TO DPWI ENTITIES TO CONTINUE TACKLING INFRASTRUCTURE CHALLENGES

The Deputy Minister of the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure Noxolo Kiviet, MP has told the CEO's and Chairpersons of the DPWI entities that the department was counting on the entities' support, especially in the technical skills sphere. She met with the entities at the departmental headquarters in Pretoria on 3 October 2019, to discuss matters of the departmental implementation plan.

During the meeting, the entities; Agrément South Africa (ASA), the Independent Development Trust (IDT), the Council for the Built Environment (CBE) and the Construction Industry Development Board (cidb) - made presentations on their performance.

The Entities' performance report meeting is a meeting in which the Chief Executive Officers of the Department's public entities present their reports to the Accounting Officer in terms of their performances for the period under review and to comply with the Treasury Regulations and the Policy Framework on Public Entities. The Deputy Minister presides over these meetings quarterly. These meetings are on the Corporate Calendar of the Department.

The presentations covered areas which include non-financial (performance) report, financial report, governance matters, progress on the Audit Action Plan, invoices paid outside 30 days and areas for the Ministerial attention.

The Deputy Minister raised concerns on the following issues;

- **The Invoices paid outside 30 days.** She therefore requested a full report on unpaid invoices per entity, reflecting the

following:

- The reasons for non-payment.
- Categories of the invoices not paid i.e. Travelling, Supply Chain etc.
- Name of Service Providers not paid
- Age Analysis of the invoices

- **The Employment Equity Statistics of some of the Entities.**

The information reported on reflected no female representation in the high ranks of senior management and other management levels. The Deputy Minister requested the senior managers to correct this saying it was not acceptable and did not support transformation in the Construction Industry.

After the presentations were made, the Deputy Minister together with the Department's EXCO members and other senior managers provided comments and inputs on the presentations and advised on various methods that entities could adopt for better service delivery. She also urged the entities to continue to be effective and make an impact when helping the department tackle infrastructure challenges.

“As we are all here, let's all work together and continue to engage and positively influence each other by collaborating our efforts and break the habit of working in silos. The department is counting on your support, especially in the technical skills sphere. Implementing is key as we are working to change our image as a department and claim our mandate,” clarified the DM.


