# THORNHILL FARMS COMMUNAL PROPERTY TRUST RECEIVES TITLE DEEDS

The 25th of November 2022 came with great joy for beneficiaries of the Thornhill Farms Communal Property Trust as they would receive title deeds to the land they have waited for years to formally own.

The Department of Public Works and infrastructure Minister Patricia de Lille and Deputy Minister Noxolo Kiviet, handed over the title deeds during an event that was held at the Thornhill village in Komani, Eastern Cape. The event was handsomely attended by residents of the surrounding villages of Zola and Phakamisa.

This event forms part of government's land reform programme which aims to address the imbalances of South Africa's past as well as restoring dignity to previously disadvantaged people through land ownership.

The land was transferred to the Thornhill Farms Communal Property Trust in 2003 without the title deeds being issued. Minister de Lille expressed her sincerest apologies to the beneficiaries for having them wait so long for the legal proof which certifies their ownership of this land.

Beneficiaries of the land parcels were moved from 23 villages in Hershel and Sterkspruit between 1975 and 1976 by the apartheid regime. Minister De Lille said the beneficiaries were promised land, houses, schools and clinics by the South African Deputy Secretary of Bantu Administration but when they arrived in Thornhill, they only found tents that could not even cater for everyone.

Out of nine properties that were identified for transfer to the Thornhill community, five were under the custodianship of the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI). The estimated value of the five land parcels the DPWI handed over, is just over R10-million and more than 2000 hectares.

Beneficiaries have pledged to utilise the land for agricultural purposes and more on commercial farming in order to provide economic opportunities for the community. "My biggest motivation every day is that more people must taste the fruits of our democracy," said Minister De Lille. It is safe to say that she realised this desire through this event. ■



# DPWI LAYS GROUNDWORK TO BUILD A MAGISTRATE'S COURT IN KEIMOES

The planned construction of the Keimoes Magistrate's Court will shorten travelling distances for those seeking justice. It will greatly benefit Keimoes and surrounding communities in the greater ZF Mgcawu district, in the Northern Cape. On 20 October 2022, the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure Minister Patricia de Lille and Deputy Minister Noxolo Kiviet visited the site where the new magistrate's court will be built.

Prior to viewing the site for the new magistrate's court, the two leaders visited the Keimoes Police Station, which was constructed by DPWI and handed over to the South African Police Service (SAPS) in 2014. The Minister and DM were happy to find the police station still in an excellent condition while they were led throughout the building on their walkabout with Brigadier Karabo Makgari who is the Northern Cape Provincial Head of Supply Chain Management.

The new magistrate's court will be situated strategically right next to the Keimoes Police Station, which in itself will further cut the costs of travelling. Since the Keimoes Police Station was delivered on time and within the scope valued at R78 million, the DPWI aims to maintain that same efficiency through the establishment of a project steering committee, which includes representatives of the DPWI, local municipality of ZF Mgcawu District Municipality, councilors, community leaders and members of the community.

Since the town of Keimoes is 50km away from Upington, the Keimoes Police Station and the new magistrate's court that will be built adjacent to the police station, eliminate the need for people in and around Keimoes to travel to Upington. This shows that the government of South Africa is mindful that essential services should be accessible to the people where they live, work and play.

While at the site of the new magistrate's court, Minister de Lille and DM Kiviet engaged with a small contingent of Keimoes residents about the construction of this project. The cost of the new magistrate's court is estimated at R100 million and it will create much-needed jobs for local communities during the construction phase. It will comprise of a double-storey building with a lower ground level designated for parking.

The ground floor will house the District Criminal Court and District Correctional Services areas including holding cells, administration areas, cash hall areas, public and security areas. The visit to Keimoes formed part of a build up to the Presidential Imbizo that took place on 21 October 2022 in Upington. Prior to this visit, Deputy Minister Kiviet also embarked on a Pre-Presidential Imbizo Outreach Programme where she visited various buildings in Upington which are under the custodianship of the DPWI.

These sites include 8 SAI (South African Infantry) Battalion, Upington Magistrate's Court, Upington Correctional Services Centre and Upington Police Station. As one of the DPWI's adopted schools under the Capacity Building Programme, the Saul Damon Secondary School formed part of the DM's itinerary for the days leading up to the Presidential Imbizo.

A presidential imbizo is, essentially a meeting between the three spheres of government (national, provincial and local) with community members of the area at which the Imbizo is held. Members of the community are given an opportunity to express their grievances regarding issues of service delivery within their community. Following that, the president, on behalf of government, responds to the grievances by outlining how they plan on dealing with the matters that the community has raised. Sometimes plans are made to resolve these issues immediately if they are able to. ■

# ANTI-GBV SHELTER HANDOVER IN FREE STATE

As the year ends, the fight against Gender Based Violence and Femicide (GBVF) is continuing, as it should... until the scourge is finally over.

This was made evident by the visit to the Free State Province by Minister Patricia de Lille along with her counterpart in government, Minister of the Department of Social Development, Lindiwe Zulu with whom she crisscrossed the province, in what could be considered her last official event of the year. But with Minister De Lille you can't be certain because she never stops working.

To kick start her Free State visit, she went to unveil the anti-GBV board at Bloemspruit Police Station whereby she was joined by Provincial Commissioner, General Baile Motswenyane, Free State Public Works MEC, Tshidi Koloï and Minister Zulu. The message on the board which says, "Men, stop Gender-Based Violence and Femicide. Break the silence and report GBVF" is simple yet powerful in the fight against this dark cloud in the country.

In concluding the visit, the two Ministers drove some 138 km from Bloemfontein where Minister de Lille handed over a facility to Minister Zulu that will be a shelter to house GBV survivors in Koffiefontein. Koffiefontein is a small rural town that has been identified as a hotspot for GBV in the Free State. It

is a town that will need a number of government departments on board to bring in much needed services.

According to the report that was shared with the Ministers as they were briefed about the area, there is high rate of unemployment which breeds a whole lot of other problems like alcohol abuse and GBV. The report further mentions that many babies in the area are born with Foetal Alcohol Syndrome due to mothers who are consuming alcohol while pregnant. Foetal Alcohol Syndrome is detrimental to the development of the brain of the foetus.

As part of an activity to highlight the plight of GBV in the country, the Ministers, De Lille and Zulu lit a torch of peace at Diamanthoogte Combined School in Koffiefontein. In addressing Koffiefontein community, Minister Patricia de Lille mentioned that she will continue working with the Social Development Department in identifying GBV hotspots. She further mentioned that as a country, "we must come together to fight the scourge of GBV, it is not only the responsibility of the Department of Social Development and that of Women, Youth and Persons with Disabilities. It is a collective responsibility."

The visit ended with the signing of the handover certificate of a shelter by Ministers, De Lille, Zulu as well as MEC Tshidi Koloï from Free State Provincial Public Works. ■

# 'BUILT ENVIRONMENT STUDENT CHAPTER' LAUNCHED IN UKZN TO HELP WITH PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND SCARCE SKILLS SHORTAGE

The Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI), Services SETA and the University of KwaZulu-Natal's School of Built Environment and Development Studies (SoBEDS) launched the Built Environment (BE) Student Chapter.

The BE Student Chapter, launched at the UKZN's Howard College campus in Durban on 14 November 2022, aims to effect the implementation of student support activities in the built environment.

Student Chapter launch was attended by various government officials including DPWI Acting DDG for Professional Services, Ms Vangile Nene, various built environment industry personnel. It was also graced by the Dean and Head of UKZN's School of Built Environment and Development Studies (SoBEDS), Professor Ernest Khalema as well as the university students, whom the launch was about.

This programme aims to ignite a cooperative commitment from the BE industry. It is anticipated that it will alleviate the pressure of slow professionals throughput by supporting tertiary institutions in producing industry-ready graduates. The BE Student Chapter is set to be anchored in all provinces across South Africa.

The BE Student chapter answers to the mandate that was given to the DPWI by parliament, to take on state capacity building in all infrastructure departments including municipalities, provinces and national departments.

Various programmes under the Human Capital Investment (HCI) and Capacity Building (CB) directorates in the DPWI have since

then been introduced, including the Winter Schools programme and the Young Professionals Programme to name a few. These programmes concentrate on profiling and harnessing students who achieve excellence in Mathematics and Physical Science from secondary school, to further their studies in the Built Environment (BE) sector.

Financial assistance and mentoring is offered to some of these students to obtain qualifications in the BE sector. Students are then absorbed as candidates to work in the DPWI and for its client departments.

Student Chapter aims to address the collective challenges that have been identified in the built environment which were outlined by the Acting DDG Nene, as limited exposure to BE career awareness on available opportunities in the field. Some of these challenges are due to the lack of integration and interfacing between Higher Institutions, Professional Councils and government departments.

The 'BE Student Chapter' will provide university students with on-boarding and readiness programme. The students will also receive information on the BE sector as well as the latest trends across the sector locally and internationally.

Students in architecture, human settlements, town and regional planning, engineering, quantity surveying and cognate fields will be provided with learner-study support tools like research articles, presentations, audio materials and student blogs as well as access to BE mentors. This will be executed through a BE online platform that the DPWI ICT team designed and oversees. Opportunities in interface studies, world of work through vacation work, internship and candidacy opportunities including cross-cutting career fields are also offered. High achievers will receive excellence awards with some incentives from the Student Chapter.

Head of Projects under the Professional Services branch at the DPWI's Durban Regional office, Mr. Thuthuka Mbhele went through infrastructure projects highlights of KwaZulu-Natal during the launch. He stated that the infrastructure projects were predominantly made up of a team of engineers from the Young Professionals Programme, with an aim of motivating the students. He said it is possible and it's happening, they just have to show determination to make it as well.

UKZN BE Student chapter launch ended with a Q & A quiz for the students who were in attendance to test their industry knowledge as well as their understanding of the BE Student Chapter and some were awarded prizes. ■

# DPWI MTHATHA REGIONAL OFFICE REVIEWS THE DEPARTMENT'S PERFORMANCE

“As an employee, you need to ask yourself what is your contribution in the Department and the impact of your contribution to the community or society?” These were the words of Mr. Lwazi Mahlangu-Mthembu, the Chief Director: Monitoring and Evaluation in the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure. Mr. Mahlangu-Mthembu was speaking during a mid-year review session held in Mthatha Regional Office in the Eastern Cape, on 13 to 14 October 2022.

The session was held to review and take stock of the 2022-23 Financial Year's challenges facing the Department towards service delivery. A number of branches/units from Head Office participated and made presentations to the Mthatha Regional Office management and officials. These included the Governance Risk and Compliance (GRC) branch, Office of the Chief Financial Officer (CFO), Construction Project Management (CPM), Facilities Management (FM), Internal Audit (IA), Project Management Office (PMO) and Real Estate Management Services (REMS).

The regional office was led by Regional Manager Mrs. Nolizwi Hlengwa. “Our session must be productive with tangible outcomes. It's not a platform of sharing information without taking any fundamental action because we need to see progress in the right direction as a regional office,” highlighted the regional manager.

The Department is responsible for providing accommodation to other government departments. This includes the payment of water and electricity services. In addition, payments for these services must be done on time to allow for correct billing from the Municipality.

One of the topics that stood out in the session is “having a positive impact within the department and moving towards eradicating fruitless and wasteful expenditure”.

The Mthatha regional manager emphasised the need for the Department to work as a team and remove the notion of “us and them” between Head Office and Regional Offices, as this attitude hampers service delivery. She also pointed out that “in terms of illegal electricity connections, the Department must engage and have a consensus with ESKOM before the power utility cuts off electricity for client departments who have allegedly defaulted on payment or illegally connected their electricity.

The regional manager said that government officials should not want to be seen to be doing something but should instead change their mindsets in consideration of the impact of their job to the community. “We must not look at the number of police stations built but rather consider issues such as why the facility is not operational and serving the community,” she said.



# DPWI BRIEFS PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE ABOUT TELKOM TOWERS

The Portfolio Committee on Public Works and Infrastructure expressed optimism that the necessary processes for the renovation of the Telkom Towers will be fast-tracked.

Members of the Portfolio Committee, the South African Police Service (SAPS) and the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure met at the DPWI's Head Office building at the end of September 2022, as part of the Committee's oversight visit at Telkom Towers. The purpose of the meeting was to brief the Portfolio Committee on renovation progress of Telkom Towers in preparation for occupation by the SAPS.

SAPS bought Telkom Towers back in 2016 for R695 million with the aim of relocating its head office from the Koedoe building in Pretorius Street. As the mandated custodian of all government immovable assets, DPWI showed interest in acquiring the Telkom Towers for use by a government department. As such, they presented the proposal to acquire the Telkom Towers building to the former National Commissioner of the SAPS, Riah Phiyega.

Renovations to the building have taken time which has affected the creation of the migration plan for the SAPS. The Portfolio Committee was, however, pleased to have all parties involved in the acquisition of the Telkom Towers under one roof so everybody can put together plans to speed up the migration process.
