

MINISTER MAKES WELISIZWE RURAL BRIDGES COMMITMENT

n a significant step towards improving rural infrastructure and connecting communities, Public Works and Infrastructure Minister, Sihle Zikalala, announced the construction of over 100 Welisizwe bridges across six provinces, namely the Eastern Cape, KwaZulu-Natal, Free State, Mpumalanga, North West and Limpopo. He made the announcement on 27 October 2023, while conducting Operation Siyahlola at two Welisizwe bridges sites in the Port St Johns Municipality in the Eastern Cape. Among officials who joined Minister Zikalala in his inspection of the bridges sites, is the Eastern Cape Transport MEC, Xolile Nqatha.

A budget of R3.3 billion over the next three years has been allocated for this ambitious project as it aims to address the backlog of bridge infrastructure in rural areas and improve access to essential services like healthcare, education, and economic opportunities.

The Welisizwe Rural Bridges programme is made possible by the collaboration between the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI), the South African National Defence Force (SANDF), and provincial departments of transport. The programme prioritises regions with a high demand for bridges and a history of challenges during rainy seasons.

The construction of the bridges will not only improve connectivity but also create employment opportunities through the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP).

Minister Zikalala emphasized the transformative impact of the Welisizwe Bridges project, stating, "These bridges will not just connect communities; they will also connect them to opportunities for education, healthcare, and economic growth. We are committed to bridging the infrastructure divide and ensuring that all South Africans have access to the services they need to thrive."

The Welisizwe Rural Bridges Programme is expected to deliver 48 bridges in addition to the 96 bridges initially announced by President Cyril Ramaphosa in his State of the Nation Address early in the year. Construction will proceed simultaneously across all six provinces, with increased resources to ensure the completion of the bridges.

The Welisizwe Bridges project represents a tangible commitment to infrastructure development and rural community upliftment. By bridging the physical and economic divides, the project will empower communities and contribute to a more equitable South Africa.

IMBIZO FOR WOMEN IN THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT AND OCEANS ECONOMY

This would help to expose these segments of society, to wider possibilities and help youngsters to choose their school subjects appropriately in order to access post school training in the built environment and maritime spheres.



BUILDING CLIMATE RESILIENT INFRASTRUCTURE

he Council for the Built Environment (CBE), in collaboration with the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI) hosted a two-day Climate Change Indaba in Durban, KwaZulu-Natal.

The event kicked off on the 31st of August 2023 and ended on the 1st of September 2023. It was held under the theme "Restoring Access, Rebuilding Social Cohesion and Healing of Communities through Social Infrastructure."

The Indaba sought to advise South Africa's Built Environment industry in order to support the Presidential Climate Change Commission's low-carbon, climate-resilient economic transition. Minister Sihle Zikalala gave a keynote address. "We are here to address the integration of the climate resilient policies and approaches that we should take, in the work that we do as professionals within the built environment," he said.

The Minister said it was time for bold and pragmatic action that aligned policies of the ground realities. "Our climate policies must be underpinned by regulatory frameworks that empower transformative change," he said. Minister Zikalala also urged professionals within the built industry to be equipped with the understanding of policies and skills to build climate resilient infrastructure.

The second day of the Climate Change Indaba kicked off with an engagement of panelists from various groups such as the Construction Education and Training Authority (CETA), the South African Local Government Association, Absa Group and Abahlali baseMjondolo socialist movement. The groups engaged and elaborated on who the main stakeholders that should participate in the climate change disaster rebuilding efforts, are.

The Council for the Built Environment (CBE) CEO Dr. Msizi Myeza spoke about the need for the sector to embody ethical conduct, innovation, agility, timely execution.

The Principal of the National School of Government, Prof Busani Ngcaweni encouraged public officials to answer the call of being a part of an ethical, capable, developmental state that is seized with the task of effectively tackling the root causes of underdevelopment, unemployment, poverty and inequality. He also emphasised that government communicators needed to improve communication and reflect on the many successes of the state.

The CBE, convened this Indaba in order to also tighten the planning of preventative measures against climate change-related disasters and ensure a coordinated response to the challenges faced by communities as a result of such disasters.

BUILDING A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

he Master Builders South Africa (MBSA) 2023 Annual Congress was held on 8-9 September 2023 at the Century City Conference Centre in Cape Town, South Africa under the theme "Powering Sustainable Infrastructure". The congress brought together industry leaders, experts, and stakeholders to discuss the critical role of the construction industry in shaping a sustainable future for South Africa.

Department of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI) Minister, Sihle Zikalala, was also in attendance and delivered a keynote address where he was proud to share that the DPWI set aside a budget of R600 million, over the next three years, for Infrastructure South Africa (ISA) to package infrastructure projects before handing them over to the private sector for investment.

This further reiterates the Minister's goal to grow South Africa's economy through public-private partnerships (PPP) within the construction industry.

Following his address, industry leaders deliberated on various matters that affect the built environment at large. Some of the topics discussed were:

- The Impact of Extortion on the Construction Industry: A
 panel discussion addressed the issue of extortion in the
 construction industry, which is estimated to cost the South
 African economy over R100 billion annually. Participants
 discussed the challenges of tackling extortion and the need
 for collaboration between industry, government, and law
 enforcement.
- Building a Green Economy: Experts discussed the opportunities and challenges of transitioning to a green economy in South Africa. The focus was on how the construction industry can play a leading role in reducing its environmental impact and promoting sustainable building practices.
- Skills Development and Transformation: A panel discussion addressed the critical issue of skills development and transformation in the construction industry. Participants discussed the need to attract and retain skilled workers, as well as to promote greater participation of women and young people in the industry.
- The Future of Construction: Experts looked to the future of the construction industry, discussing the impact of technology, innovation, and urbanization. Participants explored how the industry can adapt and evolve to meet the challenges and opportunities of the future.

SHARING IDEAS, EXPERIENCES AND KNOWLEDGE

he Minister of Public Works and Infrastructure (DPWI), Sihle Zikalala, delivered a keynote address at the University of KwaZulu-Natal (UKZN) College of Law and Management Studies Annual Research Day on October 12, 2023, to a group of researchers and students gathered at the Coastlands Musgrave Hotel in Durban.

The research day was themed "Achieving the Sustainable Development Goals 2030 for Higher Education Institutions Post-COVID-19 Pandemic," and showcased a variety of research projects.

Minister Zikalala emphasized on the vital responsibilities that academic institutions such as UKZN can play in promoting resilience of an increasingly unpredictable global environment. In order to lessen the effects of natural and man-made disasters, he urged the institution to take the lead nationally.

"We live in a period of unprecedented change. Our communities are seeing disruptions beyond anything we've ever seen; from extreme weather disasters to pandemics and social unrests," said Minister Zikalala.

He specifically highlighted the need for skilled professionals who can help improve the management of construction contracts, ensuring that critical socio-economic infrastructure is delivered efficiently and effectively, even in the face of disruptions. "We look to you to produce skills that will help government and the built environment to improve the management of construction contracts so that socio-economic infrastructure is delivered on time, within budget and according to specifications," he stated.

Minister Zikalala's keynote address resonated deeply with the UKZN research community, whose work often tackles pressing social issues like climate change and urban development. His words served as a reminder to the university to bridge the gap between academic research and real-world application.

Minister Zikalala's attendance and keynote address, conveyed an important step in establishing a strong collaboration between the government and UKZN, one that promises to deliver vital solutions for a safer and more sustainable South Africa.





he Dr. Kenneth Kaunda District Development Model (DDM) one plan document was officially launched on 16 October 2023 at the JB Marks Chambers in Potchefstroom, North West. The DDM stands as a beacon of hope for South Africa's future as it aims to revitalise local communities and drive inclusive economic growth.

North West MEC for Public Works and Roads, Oageng Molapisi, Agriculture MEC, Sebonta Moholo, Executive Mayor of Dr. Kenneth Kaunda District Municipality, Cllr. Nikiwe Num, Mayor of JB Marks Local Municipality, Gaba Thithiba ka Qhele, Maquassi Hills Mayor, Cllr. Mzwandile Feliti and Matlosana Mayor, Cllr. Nonhlupheko Tsolela were present at the launch in their capacity as DDM champions from the Dr. Kenneth Kaunda District Municipality.

A week prior to this launch, the national Department of Public Works and Infrastructure Deputy Minister (DM) Bernice Swarts, in her capacity as one of the Champions of the DDM visited Tiragalo Secondary School in Leeudoringstad, North West, where she was met with the dire conditions that learners endure on a daily basis due to the school's overcrowding.

She thanked the learners for staying committed to school despite the difficulties they face and further assured them that they would be provided with desks and chairs they need to make their time at school conducive to learning. "It is issues like these that have brought about the launching and signing of the DDM One Plan document because if all spheres of government could work together in delivering services, lots of problems could be solved efficiently, "said Deputy Minister, prior to the launch.

With this document, government officials will be held accountable to their duties which, in turn, affect service delivery. Not only will it hold officials accountable but it will also create synergy among provincial government departments where they will work hand in hand in delivering services. Furthermore, the DDM One Plan will translate into economic empowerment of South Africans.



DPWI CONSTRUCTS AN EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT CENTRE IN CALA

he Eastern Cape Public Works and Infrastructure Department is currently undertaking the construction of Msintsana Early Childhood Development Centre (ECDC). This ECDC is located in the outskirts of Cala under Chris Hani District Municipality. The construction of this ECDC comes after the Department of Education made a clarion call for this intervention as there is an urgent need in the area.

The construction of this R2million rand project commenced in January this year (2023). Practical completion has been reached and the site handover is projected for December 2023. Two Small, Micro and Medium Enterprise (SMME) packages were advertised for fencing and painting but due to none submission of documents by SMMEs, the packages were not awarded.

The scope of work includes a new concrete walkway and paving, erection of a new galvanized steel mesh fencing, electrical installation and a provision for the renovation of an old mud house that exists on site. The construction entails one (1) block with three (3) rooms and a kitchen with works that entail the following:

- · Replacement of Vinyl Floor tiles
- Replacement of doors
- Walls to be relieved of all evident cracks/damages.
- Paint to existing walls
- Addressing of zinc roof / waterproofing

The project manager of the construction of this project, Chumile Mafanya, said that there are no challenges experienced on site and that the work that was set aside to be executed by the SMMEs was successfully and accordingly done by the Contractor. "The project is sitting at 98% complete and we are now just busy with the finishing touches which we determine will be overall done within no time," said Mafanya.



EASTERN CAPE PUBLIC WORKS AND INFRASTRUCTURE MEC HANDS OVER A SECONDARY SCHOOL TO THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

avelilanga Senior Secondary School was officially handed over on 19 October 2023 by Eastern Cape Public Works and Infrastructure MEC Ntombovuyo Nkopane to the Department of Education. The handover comes after the Department of Public Works and Infrastructure, as an implementing agent, successfully completed the construction of the new facilities at this state-of-the-art school.

Lavelilanga Senior Secondary School was established in 1997 with only one classroom for 30 learners (Grade 10) and three (3) educators. By 1999, the school was utilizing three (3) community churches as a means of aiding the shortage of learning structures due to the addition of Grade 12 and further expansions to the school.

The new facilities comprise of an administration and support block, dining and nutrition centre, a science laboratory, five (5) classrooms, a multi-purpose classroom, a computer room, library, nine (9) ablution facilities, sick bay, printing room, staff room, strong room, staff kitchen and two (2) offices. The construction of this R29million rand project has afforded pupils a conducive learning environment.

"This day takes me back to when it all started, when we were only three (3) teachers fresh out of teaching school and did not have any structure to teach the pupils under. We have come a long way joined by the parents at the time, we made means of building a shelter for the pupils by collecting R20 per parent and the community, and indeed, a structure was built. Since then, the school has grown in numbers and we welcome more pupils knowing that the Department of Public Works has built us a beautiful school that we are proud of," said Sisanda Hexana—the Principal at Lavelilanga SSS.

On her remarks, MEC Nkopane stated that she was elated to be handing over a successfully completed school. "Today MEC Fundile Gade, I bring to you this world class educational facility and I am happy to report that all the additional work that was requested by the school i.e. fencing and a guard house are being wrapped up as we speak. Unfortunately, we will not be able to provide the school with security guards as that is out of the department's jurisdiction. The community has an obligation to take ownership and the safety of this school," said MEC Nkopane.

There are 39 local labourers and six (6) local Small, Medium and Micro Enterprises (SMMEs) and benefitted through this project with the following packages; construction of refuse room, construction of storm water, landscaping, construction of three (3) classroom blocks, construction of a play area and joinery works.
